Home Gardener's Handbook
Each Garden Mulch Has a Purpose

Spring and summer mulching of lawns, trees and shrubs saves work and improves plant growth if done correctly. Mulches of organic matter, plastic or green stones or gravel, can be highly useful. Here are some simple ideas to make them work well for you.

For trees and shrubs, renew the mulch several inches deep every spring and again in the fall. Mulch saves moisture, controls weeds and builds good topsoil. Peat moss is good in show areas; the soft brown color is an attractive contrast to green leaves and bark. It is excellent for acid-loving plants such as azaleas, rhododendrons and laurel. Leaves can be left around trees surrounded by shrubs for forest mulch. A layer of pebbles or gravel several inches deep may make an excellent mulch in heavy traffic areas.

For flower beds, peat moss, pine needles, coarsely bean hulls, ground bark and vermiculite are attractive in less traveled spots. Sugar cane bagasse, sawdust, chopped leaves, ground corn cobs and straw can also be used. You can cover these less attractive materials with peat moss or ground bark. New lawn seedlings are best covered with straw or salt hay. These are easy to remove after the grass has sprouted. They save moisture, control erosion and reduce weed sprouting. Use such of straw or hay and remove after grass is an inch tall.

Small fruits benefit greatly from mulch, as most of them have shallow roots. On strawberries, sawdust, sugar cane bagasse, peat moss and buckwheat hulls make good year-round mulch. Part of the winter can be left between the plants each spring. Black plastic is good for strawberries. For some berries, any of these materials is good, plus wood chips, grass clippings or leaves. For blueberries, sawdust is an ideal mulch. Like peat moss, it helps keep the soil acid, as blueberries prefer it. For vegetables, any mulching

The Doctor Says

HOW TO FIND SURGEONS FOR GASTRO INTEST OPERATIONS

I have had many requests for the names of doctors in various parts of the country who perform the operation on the colon, the relief of asthma. If your family doctor cannot give you the name of such a doctor, you might contact your county or state medical society.

Q—Please tell me something about osteomyelitis. Is it due to a deficiency of calcium? Is it related to bone cancer? Is there a cure?

A—Although a deficiency of calcium will cause some bone disease, it does not cause osteomyelitis which is an infection of the marrow. It is not related to cancer. The germ responsible for over 90 per cent of all cases is the staphylococcus or ordinary pus germ. The antibiotic that most staphylococcus infections do not work well against is penicillin. This is because, even though a high concentration of the drug is built up in the blood, it does not reach the infected bone in sufficient quantity to produce a cure, may however, however, to control the infection. Test in hospital. It is usually required and after the acute stage has subsided, surgery is almost always necessary to bring about a cure.

Q—I am a 47-year-old housewife. Recently I began to get blackheads on my face. My skin is very oily. What do you suggest?

A—Blackheads are related to acne. They are due to some degree of overactivity of the oil glands of the skin. Since your skin is oily you should wash your face four or five times a day. The blackheads should not be squeezed because of the danger of infection. Even if they are evacuated under antiseptic conditions they tend to come back in the same place. A modified female sex hormone (diethylstilbestrol) which has recently been shown to cut down the oiliness of the skin, is useful as it does this it may also reduce the production of blackheads.

Q—When I got sick about six weeks ago my doctor said I had walking pneumonia. Now he says that the inflammation in my lungs has all cleared up, but I have a bad cough and it's not getting any better. What should I do?

A—The term "walking pneumonia" is not commonly used but I assume that you had some congestion of the lungs without fever. A chronic cough may follow any kind of pneumonia. The commonest cause of such a cough are bronchiectasis (described in a recent column), pulmonary tuberculosis, daily exposure to smog or irritating fumes, lung cancer, and congestion of the lungs due to a leaky heart valve. For such a wide range of causes there can be no single type of treatment. Effective treatment must be based on discovery of the cause and then attempting to remove it. A treatment that would benefit one type of bronchitis may not aid another type.

paper Guild, with 125 members, the Teachers and printers, whose 600 members struck Jan. 28.

There was little jubilation from either union people or management after the long and costly struggle. Probably the happiest are the city's news-hungry readers, most of whom were asleep when the conclusion came.

The morning and Sunday Plain Dealer and Scripps-Howard's afternoon Press & News had a pre-strike circulation which made them the largest in Ohio. The Plain Dealer sold an average of 238,210 papers daily and 507,694 Sunday. The Press listed its circulation at \$79,485.

Both were among the nation's top 10 dailies in advertising revenue, but lost heavily by missing Christmas and Easter season advertising.

