REMEMBER COMBINATION IN ALL OF ITS FORMS

By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

It is a fact that certain combinations of cards no matter how they happen to be dealt, are sure to appear in every deal. You may not know the trick that brings in games and rubbers.

Both sides vulnerable

Opening lead - Four of hearts

The combination in this case is the diamond suit. PLAY IT correctly and you get four diamond tricks. Careless play will develop only three tricks.

Win the first heart with the king, lead a diamond to dummy. Return a low diamond from dummy.

When East discards a club you put up the jack of diamonds to force out West's queen. Later you can lead your ace and your king through West's 10-9, since dummy has A-9-8 behind West.

If you carefully lead out the ace and king of diamonds, West would have two aces diamond tricks. You would have a hard time developing eight tricks, let alone nine.

Sometimes you see this combination with the ace and king in separate hands. For example, drop the king, and lead low. Cash the ace first, get to dummy with a low diamond, and then lead low from the dummy toward your jack.

Another possibility is K-J-3 in your hand, with A-8-8-4 in dummy. Lead the king, and lead low from dummy toward your jack. This play guards you against Q.

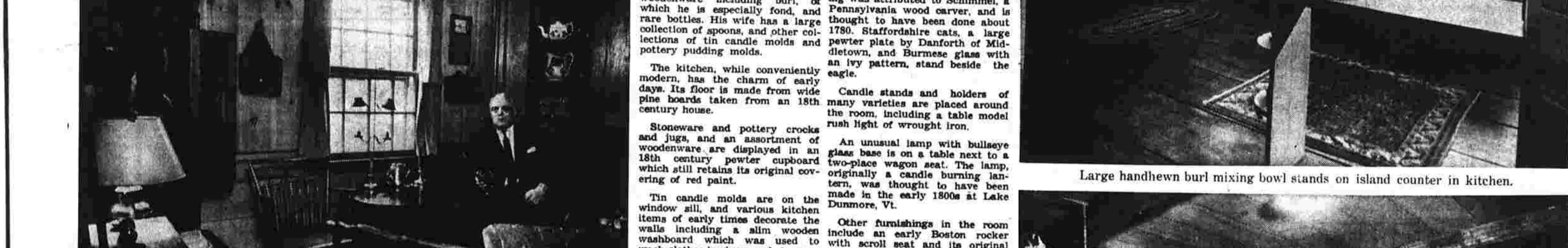

Park, Play Area Plans Split into Four Types

If the details of the town's proposed master plan for parks and recreation are carried out, Manchester will develop or improve 25 park areas for four types of uses.

The details of the plan are to be subject to a public hearing sponsored by the Town Planning Commission (TPC) at the Manchester High School small auditorium at 8 p.m. on Monday.

Also up for discussion are three other parts of the town's proposed comprehensive plan, dealing with future land use, traffic circulation and the downtown area.

After hearing the public's opinion on the plan, the TPC will decide whether to adopt, reject, or modify them for guidance to the future growth of the community.

Specifically, what are the proposals for the parks? The four major types of parks would be:

1. Neighborhood playground: For children 6 to 12 years old, they would feature open field areas, paved sections, softball fields, play equipment like swings, and picnic tables. They should be about five acres, and within a half mile of the children they would serve.

2. Playfields: For youngsters 12 to 18, they would be fitted for team and court games, and open areas for track and free play. They should be about 15 acres, and could serve a population of about 30,000.

3. Neighborhood parks and playlots: Parks for passive recreation for all ages, playlots for pre-school children. Both should be about a half acre, and playlots should be no farther than one quarter of a mile from the population served.

4. Major parks and other special areas: Major parks would serve the whole town — or an even larger area — with swimming, boating, camping, picnicking and other facilities. Special areas would be for boating, hiking, hunting, skiing, skating, and golf.

The plan suggests parks in various areas of town. The recommendations for each area are too detailed to present in toto. If you are concerned about what facilities will be made available, a copy of the proposed master plan on file at the town clerk's office lists all areas in detail.

Neighborhood Playgrounds have been set up to serve the neighborhoods identified in the plan. They would be at these schools: Buckley, Buckland, Bowers, Bentley, Manchester Green, Waddell, Nathan Hale, Washington, Keeney St., South, Bennett, Highland Park, Robertson, and Iling Junior High School; plus Valley St. playground.

Substantial improvements are suggested at many of these areas. Three playfields are listed: Robertson Park would gain about seven acres, for a new ball-field and tennis courts, a skating rink and archery range and an enlarged play field. The plan suggests some of the improvements could be accomplished as part of

the proposed North End Renewal program. Union Pond should also be improved.

The high school playfield needs little, the plan says, except a few additional courts.

Mt. Nebo would include land west of the present site, and would be developed with courts, play ground apparatus, tables and shade trees, and more parking.

Playlots are only needed in Manchester in areas of high population density—near apartments, for example. New apartment construction the master plan suggests near the business district should have playlots; otherwise they should be developed as part of existing playgrounds.

Major parks named, all on land now owned by the town, could provide about 400 acres of park space by 1980 for a predicted population of about 60,000.

