He can then apply at the town clerk's office, with proof of sixmonth residency in Manchester, and the "previous elector" statement, at any time on any day that the town clerk's office is open, and become a voter in Manchester.

Provisions of the new law, Public Act 382, "An Act Concerning the Transfer of Voting Privileges Between Towns," were qualified by Town Clerk Edward Tomkiel.

The Act provides that "any in-dividual who is an elector in any Connecticut town or city in the State of Connecticut, and removes his residence "to another town or city in Connecticut, may, after a

According to Tomkiel, the new legislation is a direct result of the passage of the Connecticut Constitutional Amendments, in the state elections of November 1962. Basically, the purpose of the amendments is to give Connectiout people more of an opportunity to become electors.