Total wages estimated to have been lost by newspaper employees during the strike came to \$6 million.

The end of the strike came in rapid 12-hour sequence Thursday night.

The Machinists Union, with 14 members at the two papers and the last of five unions to strike, unanimously ratified a 25-month contract. James Iafelice, business agent, estimated its worth at \$12.70 in wages and benefits.

Twenty minutes later the printers' vote was announced. Then a little man developed. Two pickets of the Machinists Union remained on duty until language in a contract members had ratified Monday 22 could be cleared up.

The matter was straightened out as the AFL-CIO International Typographical Union local went into an executive board meeting. The printers are an affiliated union of the printers. Noah Henry, manila president, was called down from his home. He removed the pickets.

That was the signal for printers to enter the Plain Dealer building, dust off and test typesetting machines and throw away old type. Some review news copy and advertising material as he had to be set.

"We're bringing back some of our reporters and editors today and tomorrow," said Phil Porter, Plain Dealer managing editor. "There will be so many people around here Sunday night when we get out our paper, it will look like election night."

Nuisance Is An Art When French Strike

PARIS (AP)—In the normal tradition of organized labor a strike is when a lot of employees go off the job, picket the place and stay out until all or some of their demands are met.

The French, with fine Gallie flair, regard a strike in a totally different light. This attitude prevails generally except for French coal miners, who act as if they've been studying American labor practices.

Strikes have been hitting France periodically for some months in the varied fields of industry and endeavor. They are French-type strikes, however, and this may also be defined as public nuisance in gigantic proportions.

Take the metro (subway) workers. They call two-hour or four-hour strikes at surprise hours. People who are trying to get to work for two hours at the start of each shift. This is given added savor when a passenger train goes into operation. Since collisions are both forbidden and damaging to the metro system, the passenger trains have to wait until freight crews climb back into their cabins and the trains rumble through the tunnels again.

At the end of these strikes everybody goes cheerfully back to work. Only the people—who have nothing to say about metro wages in the first place—are inconvenienced.

The electrical workers do the same thing. They make surprise cuts in current. The gas workers shut off gas for a day. The bus workers take a temporary setback and hoverless raise can because the vacuum doesn't work and the metro are gloomily silent again, for without power they black out. In an hour or so it's all over and things are normal.

The bus workers follow suit. Great masses of grumbling people are late to work, don't get to work at all, walk or hunt for taxis. But in a couple of hours the buses are roaring through the streets again.

If the primary objective is to let the government know they are not satisfied, the metro people, the utility workers and the bus crowd probably have a point. A lot of Parisians think this could be done better by committee. Then people could get to the office and the vacuum would work.

Railroad employees have turned traffic-smaring into a high art. The passenger train people go out for two hours at the start of each shift. Cummings Dismisses Charges By Shea 'Lot of Noise'

Democratic Town Chairman Fred Cummings today dismissed as "a lot of loud noise" the "government by fiat" charges of which the Democratic-controlled board of directors was accused yesterday by the Republican town chairman.

Cummings further invited town Republicans to join the Democrats in "unraveling some of the tough town problems" instead of "trying to make news when there isn't any."

Atty. John F. Shea Jr., GOP town chairman, has accused the directors of attempting to "eliminate public participation in government affairs."

He has cited as examples the directors' refusal Tuesday night to answer questions from taxpayers who attended the annual public hearing on the budget and the directors' recent vote to rearrange the priorities on their meeting agenda so that general public hearings are now scheduled after 7 p.m.

Said Cummings today, "I feel that all the Republicans have been able to do in the past six months is to make a lot of loud noise. Frankly, we (the Democrats) can't get excited by it because there's, too much to do."

Cummings reiterated the Democrats' stand that the change in the board's order of business now permits taxpayers to be heard three times, instead of twice that they have been allowed. He compared the late-hour public hearing on any items not on the directors' agenda but within their jurisdiction—to the floor at the old town meetings.

He chided, "Republican leadership in Manchester today is about the greatest on record for trying to make news when there isn't any."

"I guess the Republicans have to realize, honest issues and ideas that they have to scrape the bottom of the barrel as they have done in their latest 'gag' charges."

He said, "Anyone who has appeared before Mayor (Francis) Mahoney and the Democratic board has been given sincere consideration and has been afforded all the time he wanted to speak his piece—I mean anyone who has appeared before the board."

"I believe, has been a careful and reasonable administration, tuned to people's problems and consideration of their needs," he said. "Afraid, much to do."