Center Springs Park should be developed with a pitch and putt golf area, a neighborhood pool, additional parking and other facilities.

Hollow purchase east of the reservoir should be developed for passive recreation and camping, while the western section should be used for 27 holes of golf. The TPC changed the recommended use at an executive session April 22.

The plan recommends development of additional swimming areas and skating rinks, and includes other special facilities in the other park recommendations. The land along town water courses—Birch Mountain Brook, Lydall Brook, and the Hockanum River—are also recommended for purchase.

The acquisition of new park land could be financed, the report suggests, through federal grants. Since the report was prepared in 1962, the state has proposed a number of open space bills which also might contribute funds to town purchases.

Johnny Carson Hit On 'Tonight' Show

"Johnny Carson, you're so sweet!" burbled handsome Fran "Mrs. First" Lee as with the surprise of lightning in winter she plopped her own fussy fox blob of a hat right on the noggin of the unwarned headliner of NBC's night-

ly "The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson" (in color). Except for a few muscles in his face, Carson froze with the control of a hunting dog—but the subtle shift of those facial muscles convulsed the nation's insomnia.

Showing the sleepless ones no mercy, Mr. Carson and Miss Lee kept building the put-on-a-hat, bend-a-hat, react-to-a-hat until the giggles bordered on hysteria. Now he was Nanook, a split second later he was a wide-eyed schnook.

Fifty years ago that one specimen of sure showmanship would have spared either of them further creativity. They could have toured it before the crowned heads, then into the provinces and back again ad infinitum. Yet there hadn't even been a rehearsal, just a quick briefing, so mercurial and demanding are these present times.

Having pledged its faith in "Tonight" the network expects—and gets—such gems from Johnny minute after minute (including, mercifully, the commercials... of which there are many) five nights a week.

Like Miss Lee (who also wanted to make him "strengthening chicken soup") viewers feel proud and possessive. Most of us have failed to notice, though, that while we're rooting, "You can do it, Johnny," Johnny's done it and how! Since he moved into the star spot, "Tonight..." has been setting some records: item—210 stations (the greatest number in the show's history) now carry the program; item—there's a waiting list of sponsors; item—even without such extras as his "let's give away a peacock" he's pulling 400 fan letters a day; and the most telling item of all—NBC, which knows a good thing when it's hired him, has just signed Johnny to another full year's contract.

What has made Carson such a hit? I asked three people: An actor, a press agent (for someone else) and Carson himself. First is it because he's such a

sweet guy as Fran Lee says? "No, I don't think he even is what you call a 'sweet guy,'" ventured the press agent. "But don't misunderstand me. It's not that he has a mean streak; he hasn't... but that wit of his sure is rapier sharp. Not deadly," he mused on, "unless he has to defend himself and then he has the flair of Scaramouche, but I don't think it's his nature to hold a grudge long enough for it to fester. "Sweet sounds kinda soft. He isn't; nice guy though, decent sort."

"I study him," interposed the actor. "He has the most immaculate timing since Jack Benny. I don't know him, but I'd guess he started out shy, learned his craft thoroughly to develop that wonderful shift from control to artless humor. The camera can veer in any old time for closeups; every gesture is socko. I wonder if he studied pantomime?"

"Do you study pantomime?" Johnny Carson, who considerably squeezed the time from somewhere for our interview gave a classic Carson answer, an eyebrow rapidly raised then frozen into space. He broke it up with a quick grin, then got serious and shrugged. "No, sorry, I don't even think about it. I believe in letting attitude trigger the action. What you do is sort of the sum of what you are and how you feel about things. I'm just me."

Carson has been show-business oriented since childhood. At 12 he was billing himself as "The Great Carson," ventriloquist and magician, at community do's in Nebraska. (And if you'd studied ventriloquism long enough, come to think of it, what more could a course in pantomime add?)

After college he worked as a radio announcer, then kept moving until he landed a spot as comedy writer for Red Skelton at which point his world changed overnight. He was asked to step in and appear instead of Red on two hours notice. Bang! Success! Shows of his own followed fast and he withdrew from his six-year run as emcee of "Who Do You Trust?" which he left only to take on the big one, "Tonight..."

As guest Carl Reiner told viewers a couple of weeks ago, "Five shows like this a week are killing!" But lean, limber Johnny seems to be thriving. How come? "I like what I'm doing," hasty as that.

Kitty, the white-haired wardrobe mistress came by the door. Somebody else waved her away without Carson's noticing her. "You just missed a dashing 16th Century Costume," I ventured. "Oh, that's all right," he shrugged. "They must be working up a sketch. If it's still in, I'll catch up with it later." It was then 4 p.m. "At this point that's somebody else's job. At showtime, it's mine." He smiled. I marvelled.

"If I do have any secret about coming over O. K. it's because I let everybody else do his job. I've got enough to do with mine—per-

forming. The producer produces, the director directs, the talent coordinators line up the guests, writers write (the sketches, that is, not the ad lib!) and aside from an occasional request from me for a certain tune, the music is all Skitch's (bearded maestro, Skitch Henderson)."

