Curfew Placed in Maryland. Order Demonstrations Halted


CAMBRIDGE, Md. (AP) — Ne-sclear the streets as state police groes agreed today to call off demonstrations after National Guard troops moved in to enforce the curriew 1½ hours after it had taken effect.

The guard, acting quickly Friday under broad authority given & by Tawes, imposed a 9 p.m. curriew on all businesses, told civilians to get off the streets by 10 p.m. and ordered a halt to demonstrations.

Macmillan Speech Eagerly Awaited

LONDON (AP)—Beset by a growing clamor for his ouster, Prime Minister Macmillan remained in seclusion at his country home today to prepare his speech for Monday's crucial debate on the Profumo affair.

Macmillan faces a formidables challenge from his own Conservatives when the House of Commons debates the scandal involving playgirl Christine Keeler's simultaneous affair with former War Minister John Profumo and one-time Soviet naval attache Yev. geny Ivanov.

The case took a sensational turn Friday when a British attorney said Miss Keeler had told him Ivanov asked her to wheedle nusaid Miss Keeler had told him Ivanov asked her to wheedle nuclear secrets from Profumo. The 21-year-old redhead immediately denied this.

Macmillan's aides said the story of the reported Soviet attempt was known previously to the government. But Macmillan summoned top security aides and a new inquiry was considered imminent.

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States has bowed to a "request" of the Haitian government that it remove Ambassador Raymond L. Thurston as envoy to Haiti, but officials said today this government's disapproval of the Duvailer regime will continue.

WASHINGTON (AP) —
Washington's biggest racial
protest was safely over today,
but it left the nation's capital,
worriedly aware that it will not be by-passed by the rising not be by-passed by the rising tide of Negro militancy.

Placard-carrying Negro and white marchers flowed down Pennsylvania Avenue Friday, after prayers across from the White House, in numbers that swelled to perhaps 3,000 at the height of the demonstration.

Spirits were high. Spectators, tourists and federal office workers flocked to watch and mingle, and the police helped speed the moving throng along.

There was one arrest—a motorist who failed to get out of the ist who failed to get out of the the marchers scored one victory, the promise of a ban on housing bias this year. Their leaders declared themselves satisfied that they had put across their other chief demand—an end to racial discrimination in hiring.

But there was no sign that planning would be halted for a second great demonstration here—a proposed massive "sit-in" on Capitol Hill while Congress debates or filibusters a civil rights bill this summer. A few days later, they have a third meeting, with a secretary present. The two kick ideas back and forth and whip up a rough routine, which the secretary takes down. "This first rough routine," King says, "may run between 10 and 12 minutes. The secretary types it in

Gerhard S: Stindt

Gerhard S. (Gary) Stindt is chief, NBC Newsfilm, Central Europe. He assigns newsfilm crews throughout Europe, Africa, the Middle East, Central Asia, the Scandinavian Peninsula — and, on occasion, behind the Iron Cur-

Stindt has filled this post sin Stindt has filled this post since 1956 when the Hungarian Freedom Fighters rebelled against Communist rule and began rioting. Through Stindt, NBC News had the first films of the uprising and exclusive coverage of Hungarian refugees fleeing across the Austrian border. He has made a habit of being "first" ever since.

In the spring of 1962, Stindt and Anderton, under the tightest security, began filming the efforts of several young West Berlin students who were digging a tunnel under the Berlin Wall.

under the Berlin Wall.

The culmination of this filming was a 90-minute NBC News television documentary called "The Tunnel" that won three 1962 Emmy Awards—as "Program of the Year," as "Outstanding Achievement in the Field of Documentary Program" and as "Outstanding Achievement in International Reporting or Commentary" (the latter for Anderton's participation in the program).

Stindt was born and raised in

Stindt was born and raised in Beriin and came to the U.S. when he was 18. He became a citizen he was 18. He became a citizen and enlisted in the Army. He saw action in the Normandy invasion, the capture of Paris and the Ramagen Bridge, the Ardennes offensive, and finally the link-up with Russian forces in 1945.

In 1954, his exclusive film story about the major Nazi war criminals was made into a TV special, "Road to Spandau," which won a Sigma Delta Chi Award.

Stindt arranged broadcast of the Kennedy-Nixon "Great De-bates for West German TV, and later President Kennedy's news conferences. In 1958, Stindt became NBC News' representative at Eurovision, the European television network, and took part in the planning for the first TV satel-

Stindt married the former Renate Wushle in 1950. They have three children: Steven, 11; Felicia.
