Gov. George C. Wallace, who has sent about 700 state officers into the city, filed suit Saturday in an effort to block any use of the federal troops.

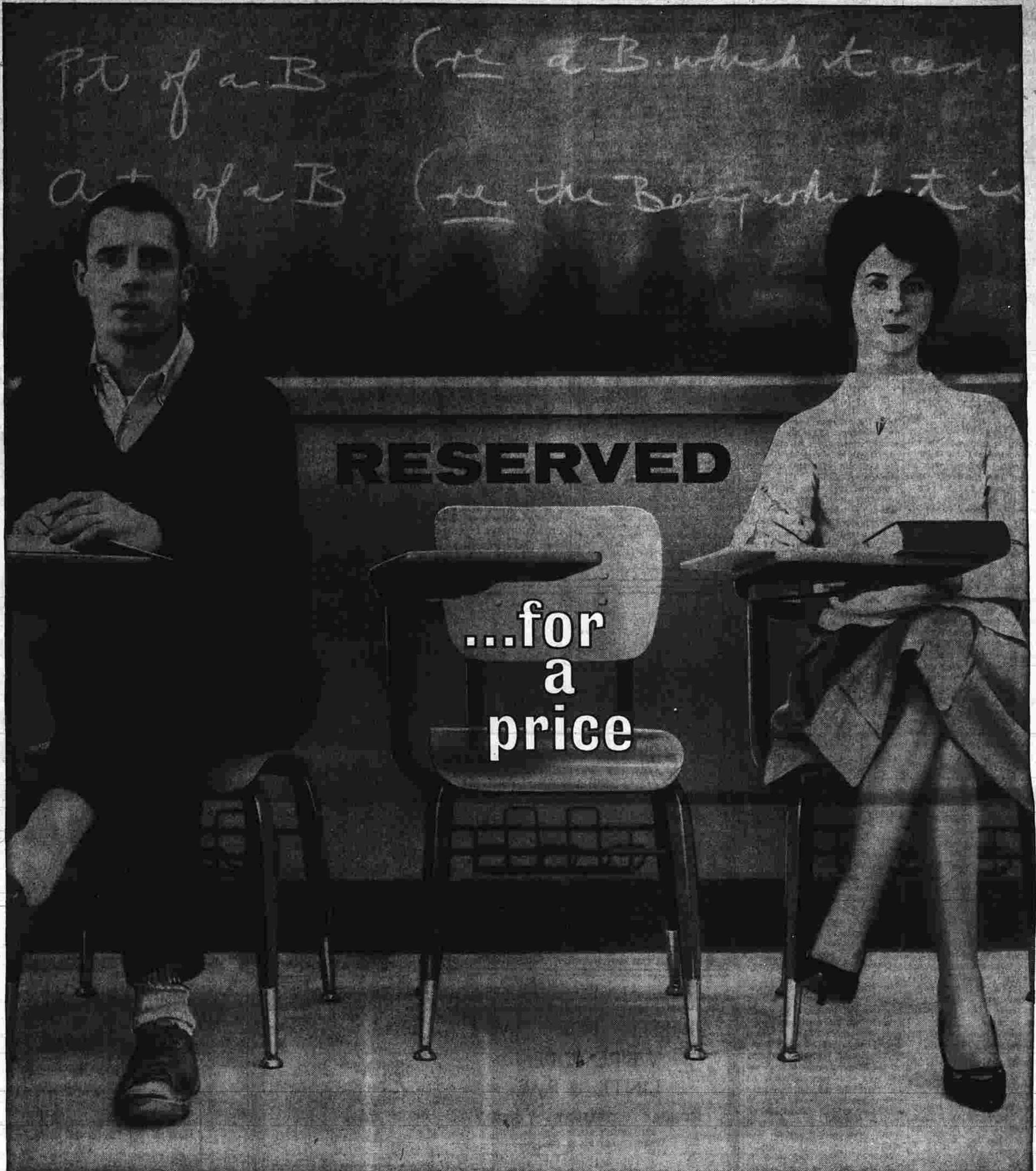

 How has Tulane accomplished peaceful integration in a city where a riot flared after two public schools were desegregated in 1967? And how will Tulane cope with an expanding Negro enrollment and its first undergraduate experience?
 Dr. Herbert E. Longenecker, Tulane president, declined to speculate or even to be interviewed. He said that he is keeping up the school's efforts to avoid the glare of publicity. The 11 Negroes began enrollment in January without a stir.

