





To dial calls outside of Connecticut, just dial "1", then the area code, followed by the telephone number.

P.S. All-Numeral Telephone Numbers Go Into Use on April 7, Tool Remember, your number in the new Manchester-Rockville telephone directory has a new look. Instead of two letters and five figures, all numbers have seven figures. For example, a number like MI 3-5299 will become 643-929. Please check your new directory before making local calls. 8 The new numbering system is needed because of rapid telephone growth. Robert MacNeil

NBC News' London correspondent Robert MacNeil normally covers the British Isles. Last November, he was sent to cover a story several thousand miles to the southwest — the communizing of

Arriving in Havana with several other newsmen, MacNell was promptly arrested and held cap-tive for eight days. When they were released, they were permitted to work and MacNell found him-

to work and MacNell found him-self the first newsman from a U.S. news organization in Cuba since the Oct. 22, 1962, crisis. For four days, MacNell was per-mitted to move about freely. Then, he was trailed by young men in windbreakers "who sort of lounge around sverywhere and follow you."

In addition to Cuba, MacNell has covered several top assign-ments outside London for NBC News, including Algerian civil war, the erection of the Berlin Wall, The Congo fighting and the funeral of Dag Hammarskjold.

MacNeil was born Jan. 19, 1981

MacNeil was born Jan. 19, 1931 in Montreal, Canada, He grew up in Nova Scotia and Ottawa, attended Dalhousie University at Halifax for two years, then received his degree in English at Carleton University at Ottawa.

His first job was as announcer in the summer of 1951 with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's radio station at Halifax. The following summer, MacNeil became a stock company actor with the Priscilla Beach Theatre near Plymouth, Mass. Plymouth, Mass.

After spending the next two years as an announcer and news writer at radio station CFRA in Ottawa, MacNeil joined CBC's Ottawa TV station where he had his own half-hour TV show dealing with science for children

ing with science for children. In 1955, MacNeil went to England to work for Independent Teleland to work for Independent Tele-vision News as a writer-reporter. In December of that year, he joined Reuters, working on the central news desk in London, and by 1960 was night editor. From 1957 to 1960, MacNeil also did free lance assignments for CBS-TV and CBS Radio.

It was in May 1960 that Mac-Neil joined NBC News. After covering stories in and around London, he was sent to the Congo in September 1960, and spent the next two months covering that area for NBC News. Subsequent assignments have taken him to

To really love show business you have to be of it, not just in it.
