Charter Unit Role Clarified By Chairman

In response to implications that the Charter Revision Commission was "making the Rockville-Vernon area a no-man's-land," Chairman Atty. David P. Bartlett said today that the commission's role is to study the area.

The President will deliver three addresses in West Berlin and make two stops along the famed wall dividing Western and Communist sections of the city. Stops will be at the Brandenburg Gate and at the Checkpoint Charlie border crossing.

While in West Germany, Kennedy will confer with three of the German chancellors and with the mayor of Bonn, Konrad Adenauer, and his designated successor, Vice Chancellor Ludwig Erhard. Kennedy also will meet with the British prime minister, Harold Macmillan, and the French premier, Charles de Gaulle.

election battle that must come before October 1964.

Twenty-seven Conservatives, most of them younger members of the party's right wing, defied party orders Monday night and refused to attend the meeting of the Conservative Party in London.

The abstentions left the government in the House of Commons with a vote of 221-222. This spared the House from a vote on the government's confidence in the prime minister, Harold Wilson.

The abstentions might have meant that the government as a whole would have had to resign. A major embarrassment for the Conservatives is their lack of a ready-made successor for Macmillan.

The logical pick would be Richard A. Butler, the deputy prime minister. But Butler is disliked intensely in the right wing of the party.

The likeliest choice therefore is the 75-year-old Harold Wilson, who has brought to the leadership of the Labour Party.

Door Closed Tighter

Last year, a decision in which the Supreme Court had upheld a constitutional practice in which the state of New York had officially composed an official prayer for use in the state's public schools. All first news reports and editorial discussions, much too broadly in scope, had been based on that decision.

What that opinion really held was not that it was illegal to have a prayer in school. It held that the state's official prayer was unconstitutional because it was part of a religious program carried on by the government.

At the heart, it was an attempt to interpret that decision in a way that would allow a ban on any and all religious exercises in the schools.

The Supreme Court got around to proving that last year's interpretations of its prayer ruling then were not really far off the mark.