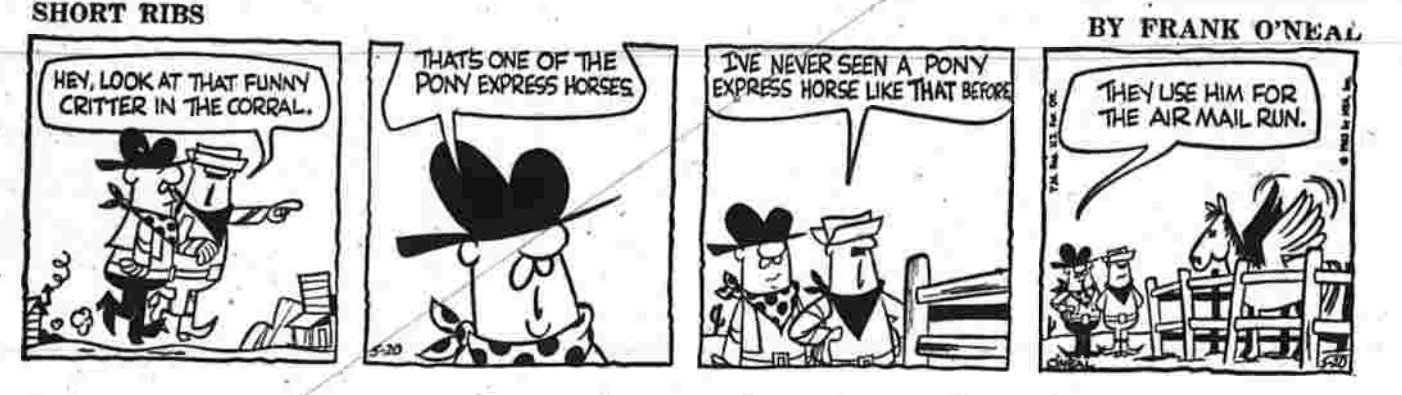

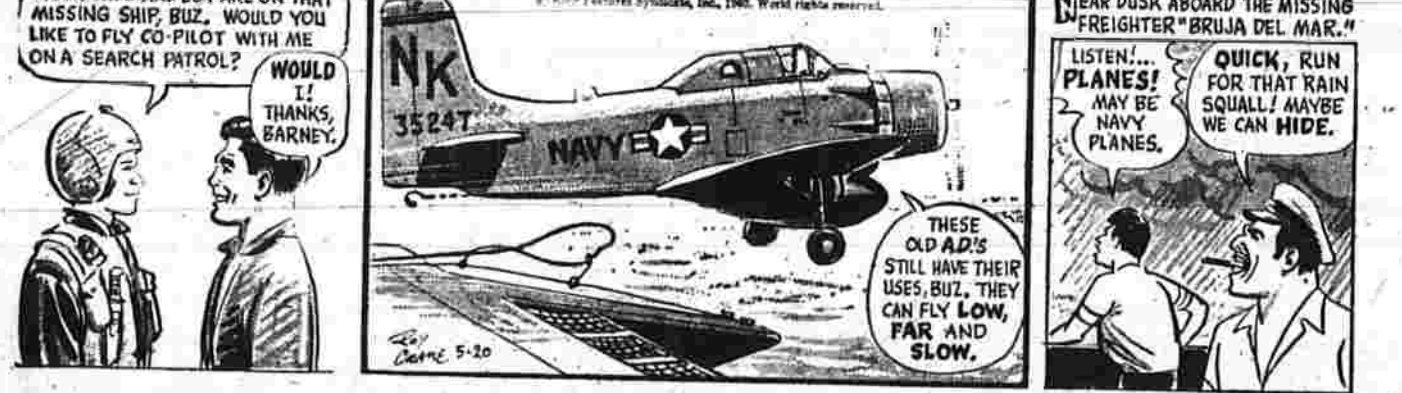
