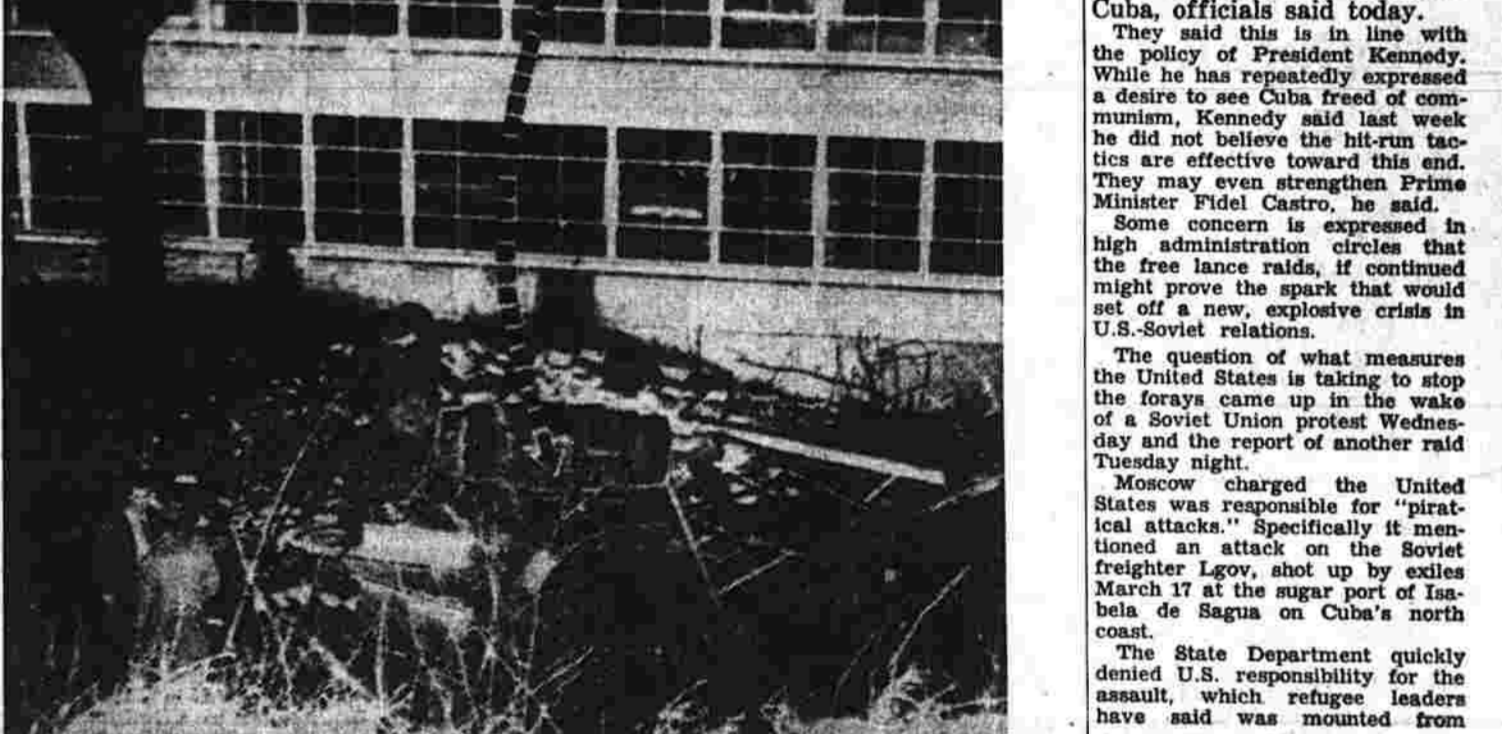

ROME (AP)—The symbolic red, white and green flame of fascism...
The party's leaders say they will not give up their fight for power. But they are pledged to Mussolini's old idea of state socialism—the corporate system after the war they reorganized their party as the Italian Social Movement (MSI). For a while it gathered strength. In the first postwar parliamentary election, in 1948, they polled only 2 percent of the vote. Five years later, in the 1953 election, they rose to 17.5 percent. In the 1958 election, they fell to 10.5 percent. In the 1963 election, they were reduced to 4.8 percent, or 1.4 million votes.