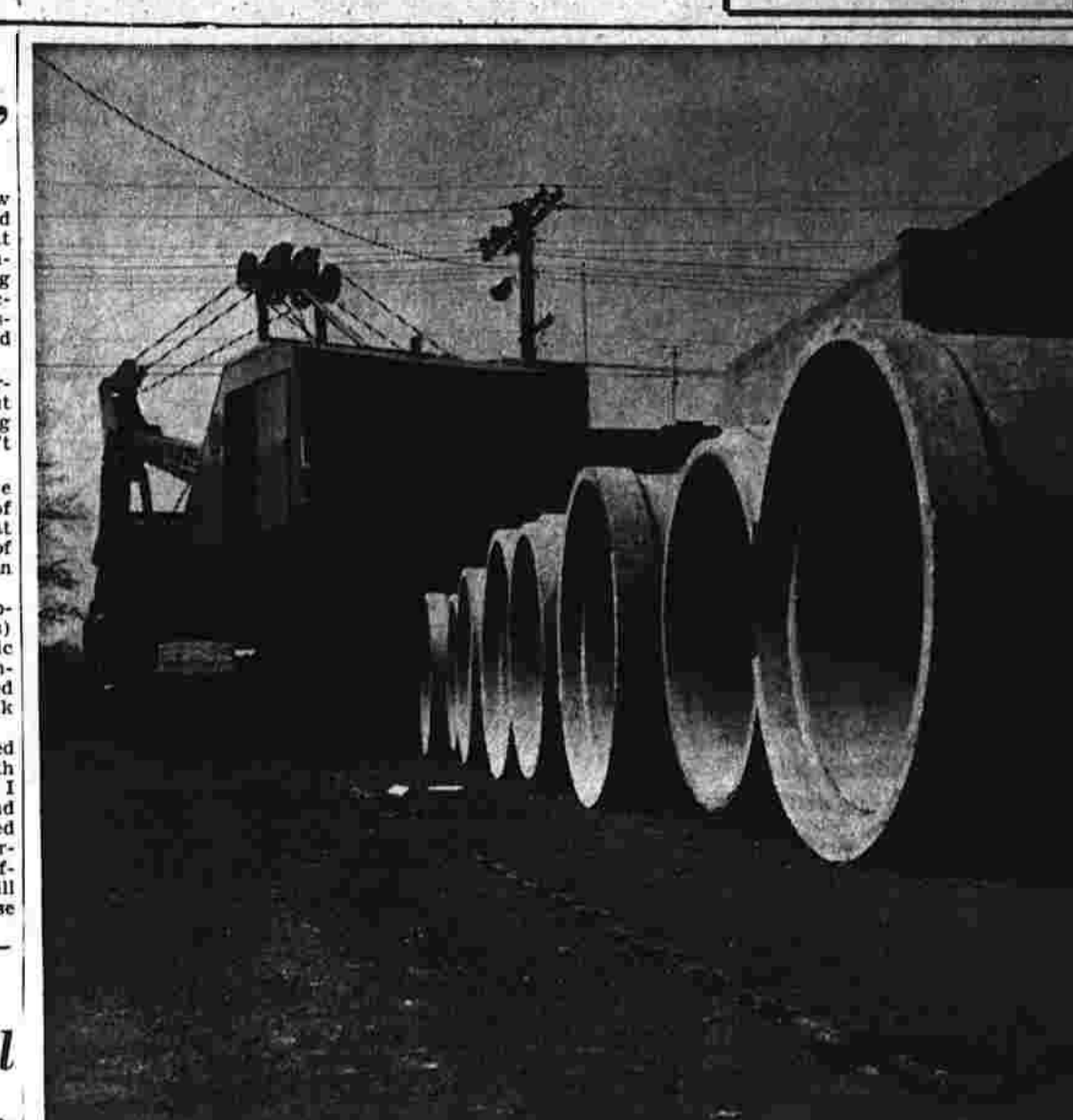

(Continued from Page One) slightly below last year's level of \$2.5 billion, says Rusk. "There is nothing the Communists want more than to see the 'Yanks go home,'" Rusk said. "But only from Western Europe, but from the Mediterranean, South Asia, the Far East, Latin America, Africa, everywhere. "If we Yanks come home, the Communists will begin to take over. Why any American would want to cooperate with that global Communist strategy is beyond my understanding. But that is what sharp suits in our foreign aid program would mean." In his wide-ranging statement, Rusk said "The free world has fared better than the Communist world during the last 12 months' but this is no cause for complacency. "Despite their differences, Moscow and Peking remain allies," he continued. "There is not necessarily any comfort for us in competition between two centers of Communist power, each trying to prove that its method of 'burying' us is the more efficacious." Rusk said "It is easier and cheaper in the long run to prevent conditions that may lead to communism than to reverse the system once it has become established. It should not be