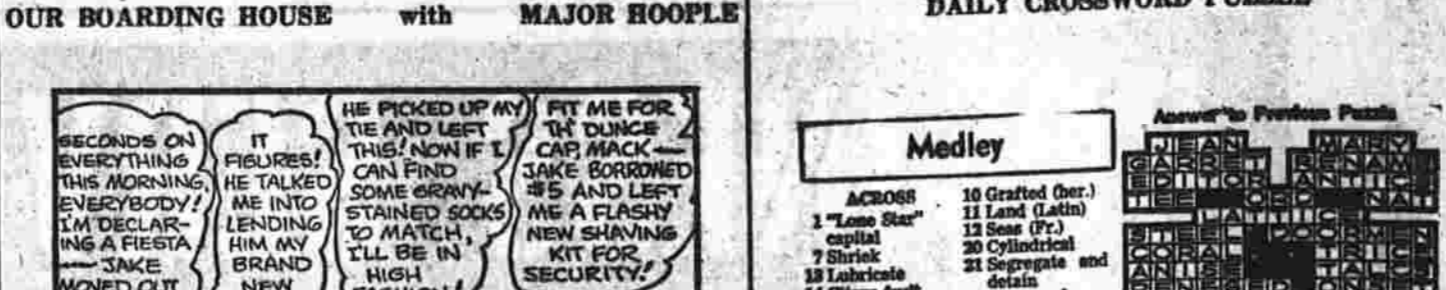
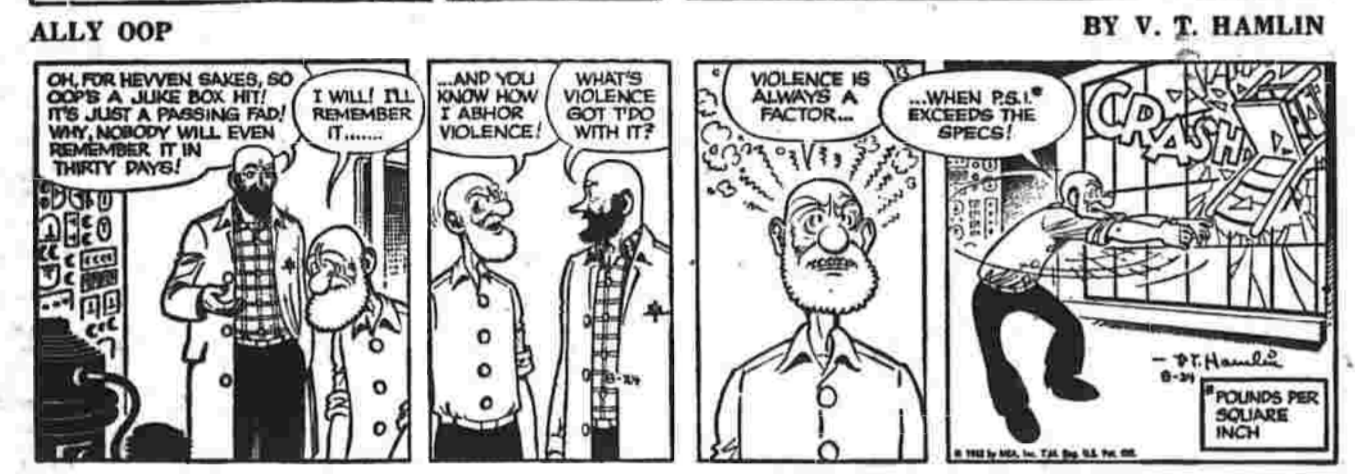

### Schaffer Delegate to Parley As CAFE Notes 25th Year

Beldon Schaffer will be the delegate of the Manchester Board of Education to the Connecticut Association of Boards of Education's two-day annual meeting at Wesleyan University on Thursday and Friday, Sept. 5 and 6. Christie McCormack has been named alternate.

CAFE is celebrating its 25th anniversary with a two-day conference and workshop for Connecticut board members and superintendents to be held in the newly constructed Governor McConaughy Dining Hall.

The major conference speaker will be Dr. Daniel Davies, lecturer and professor of education at Arizona University, who will discuss "School Board - Superintendent Teacher Relations."

Victor R. Macdonald, CAFE executive director, terms personnel relations "indeed a troubled area," and says, "School boards have a need for guidance in the field as pressures mount between two competing teacher organizations, whose efforts involve a more direct part in school board policy, and a direct contact with the board, by passing the board's administrator."

