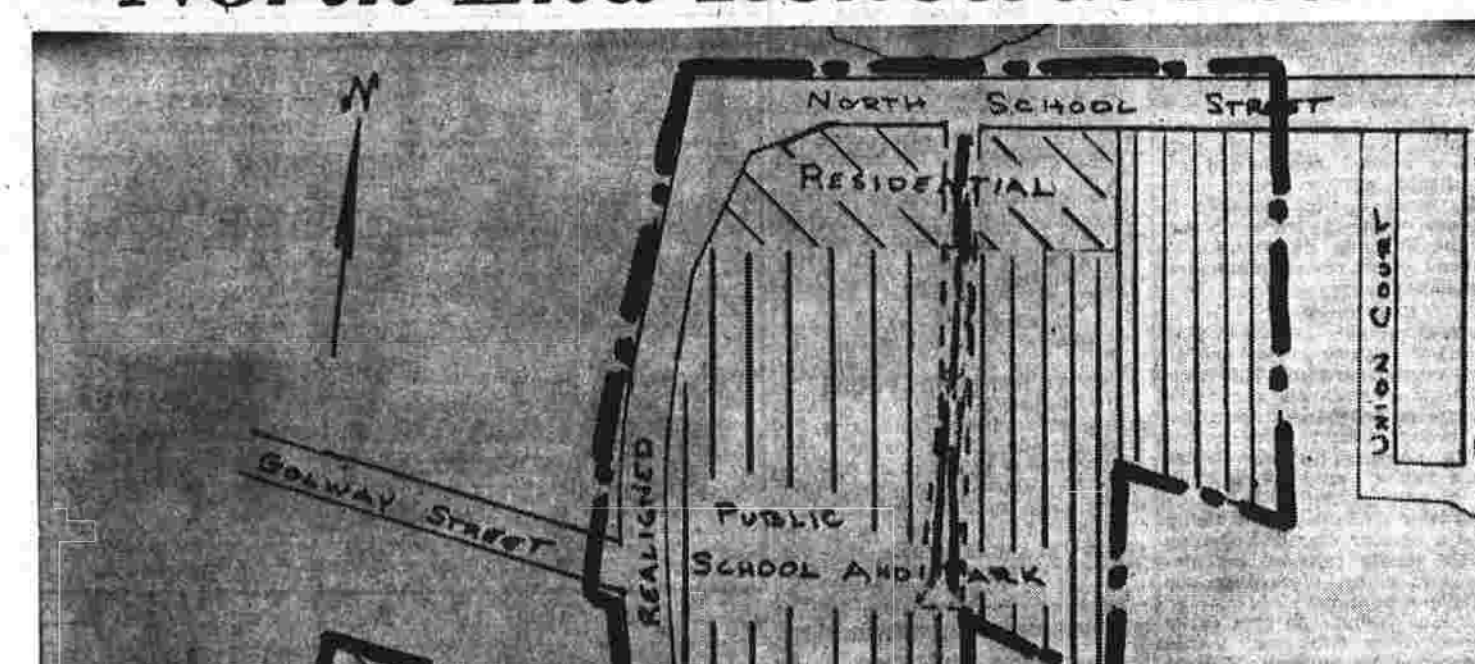

Boy Snubbed His Parents, Wanted Better

NEW YORK (AP) — One of the rewards of parenthood is to have your children be ashamed of you — and, later, to be proud of you.
Can you remember being ashamed of your parents?
I can — very clearly. Most people say if they go back to that craggy corner of childhood, they will find the wonderful sense of being young to entertain the idea that the Gypsies had stolen you as a baby and your present parents were not, in fact, your real parents.
That is one of the great romances of childhood — the belief that you were spirited from something afar, and came from a finer class.
As a boy I used to look at myself in the mirror and wonder who I really was until my mother smiled. But much as I wished to think of myself as a Gypsy's son, my common sense would not allow me to pursue the dream too far.
That face looking back at me was too utterly the son of my father. I was too honest to kid myself. I hated to lose that dream that I had been stolen by Gypsies from high grandeur and put by them into my present estate.
So I clung to that dream and bore a grudge against my parents for being what they were — my parents.
All children, I think, go through that period of uncertainty. No matter how good and kind their parents are, how thoughtful in perspective, how amiable in presence, how dear in purpose, the child feels cheated.
Every child suffers a period of being ashamed of his own parents. He feels cheated by life. He feels that other kids have a better-looking father, a more attractive mother.
What a titan's snubbery! A child goes through before he grows up! What a wilderness of error! My parents were before he reached the far side of the forest!
My parents were people of little education but great wisdom. I know that now but didn't realize it then. As I rode a delivery bicycle by night for the neighbor hood drug store, bringing magazines and a bottle of medicine to those in want and studied in high school by day, I dreamed of marble halls I felt I really deserved.
It was only when I was in college that I began to shed the foolish shame of being my parents' child.
Sitting in the front porch swing one day, my mother said, "Harold, you know we've done the best we can by you," and I said, "Well, I know other parents who have done more," and my mother hid in tears.
That was the only time I knowingly made her cry. I sat in that front porch swing a long time all alone and began to grow up.
Another time in college, I was involved as a passenger in a car accident. My father was nursing about the expense but as he drove me home from the hospital we passed a cemetery and he said, "There's a silent city son. I'm glad you're not in it."
Then I grew up a great deal more, and was no longer ashamed of my parents. Now when I look in the morning mirror, I no longer shiver myself alone. In middle age I share my father's 26 years' dead. It is his face I see in the mirror.
My wife and I have a 10-year-old daughter. I dread the time when she'll be ashamed that we are her parents. But I am consoled by the thought there'll be a time when I trust she won't be and perhaps be happy to realize we are here and she is sure that is the last gladhood of parenthood.