necessary to have another Cuba in Latin America or Africa to drive home the 'lessons of prevention' lesson." Rusk added that his several times as he read the statement in the crowded hearing room. "Assessing the Cuban situation in more detail, Rusk said the difficulties in regard to Cuba are a continuing reminder that prevention is easier than cure—that having failed in years past to take the steps which might have prevented the establishment of a Marxist-Leninist regime in Cuba, we had better try hard to prevent such developments in the future. Rusk said "There is no evidence that the Cuban experience is ever more widely appreciated." Rusk added that Castro's stature in the hemisphere "has shrunk further" in the past six months. He said the Alliance for Progress has "broad political support" in many Latin American countries. "Finally," Rusk said, "I would recall that in the showdown last October the hemisphere stood united in the hour of crisis, every member of the Organization of American States expressed what had to be done."

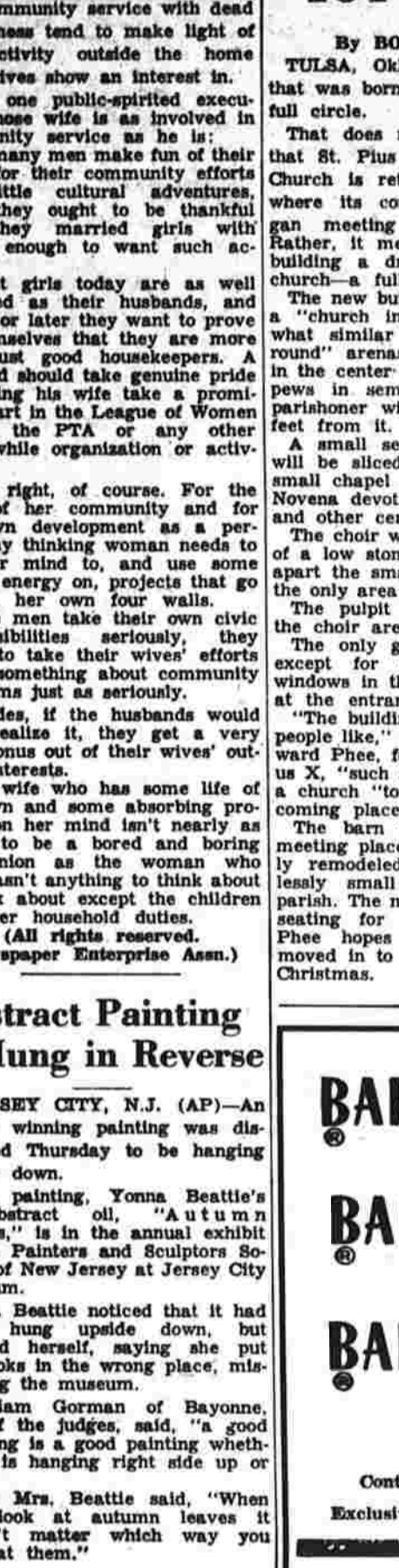

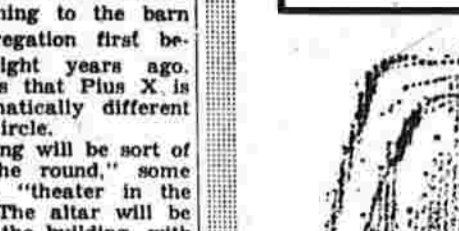

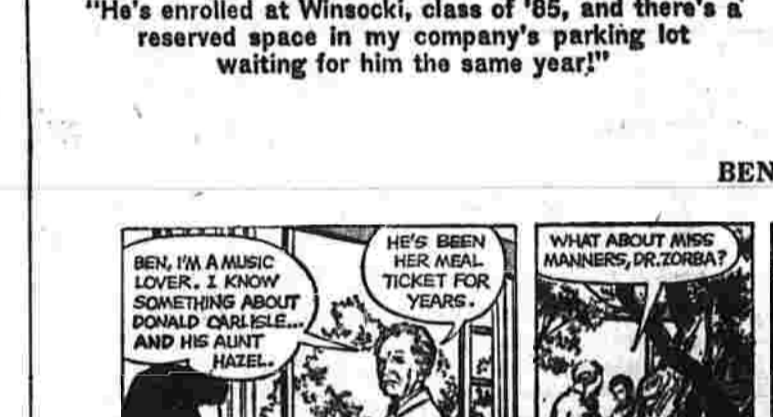