This topic has special significance for the local board because of the existence of two competing teacher organizations, the Manchester Education Association and the Manchester Federation of Teachers, AFL-CIO.

An MFT local was chartered May 1962, after a group of about 25 MEA members became dissatisfied with the functioning of that organization and waged a successful campaign among Manchester teachers for a second, labor-oriented teacher group.

Last fall a CAFE-supported report of the State Board of Education on working relations between boards of education and teacher groups, popularly known as the "Committee of Ten Report," was submitted to the Manchester Board for approval, but action was tabled and instead the report was referred to the personnel policies committee (of which McCormack is chairman and Schaffer is a member) for further study.

That study is still continuing and Supt. of Schools William H. Curtis has indicated that the matter will be renewed at the board's next meeting, slated for Wednesday, when further information developed by the "Committee of Ten" will be presented to the board.

The board's personnel policies group chose to adopt a "go-slow" policy on the report because the two competing teacher groups took opposite stands on it.

Though favored by the MEA and also the Connecticut Education Association, which claim the majority of members, both locally and statewide, the report was fought by the union groups, the MFT and the Connecticut Federation of Teachers on the grounds that its adoption by local boards might ultimately exclude minority teacher groups from recognition for salary bargaining and other personnel matters.

HARTFORD (AP) — The Democratic Party in Connecticut, while not exactly rolling in money, is operating in the black.

"The party has some money in the bank, owes no bills, and — with careful shepherding — will be able to close the year without a deficit," said State and National Chairman John M. Bailey last night.

Bailey gave his analysis of the party's financial status at a meeting of the Democratic State Central Committee.

He had reason to be cheerful as he made the announcement because the State Republicans' organization, far from having a surplus, is reported to be about \$100,000 in the hole.

The Democratic state central committee elected deputy State Insurance Commissioner William R. Cotter of Hartford to succeed the late John F. Kelly of Hartford as its treasurer. The group also heard a farewell speech from State Attorney General Albert L. Coles of Bridgeport, who will leave that post next week to become a Superior Court judge.

Bailey, who played a key role in President Kennedy's 90,000-vote victory margin in Connecticut in the 1960 election, said in 1964 the President will do even better.

The additional votes, Bailey said, will be one of the results of the voters registration and enrollment campaigns that will be "top priority projects in the coming months for the party."

Democrats will concentrate on these efforts and leave "cute gimmicks and souvenirs" to the Republicans, he said.

The actual attendance will be calculated from the number of tickets sold. Since the individual firemen have not all turned in their receipts yet, the precise figure is not available.

