### How Will CRPA Plans Affect Manchester

At a meeting of the Capital Region Planning Agency in Bloomfield last week, agency officials discussed five alternate plans they have proposed to guide the region's future development.

On June 20, after discussion with interested town officials and citizens, each community's representatives to the CRPA will vote for one of the plans.

To stimulate thought among the town officials present at the meeting last week, staff planner Robert Brown described 11 criteria by which to judge the five plans, and suggested that this be done in each locality by interested officials.

Also distributed were pamphlets giving rough guidelines for each region under each of the five plans.

These area residents were offered some tools to direct their thoughts about both the region and the more local implications of the plan.

**The Plans**

Balanced — allows to each town a complete range of land uses including industry, large commercial development, and housing from houses to high rises.

Satellite — establishes regional shopping and employment centers scattered around Hartford, the center of the region.

Zoning — follows existing patterns now in existence.

Linear — concentrates heavy development along the Connecticut River valley, with less intensive land uses to the east and the west.

Strong Center — clusters all intense development in Hartford and the immediate area.

Brown's criteria, against which he would judge the five plans, are:

1. Is the plan being put to the area for which it is most economically suited?
2. Does the plan encourage a complete range of modes of travel: is there room for rail and rapid transit or bus transport as well as private cars?
3. Are journeys from home to work as easy as possible?
4. Is there a wide choice of housing types, from apartments to large lot, single homes?

### ELJEM SPEAKING

The Lutz Junior Museum receives many phone calls all year round from townspeople who have questions about birds, animals, etc. At this time of year, many of the calls have to do with identification of snakes.

The harmless hog-nose snake is often confused with the poisonous rattlesnake. Our director, Mrs. Mc-Arvey, tells us that, to the casual observer, the markings of these two might seem similar. A quick means of identification would be to observe the shape of the head, the eyes and the neck. The shape of a rattler's head is rather square, not triangular as many people believe. There is a pronounced bulge behind the eye, housing the poison sacs, and facial pits between the eyes and the nostril which act as infrared receptors enabling the snake to find warm-blooded prey.

The hog-nose, sometimes called the puff adder, has a definite turn-of-neck. Its defense is to lie flat and puff its head and look vicious, and if that fails to turn over and "play dead." It is not only absolutely harmless to man, but can rarely be guided into biting. The pupils of the rattlesnake's eyes are elliptical like those of a cat—those of a hog-nose are round.

A rattlesnake's neck is usually very thin at the head, making the head appear all the more pronounced, while the neck of a hog-nose is quite stocky. We hope this information will serve to help our readers to identify their "back yard visitors."

Of course, there are rattlesnakes in Connecticut, and there are copperheads, so named because of their color. No other snake has this color as it is rarely a cause of confusion. Of the fifteen species native to Connecticut, these are the only two poisonous snakes. The harmless common water snake, black in color, is often mistaken for the poisonous cottonmouth, or water moccasin, which is found only in our southern states. As a matter of further information, one cannot tell the age of a rattlesnake by counting the rattles because a new rattle is added each time the snake sheds. He may shed two or three times a year, depending on food supply and weather conditions. Also, some of the rattles may be "lost" through accident.

Bites of poisonous snakes cause instant sharp, burning pain, followed by swelling within a few minutes and profuse bleeding, nausea and faintness. Any bite should be such a snake should be treated at once by a doctor.

Another problem brought to the Lutz Junior Museum is that of baby birds brought home by children or found outside the home. Mrs. McArvey advises against picking up a baby bird. If it is in an open space, do put it under a nearby bush but don't take it home. The parent birds will feed and care for it much more efficiently than you can. If the bird is hurt or cannot be returned to a place near its nest, feed it raw hamburger mixed with a little raw egg. This should be done every few minutes. If the bird lives, it should not be kept as a pet, but should be released as soon as possible. It is against the law to kill or keep most birds. The song birds are protected by federal law, and the hawk, owl, etc. by state law. Only people with special permits may keep live birds or have dead birds mounted by a taxidermist.

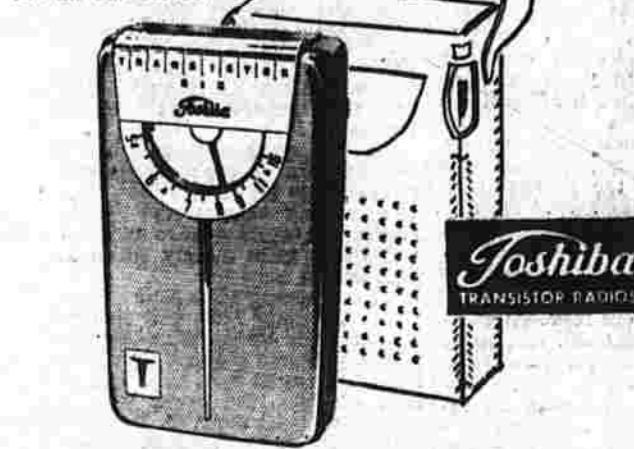

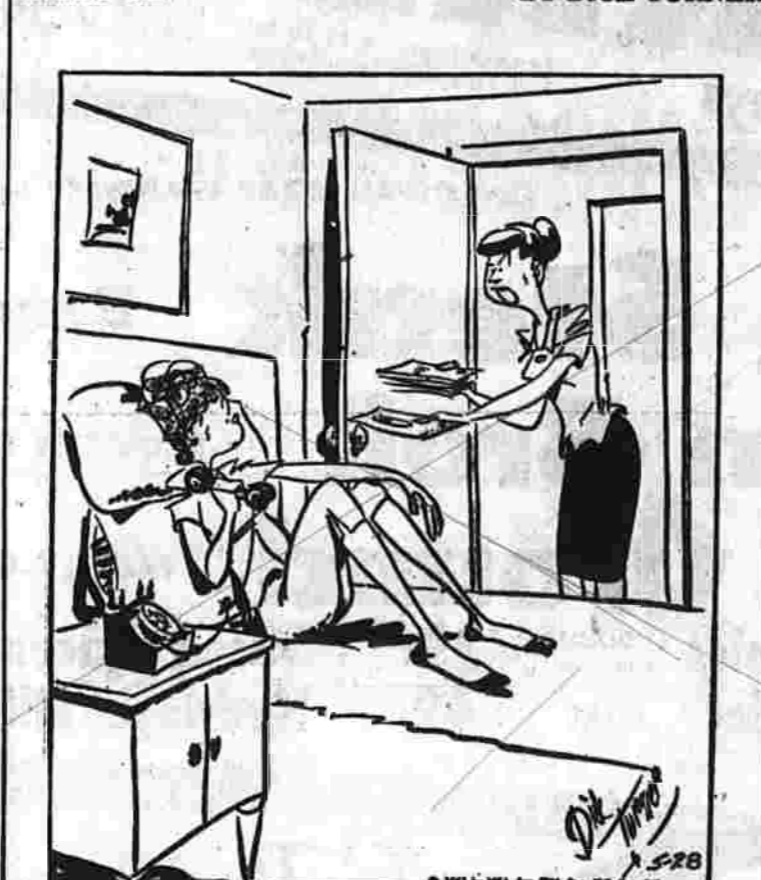
