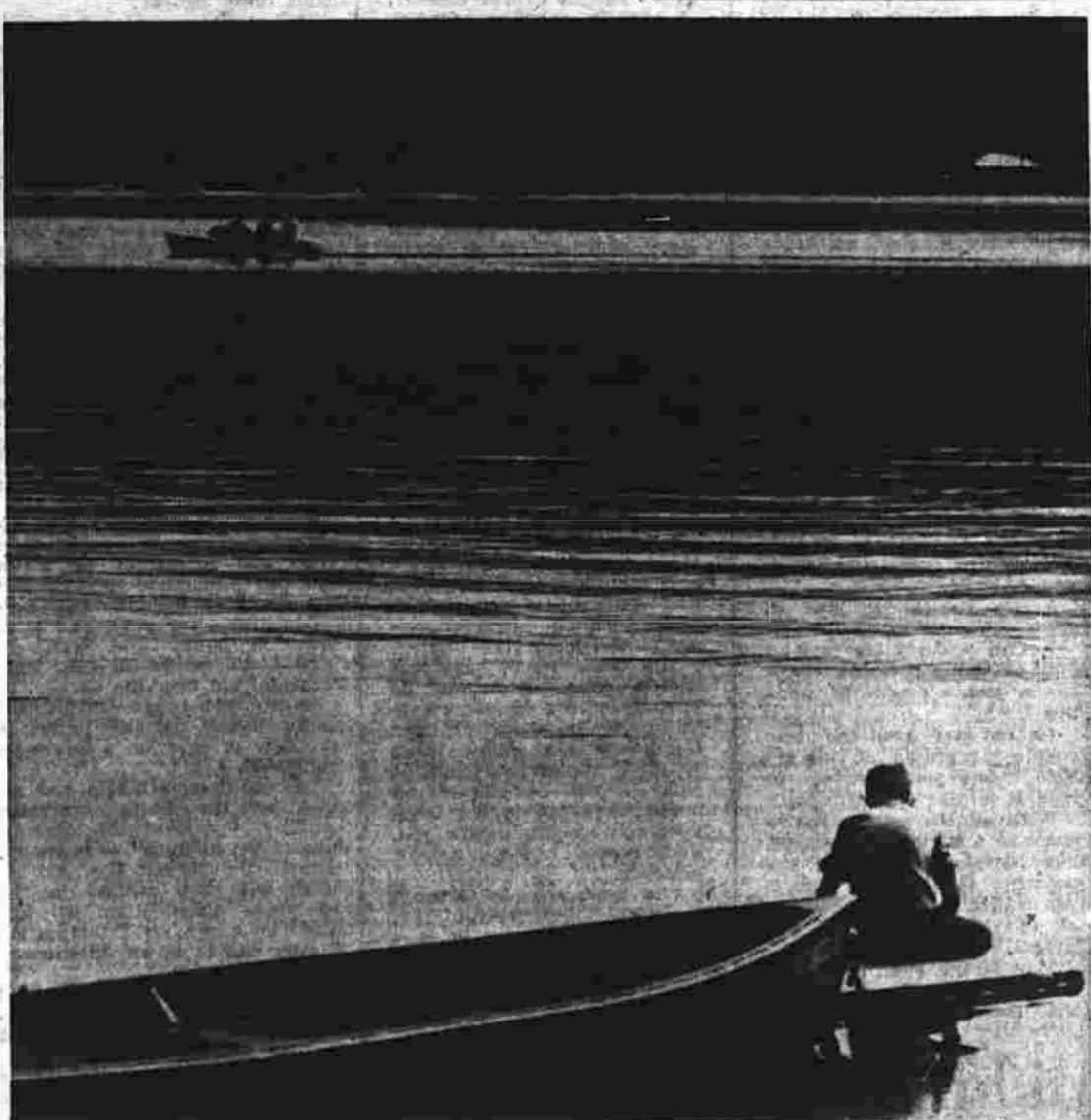

Wallace of Alabama.
