PAIN, incited criminals to join them in the break.

The PAIN, known for sabotage and attacks on Venezuelan and U.S.-owned installations and businesses, has vowed to overthrow President Romulo Betancourt's democratically elected government and set up a Castro-style regime.

Some sources suggested the break was timed to coincide with today's 20th of July anniversary marking Prime Minister Fidel Castro's initial attempt 10 years ago to launch a revolution in Cuba.

Elsewhere in Venezuela, PAIN terrorists blew up three major highway bridges. They told newspaper reporters they planned to assault police stations to divert forces hunting the prison escapees.

Authorities said terrorist prisoners overpowered guards at the prison meal and opened cell blocks.

Other guards moved in, shooting and wounding prisoners with gas butts and night sticks.

The convicts gained temporary control, however, about 100 women prisoners ran hysterically through the gates.

Guards and police finally rallied. They fired planned down many of the escapees in a creek bed white trunks in arrested cars cut off escape routes.

As troops forced the convicts back inside the prison, snipers opened fire from nearby buildings and the morning hours of the escapees. Many continued to struggle despite wounds.

Officials said a police inspector and four prisoners were killed. However, witnesses said they saw other bodies, including a newspaper and policemen.

A number of bystanders caught in cross fire were among the wounded.





ILGWU in 5th Try To Unionize Modes

The International Ladies Garment Workers Union (ILGWU), AFL-CIO, will make its fifth try in ten years to unionize production and shipping workers at Manchester Modes at a National Labor Relations Board sponsored election on Tuesday.

About 200 employees of the firm will be eligible to vote at the election, which will be from 2:30 to 4:45 p.m. at the plant's cafeteria at Pine and Pleasant Sts.

Similar tries have been made by the same union twice in 1953, once in 1955 and again in 1957. The first election followed a heated campaign, and was voided by the NLRB after the union claimed the company had violated provisions of the Taft-Hartley Act.

A revote in October 1953 saw the union lose by nine votes. In 1955, workers voted against the union 153 to 118, and in 1957 the vote was 99 against to 87 in favor.

The most recent attempt began with a union test leaflet, which ILGWU Director of Organizing Harry Lopatin says brought "a flood of replies."

There followed a quiet personal contact campaign, during which Lopatin says almost all plant employees were contacted.

The information campaign was conducted by shop workers interested in obtaining collective bargaining in the plant, and by volunteers from New Britain.

Lopatin says, "Subsequently, the union sought to reach an agreement with the Manchester Modes management setting the ILGWU up as bargaining agent, but were turned down."

The union then asked the NLRB to conduct an election to determine the employees wishes. Major union demands include reduction of the work week to 35 hours, with no decrease in pay; new or improved health, welfare,

Dozen Youths Held to Blame For Vandalism

A dozen teen-age youths, eleven involved in a spree of break-ins, vandalism, and minor thefts dating back to April 1967, have been turned over to juvenile authorities at Hartford.