Count could have disappeared without some collusion with someone in this country, although no Americans had been implicated. Williams said the Justice Department should join the investigation.

"This is really big stuff," said Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen of Illinois in backing Williams' request to create a special Senate committee and give it \$100,000 to look into the case.

Dirksen said the grain was loaded on ships in this country but apparently never got to Austria.

The Doctor Says

THERE IS NO MEDICINE YET TO IMPROVE THE MEMORY

By Wayne G. Brundstad, M.D. Newspaper Enterprise Assn.

Q — I am a 63-year-old housewife. I have had trouble with my memory ever since several hemorrhages several years ago. Could this have caused my memory loss?

A — No one has a perfect memory at any age. Loss of memory is a very hard thing to measure. I do not think that the hemorrhages referred to is a cause of your difficulty, but a loss of memory does accompany advancing age. This is due to the slow hardening of the arteries that supply the brain.

This is a form of brain damage that happens to all of us. It is typical of the elderly to remember vividly things that happened in their childhood but to forget what they had for breakfast.

Forgetfulness may be aggravated by indigestion, illness, or stress. The only drug that appears to help the memory is rhinoceros acid, and this is not available in the United States. It is still considered experimental.

Q — My husband has been suffering from a severe loss of memory. Could he get osteomyelitis from them?

A — Both osteomyelitis and bone cancer are both caused by staphylococci. But it would be unusual for osteomyelitis to occur as a result of boils. He may have a deep abscess penetrating as far inward as the bone, or when a broken bone is exposed through the skin. The germs may also be carried to the bone in the blood. This is not because the bone is a relatively superficial tissue in which the infection is well wall off from the surrounding healthy tissue.

Q — Why aren't doctors required to do a Pap test on all physical examinations of women?

A — The so-called Pap test is a very valuable test for the early detection of uterine cancer. However, it would not be desirable to pass a law requiring such a test, because the mere presence of the law could not guarantee the quality of the test. This requires careful training of skilled technicians.

Furthermore, a better test may come along and supplant the Pap test with no notice it would be dropped. If it were required by law, it might lead to a doctor's malpractice suit if the doctor failed to detect cancer. Your doctor should always be free to detect what measures to take in caring for his patients.

Q — I had four cataracts removed from my right eye and the lens was replaced. I am suffering another one. What makes them keep coming back?

A — Some people get two or three cataracts at once. The degree of between them and the lens eye is well recognized. If, when the cataract is removed, the eye wall is scraped thoroughly with a curette the chance of recurrence is the same location is decreased.