"All right, you've accounted for the smooth production. Now how do you account for your own smashing success?"

"Well," he said—as though it's the answer anybody would have thought of, "I wouldn't have taken it on unless I believed I was going to succeed or if there had been any thought of competing

with my predecessors. The way I feel about it is that you compete only with yourself."

Will there be summer re-runs? No. If he does need a vacation, there will be guest excess because, "some of our best humor is possible because we can be topical." Film is OK for such daring stunts as his jet fighter exploit but otherwise live. "I do like things a bit wild," he said owlishly—but things can get pretty wild right in the studio. Did you catch his heels-over-head spin in the yoga wheel? Never can tell what he'll do. For those wide awake at the witching hour, he's a good man to keep an eye on.

TV Personalities

Pat Fontaine

On a recent morning, Pat Fontaine awoke at 4:30 a.m. to start a day during which she shook hands with King Hassan II of Morocco in the morning, rode a circus elephant in the afternoon and previewed a Broadway play at night before returning home one o'clock the next morning.

"Except for my usual bedtime being 10 p.m.," explains the attractive brunette panelist of NBC-TV's "Today" show, "this was a typical day. I've never worked so hard in my life as I have since joining Today, but I love every minute of it."

Actually, Pat thrives on a schedule that would quickly wilt most women, and even looks forward to going to work each morning in the pre-dawn dark.

As a regular on "Today" (broadcast on NBC-TV Monday through Friday, 7-9 a.m. NYT), Pat does the weather, interviews, fashion shows and takes part in the informal discussions with host Hugh Downs and Jack Lescouille.

"I get a chance to meet and talk with some of the most interesting people," says Pat of her job. "I get goosebumps when some one like Ambassador Stevenson comes on, or when I interview Margaret Mead or see artist Marcel Duchamp. There are all people you hear so much about. And when I travel with the show to places like the Virgin Islands or Holland, I get to see places I've never been to before. I really consider myself very lucky to have a job like this."

But it was more than just luck that earned Pat the coveted spot on "Today" last Aug. 13. During her two-week tryout on the program in July, she proved an intelligent and articulate young woman with a charm and personality that immediately won her many admiring fans.

Though new to network television, Pat has been in broadcasting for more than ten years. A native of Salt Lake City, Utah, where she attended the University of Utah, Pat has spent most of her adult years in the East.

She began her career on radio station KVLG in Little Rock, Ark., in 1952. Two years later she moved to KARK-TV in the same city as women's program director and one of her first assignments was as producer and hostess of an imaginative children's show, "Pat's Party." During the next four years she also appeared on "Little Rock Today," a woman's series; "Young Misses," a panel show for teen-

agers, and other local TV and radio programs. At one time she was appearing on 17 programs a week.

In 1958 Pat moved to St. Louis as a weather girl and was soon one of the city's most popular TV personalities. In addition to her twice-nightly weather programs, Pat also filmed two educational series, "Outside In" and "Wildlife," which were seen on TV in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago and Philadelphia, as well as St. Louis. She was also an active member of the Women's Advertising Club of St. Louis and was in demand as a guest speaker at local functions. She remained in St. Louis until joining "Today" in July 1962.

Pat, who is divorced, has five children: Patricia Anne, 17; Lamar III, 16; Pamela Gay, 15; Charlotte Kathryn, 13, and Phillip John, 10. Since coming to New York Pat has rented a house in nearby Yonkers. "It's about 70 years old and pure Charles Adams style with its three stories and white cupola," explains Pat. "But it has lots of room and my family needs every inch."

TV Notebook

Bert Shevelove, one of show business' most respected writers and producers, sees a drastic change in the attitude of some performers. "There seems to be a new cult," Shevelove says. "The aim of this cult is to try to do as little work as possible."

As an example, Shevelove cites his own experiences when he produced shows which starred Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra. The shows came in a two-week period, which drove the point home forcefully.

"Martin worked for two days—or part of two days," Shevelove says. "Sinatra—I guess he was trying to show that he was a bigger star—worked for two hours."

"Dean is a very humorous fellow and he has a lot of poise. One night he said to me—kiddingly, I guess—'Last year, I made \$7 million and I only left the house four times.' That's the philosophy with these actors—see what you can get away with."

Largely because he finds that attitude more prevalent in Hollywood, Shevelove is now working exclusively out of New York. He always lived here, but formerly he worked extensively there. For a time, he produced Dinah Shore's show. He just finished producing the latest Judy Garland special. He's also the co-author of the Broadway hit, "A Funny Thing Happened On the Way to the Forum."

"The two coasts approach television differently," Shevelove says. "I'm not saying one is right and the other wrong, but they are different. In New York, we put things on tape and try to approximate stage techniques. In Hollywood, they put things on film and try to approximate movie techniques."

"The attitude out there offends me. I'm used to working long and hard. At 3 in the afternoon, I'm just getting wound up. At 3 there, they say, 'Well, let's knock it off and play some golf.'"

"When they write a comedy show there, the attitude is, 'Well, if it doesn't get a laugh, we'll use the laugh machine.'"

And that, Shevelove thinks, isn't show business but mechanics.
