Monday's game got into today's contest sending Lefty Williams to the mound. The Sox won 5-1, with seven hits and 13 strikeouts.

Mejias has won his last seven decisions and has kicked his overall mark to 9-4.

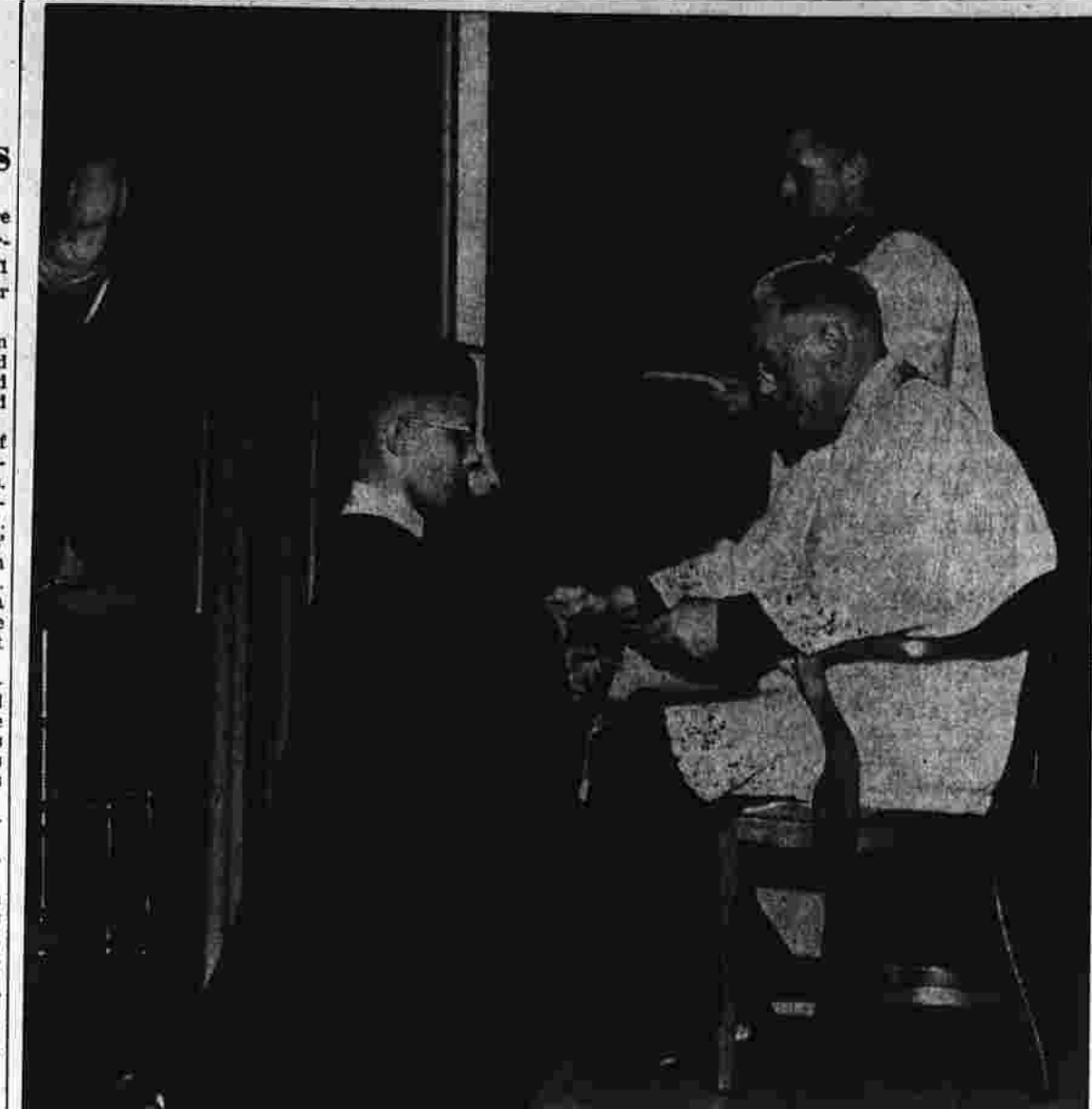
