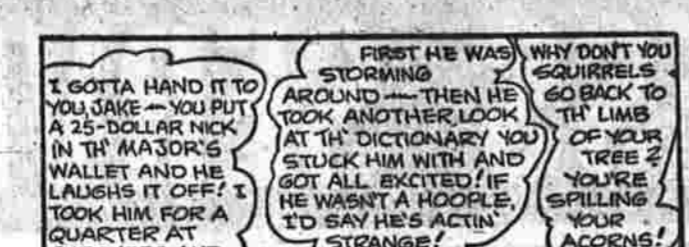

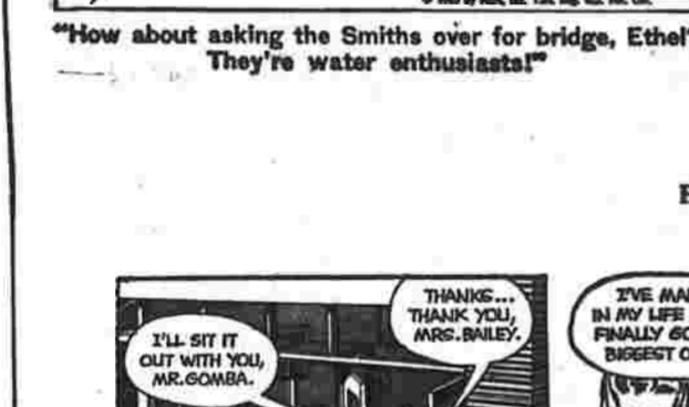

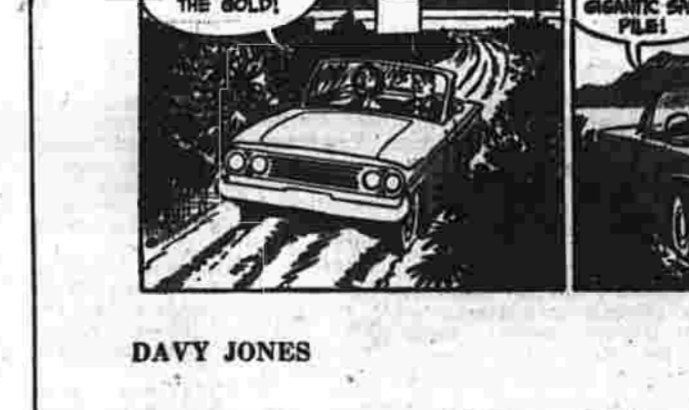

Nurse Staff Gains Offsetting Terminations, Leaves at MMH

An impending shortage of nurses at Manchester Memorial Hospital, foreseen by hospital authorities, has not materialized, according to a recent study of nursing personnel requirements.

Charles A. Markel, administrative assistant at the hospital, said the survey shows there has been a net increase of 10 registered and graduate nurses, and two licensed practical nurses added to the staff during the past six months.

The additional nurses, obtained from university and hospital nursing schools, women moving into the Manchester area, and those returning to nursing after periods of inactivity, have effectively strengthened the staff, Markel said, more than offsetting terminations due to retirements, leaves of absence, and transfers out of the area.

The survey was conducted by a committee of the Women's Auxiliary of the hospital, headed by Mrs. D. J. Roberts Jr., 25 Raymond Rd., who organized an effort to recruit potentially available nurses in Manchester and the surrounding area.

Markel said the increased use of present hospital facilities and planned future expansion will require a constant reappraisal of the nursing personnel complement. The efforts of the Women's Auxiliary in locating qualified inactive nurses will be important to the long-range expansion, he added.

Edward J. Thoma, the hospital administrator, also reported plans to add a position for in-service education to the nursing staff.

The person selected for this position would be a nurse-teacher who would help provide the best possible patient care by conducting a nurse aide training program, a refresher course for previously inactive nurses, and orientation and training programs for all nursing personnel.

Thoma said the availability of persons with this specialized background is quite limited, but that efforts to obtain such a person, initiated at MMH many months ago, should result in the appointment of a qualified candidate in the near future.

Hollywood on TV

ROME (NEA)—Since Mr. Ed had talked his way into television fame for a sort back home, I was only slightly startled to meet a talking horse here in Rome. He could have been one of Mr. Ed's distant relatives because his name was "Edwardio." Edwardio Giovanni was his full name. He knew all about Mr. Ed hitting it rich in Hollywood and in a way Edwardio had hit it rich, too. He had just been put on a government subsidy. "Because," he explained, "I'm a local character. I add color to the old town." Like all characters with color, Edwardio had a dream about going to Hollywood. "But not for a television series," he snorted. "Too much exposure. Too short a career. The big screens are for me. Do you know a good agent who handles horses?" From where I was sitting in a hired botticelle (carrriage) which Edwardio was pulling toward the Piazza Navona he didn't look like a screen type. But I had to admit he was a character. He was old and bony and he wore a little red cap with a white feather tilted beside one ear. We met on the Via Veneto, where you see all the characters in Rome. Edwardio and his driver work there, talking tourists on tours of Rome to a melodious clop-clop of hooves. There are 120 horses like Edwardio behind tourist botticelles in Rome today but back in 1918 there were 3,500. Today Romans and tourists alike prefer the little auto taxis which race all over town like mad little chariots. One of the little taxis cued our conversation. The cab darted in front of Edwardio on the Via del Tritone and Edwardio shouted a lot of words the cab driver would remember him by. "You talk?" I asked, and Edwardio said "Yes" and then we introduced ourselves and he told me about recently going on government subsidy. "Tough times," he explained. "Just like the movie business has been facing. After the summer tourist boom we have no winter business at all. But the government figured we lend color to Rome. "Old world charm, I call it. To keep us in business we're now going to have off-season support. During the four winter months each driver will be paid 25,000 lire (\$40 U.S.) a month. "Between rental of my stall and a stable boy, plus fodder and hay,