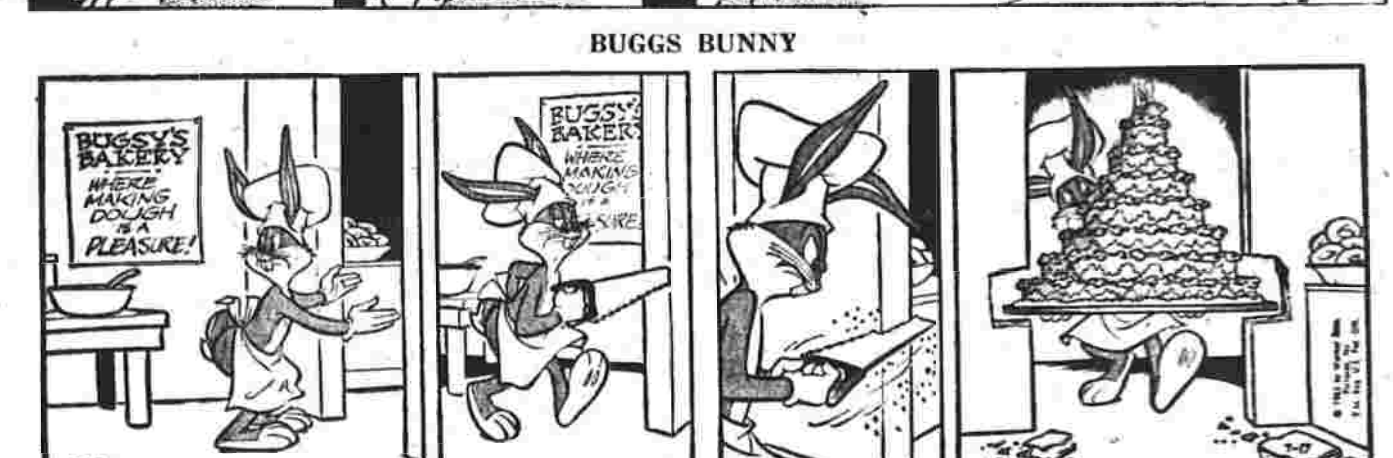