The Fatal Precept
 Once again, today, we have a "stunning upset" in the news that New York's newspapers aren't out of circulation today after all.

Just when everything was supposedly all set for the process to roll, as it had also once supposedly been set two weeks ago, one of the papers, the *World Journal*, had its last issue on the part of a union that everything off schedule. The photographers voted, 181 to 111, to reject the resolution. That same union leaders had negotiated for them and had expected them to accept. So, by a decision which our people could have swung the other way, the strike which has set so many records in time and money just continues on.

Now the spotlight focuses on the photographers and the pressure on them will be terrific, and the best expectation is, of course, that they will knuckle under rather quickly.

The poor photographers, we suppose, will be subjected to all kinds of abuse for their last minute obstinacy, their failure to consider the welfare of all the others who have been out on strike, of the great community waiting to get its newspapers back, and of the fact that the others unions will consider the photographers reckless extremists, the publishers will think the photographers are a bunch of fools who are interfering with the world people get this way.

We are fascinated by the problem of a substitute for knowing what the answer may be. We suspect, however, that the answer, whatever it may be, is the same thing as that which has worked its way into a lot of contemporary living. Ours seems to be a world which permits itself all kinds of excess, and then pretends to be outraged and indignant when we initiate our own responsibility. Why should any one phase of this newspaper strike down in New York surprise or shock us? Why do we not realize that the whole proposition has been monstrous, irrational, unreasonable, irresponsible? Why do we not realize, further, that this kind of behavior is not happening, but something of an inevitability once we have gone through the advance conditioning of organizing ourselves, through interlocking union allegiance and interlocking publisher's organization, for the purpose of conflict? With all such preparation, who needs a sound common sense reason for strike and turmoil and ruination?

Such a phantasmagoria, developing out of the continuing personalities and ideologies of the newspaper strike, may also be something of a mirror. It may reflect the way we are trying to run our whole world, in which we are always being amazed and stunned and upset whenever one piece of insanity breeds another.

Sometimes somebody has got to stop acting as if all were hinged and nothing really matters and stop clean away from the rule of being ready to do first to the other fellow who you are trying to wage war to do you. No profession, enterprise, or world trying to operate on that prospect is likely to discover anything more than its own capacity to spoil life.

Connecticut Yankee

One of the recurrent minor incidents in the past sessions of the General Assembly has been the proposal to amend the constitution for the purpose of insuring real estate titles. Almost any legislator, nevertheless carries the possibility that it may, by such amendment, deprive the citizens of a privilege of doing business under conditions and with authority not available to everybody else, is likely to run into questioning and opposition from somebody. Occasionally those who seek such special incorporation privileges attract attention to themselves by the very methods and avenues by which they seek to obtain favorable consideration of their bill.

That was what happened the other day, when we ourselves can permit ourselves some civilized relationship with the nation of Hungary? Or the nation of Czechoslovakia? Or the nation of Poland? Or the nation of Rumania? Or the nation of Yugoslavia? Or the nation of Bulgaria? Or the nation of Greece? Or the nation of Turkey? Or the nation of Italy? Or the nation of France? Or the nation of Germany? Or the nation of the United Kingdom? Or the nation of the United States?

Each of us, one suspects, answers such questions according to what his own combination of moral and intellectual reactions tell him can be hoped for from such a revolution. To some, the only hope for the world to survive is that there can be a change in Hungary, and inside many other countries, by the process of evolution which ends up making coexistence not only possible but relatively uneventful. To others, evolution is merely a delusion and a deception, and the only rescue for mankind lies in the rejection of the revolution which ends up overthrowing by force all regimes different from ours, whereupon coexistence, based on our own moral estimation of ways of life not ours, would become possible.

Each of us picks his own answer. And perhaps, for all we know, the world is going to survive by some use of many answers. They might even be complementary answers, and each of us might be right. But the two main themes run on, however, facing each other from opposite extremes. We seem to have our soft side, too. Once there would have been little question about the dangers inherent in the sport of professional boxing. There would have been only elemental acceptance of its appropriate rank as a sport which really tested and demonstrated that same manly art of self-defense. Now, when it so happens that such an art is demonstrated in an encounter which somehow results in serious injury, we have a new and modern softness. Some of us even propose abolishing the sport, if that is what one would still call it. People enter bills outlawing it.