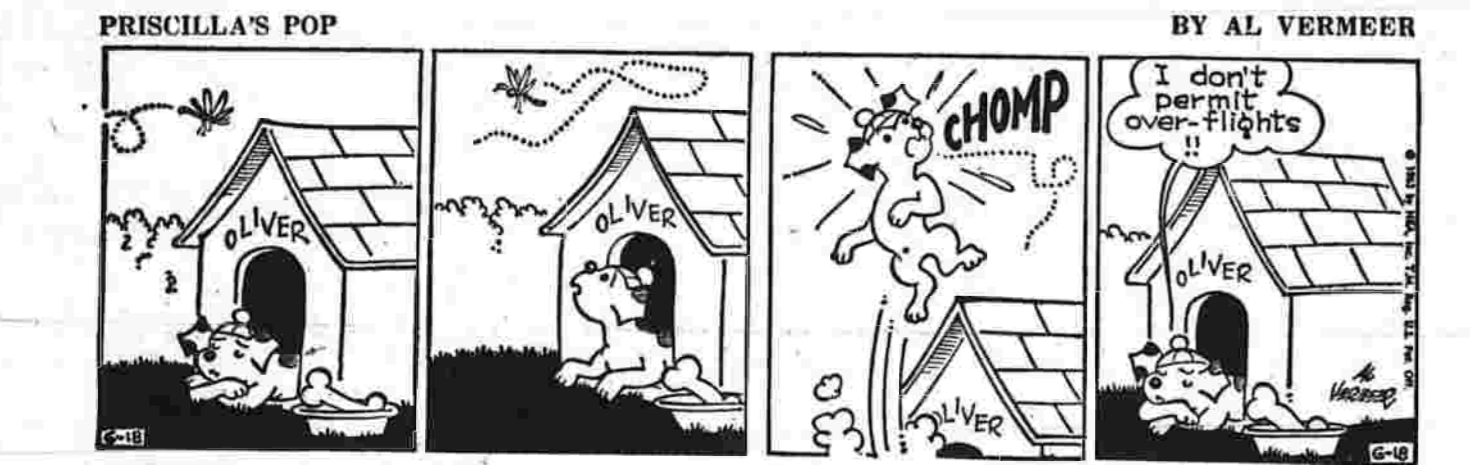

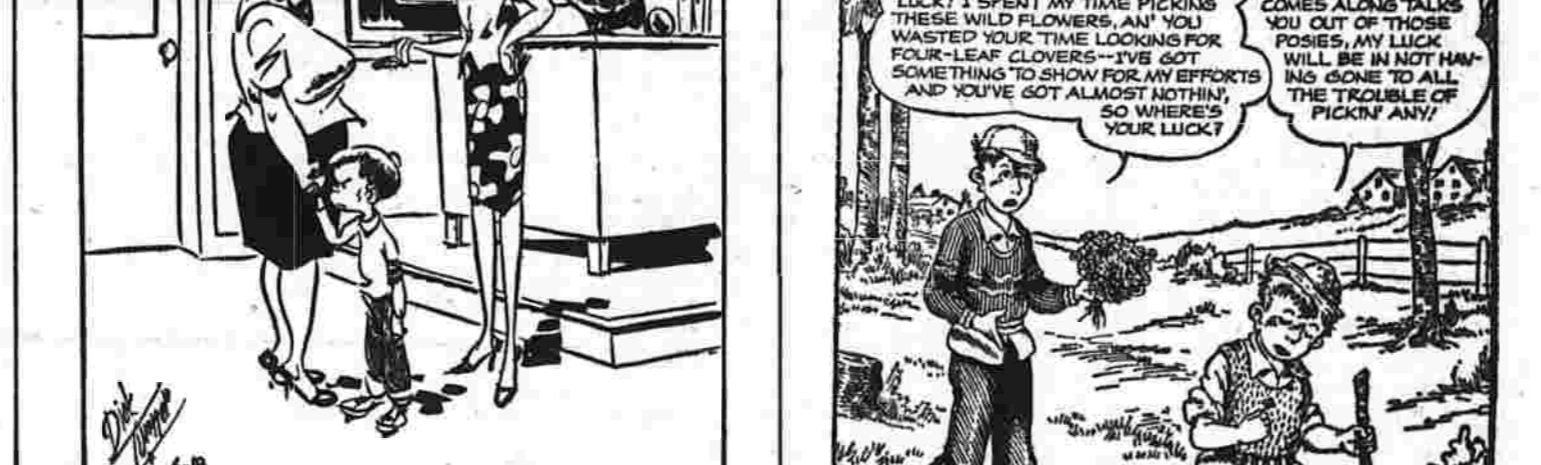
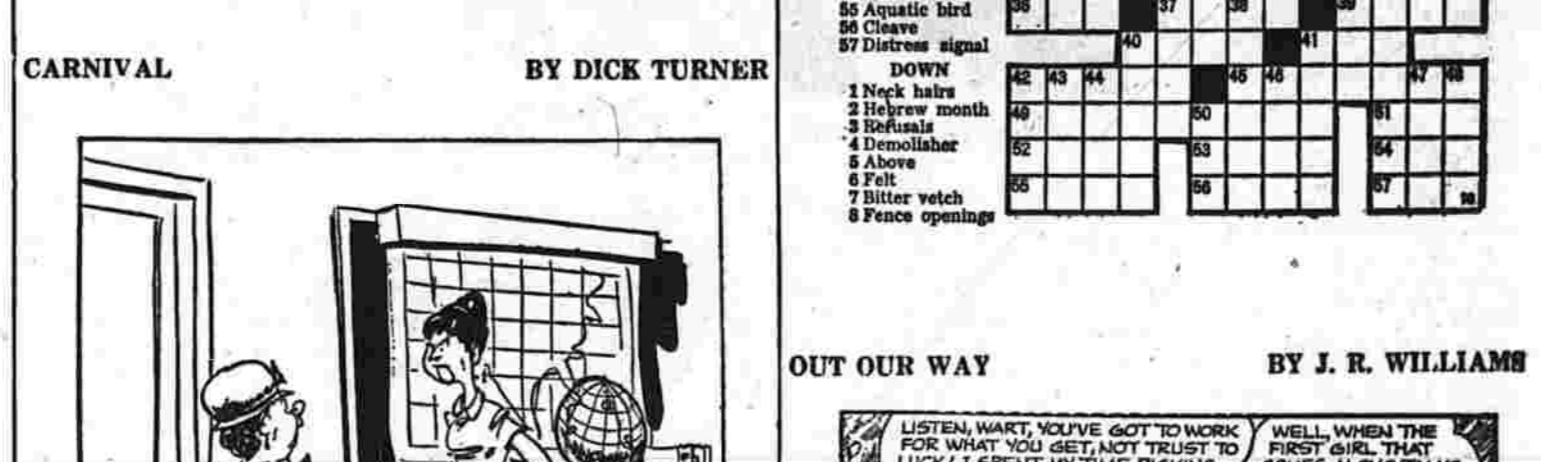
