**BLAMED ON CURRENT TEACHING METHODS**

Reading is the key to all learning. With an estimate that 35 per cent of all American youngsters are seriously retarded in reading, a fourth of all American youngsters are seriously retarded in reading ability. The reports further charge that another 40 per cent of American youngsters are not reading as well as they might.

**WHAT ARE SOME OF THE DANGERS OF PHONIC NEGLECT?**

Children are asked to recognize words by "clue" or otherwise such as "moon" by remembering the "two little eyes," with the result that "noon" and "soon" became easily confused later. On the researchers found, "majesty" tends to be read as "majorty" or "majorty."

**WHAT DOES PROGRAMMED INSTRUCTION HAVE TO OFFER?**

Let's look at some of the results of programmed instruction with human subjects:

- In New Haven, 3-year-olds learned to read and print in 14 weeks.
- In an elementary school in Massachusetts, the number of A's in spelling increased by 42 per cent.
- In Roanoke, Va., 31 per cent of the 8th graders surpassed the 8th graders on an algebra test.
- In a junior college in Washington, Pa., and 87% in medical technology increased by 35 per cent and failures dropped by 8 per cent.
- At Hamilton College, Clinton, N. Y., the average grade in a logic course jumped by 50 points.
- In Bellevue, Wash., 7th graders finished 8th grade algebra course in half the usual time.
- At Longwood High School in California, a full year's math course was learned in two months.
- At Earlham College, Richmond, Ind., a two-year Russian course was taught in one year.

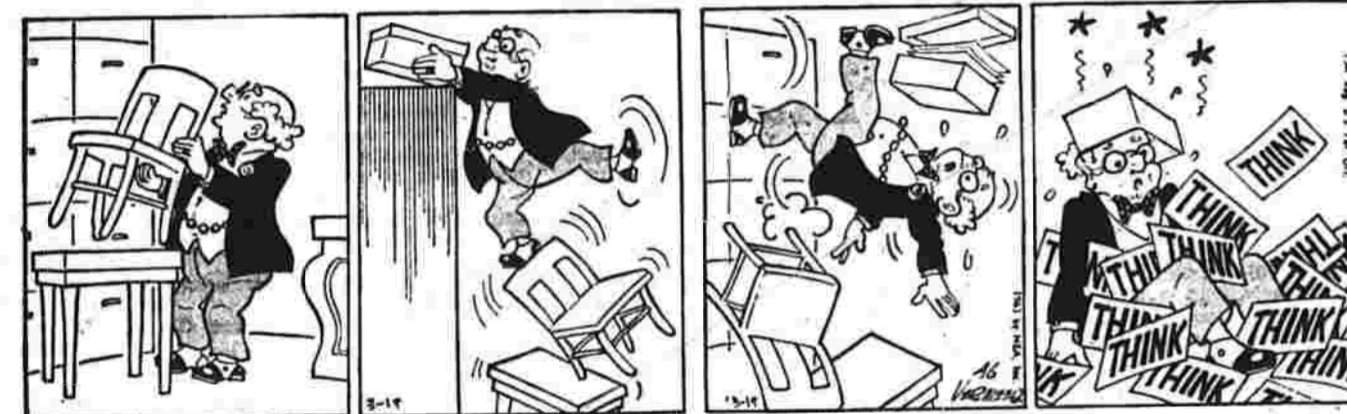

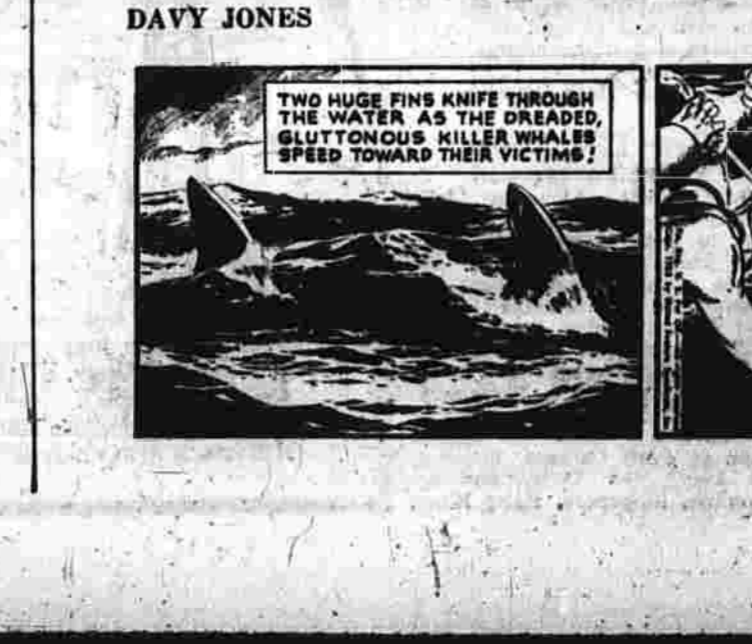