And this is all a very nice sentiment. It is very nice to think that we may outlaw the exchange of blows occasionally result in injury or death. This shows how much more civilized we are becoming. Perhaps this is the only clear fair test that can be made of us. Perhaps that other side of us—the one in which we insist that it be kept legal for nations to wage war, even though we occasionally take the lives of millions of human beings each as much as any boxer in a ring—ought not to be discussed in civilized company.

Storm Kills Three On West Coast

A tilt-and-run wind and rain storm chinked up three deaths and numerous power failures in northern California and southern Oregon Wednesday before it sped north.

The deaths were all in the area around Crescent City near the Oregon border, but most of the power losses were along the Oregon Coast, chiefly in Brookings, Gold Beach and Coos Bay.

Winds gusts of 74 miles an hour were clocked by the U.S. Coast Guard at Brookings. Crescent City measured 72 m.p.h. blasts, which dropped to a peak of 65 m.p.h. as the storm passed through Portland, Ore., then to the 20's in Washington.

California's only reported major power loss was in Vallejo, 20 miles northeast of San Francisco, where poles blew down and service was out.

Ben Jewel, 47, a logger who was crushed to death when 50 m.p.h. gusts fell on his four-foot-thick Redwood tree onto his truck near Hunter Creek, 20 miles south of Crescent City.

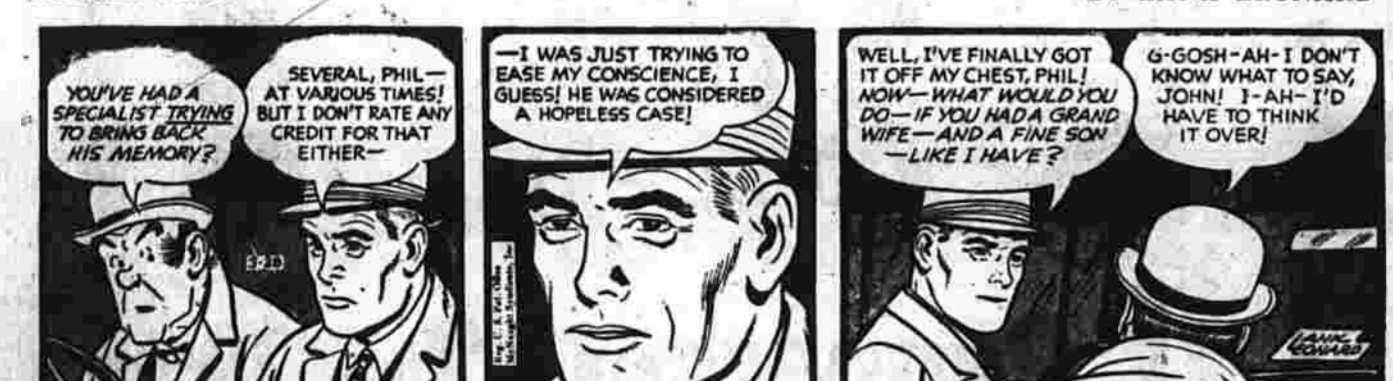

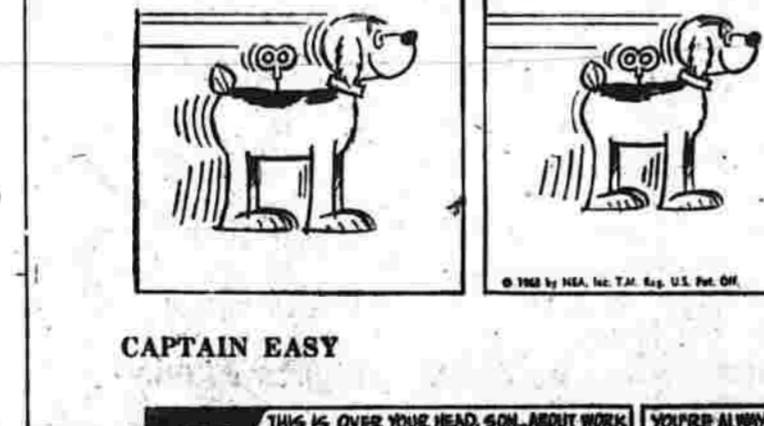