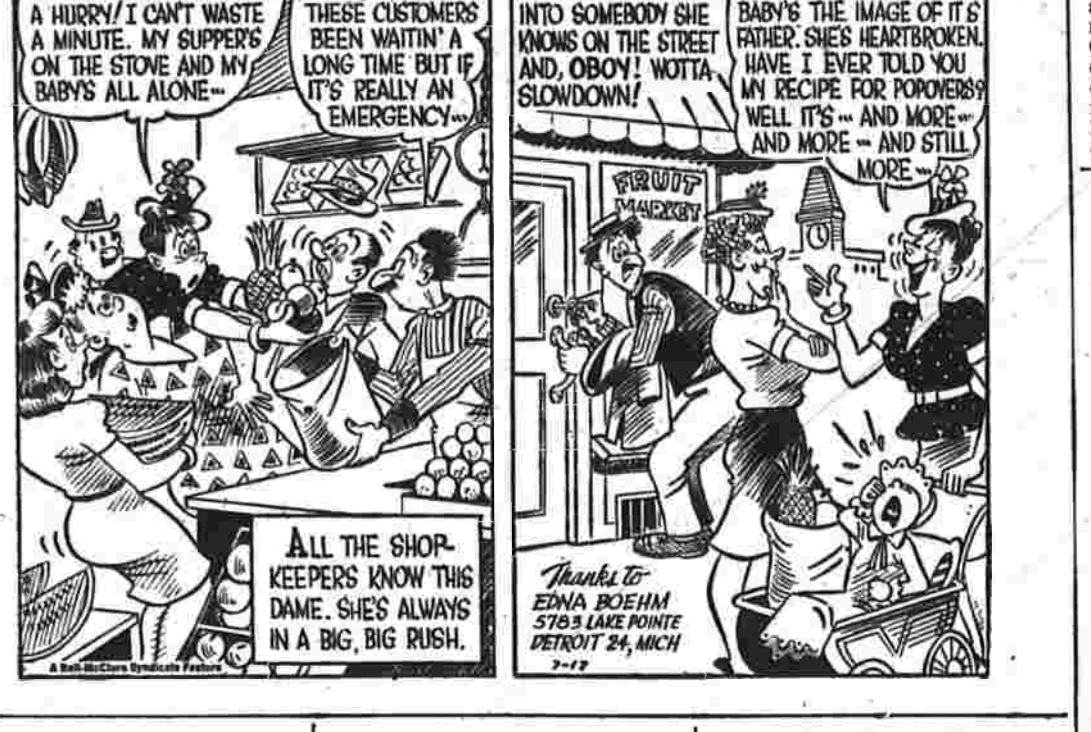

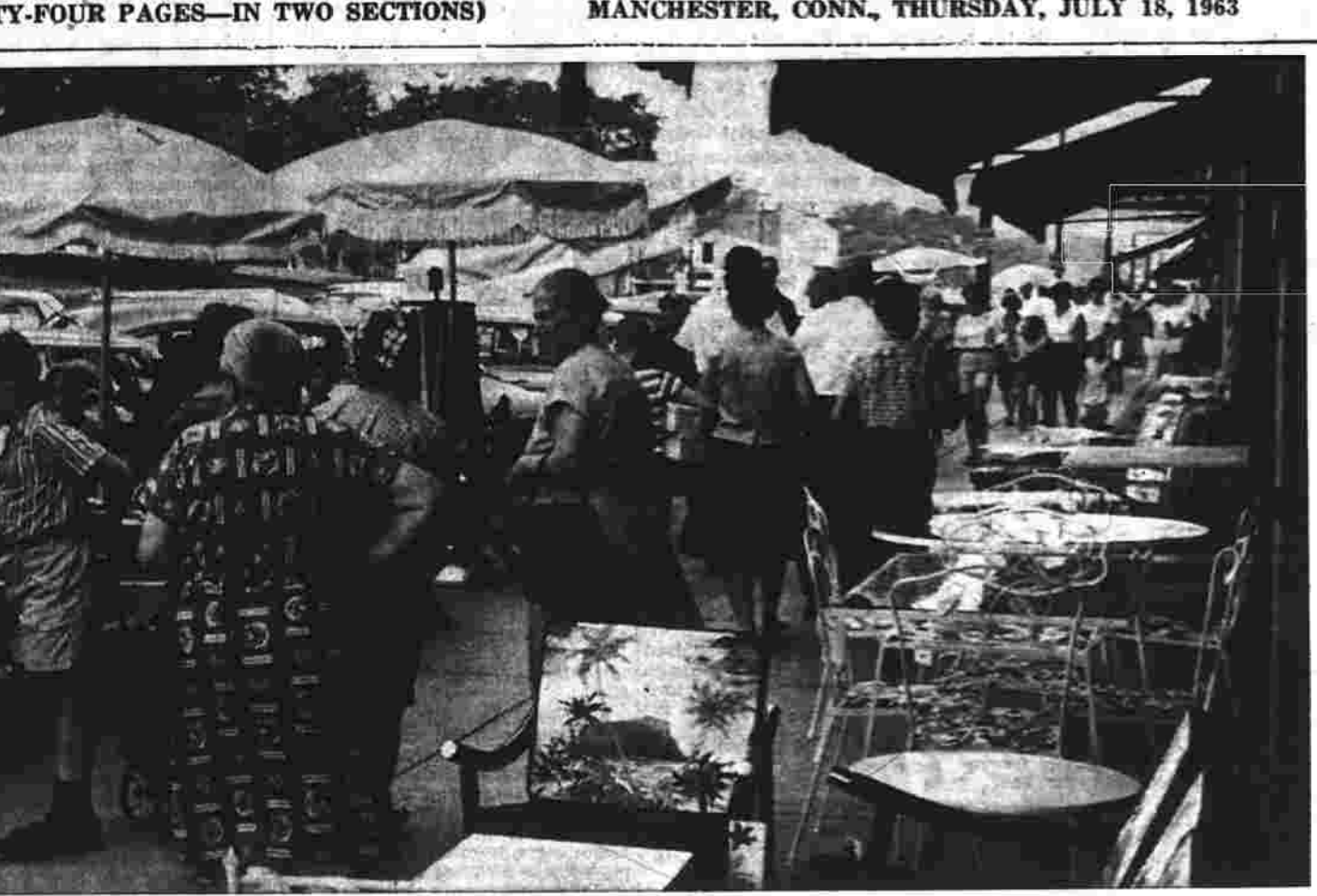