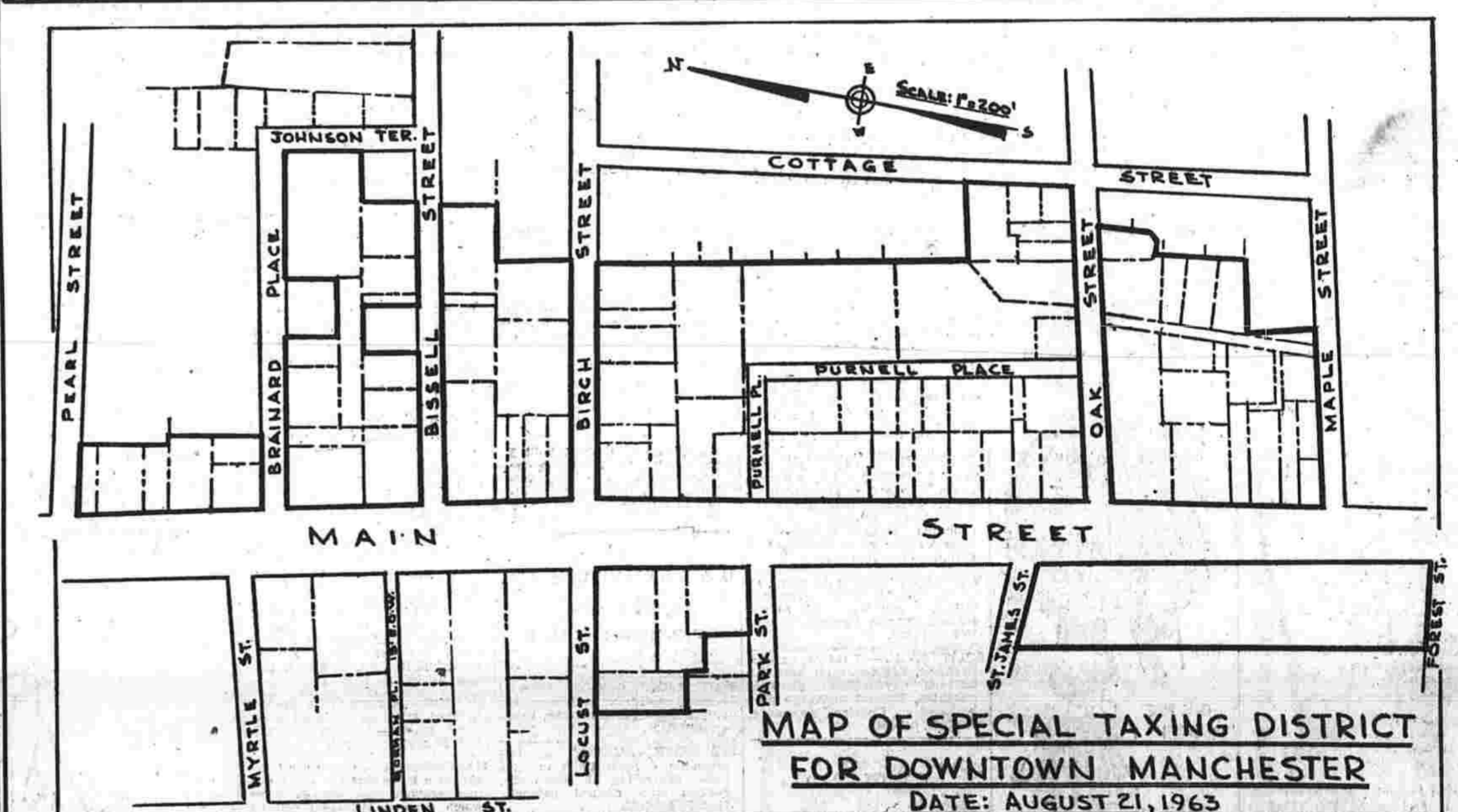
Whatever the proceeds from the event are they will go into the fund for the district fireman's 75th anniversary parade on Sept. 14.

Creating a Special Taxing District

Preamble

# How the Fall TV Crop Shapes Up

By DICK KLEINER (NEA) — From deep in the slough of despond (alias summer repeat season), television viewers can see activity on the horizon. Warming up on the calendar are 34 brand new nighttime shows, just waiting until the repeats have run their weary course.

It is probably unethical for a critic to say so, but some of next season's new shows look good. Of course, these may not be the ones the public likes. (Last year at this time, this writer made a bet with a CBS press agent that The Beverly Hillbillies would be dropped in January.) You never can tell.

At this writing, these look like the cream of the incoming crop: ABC's Arrest and Trial, The Fugitive and The Breaking Point; CBS' East Side, West Side, The Great Adventure and variety shows starring Danny Kaye and Judy Garland; NBC's Espionage and The Richard Boone Show.

ABC, in particular, is showing sudden signs of maturity of its programming. Where once Heavens Eye and Bourbon Street East were this network's idea of great drama, now they are approaching the home screen with some inventiveness.

NEW YORK (AP)—People told Robert Stack, "Pretty easy work, isn't it? All that money for just making faces at the camera."

But Stack, after a four-year grind during which he appeared as a federal agent Elliot Ness in 120 episodes, says he wouldn't want another television series now for all the prestige or money in the world.

"I'm a pretty fair athlete," said the actor, who stands an inch above 6 feet and at 44 is still as trim as a boxer, "but there is a physical limitation to how long you can go on. Frankly, I couldn't have gone on for another year.

"It's a never-ending, deteriorating kind of work. You finish a show Tuesday, then start a new one on Wednesday.

"You develop a deep, deep fatigue. You have no residual strength to do the simplest things."

Stack finally turned in his revolver after he felt his eyesight was beginning to fade, and a hemorrhage of a vocal cord left him unable to talk for two months.

"I sold my interest in the series," he said. "I don't want to keep books on something finished."

But Bob retains a feeling of warm appreciation for his role as Elliot Ness, the name he is still best known by to millions.

"The fun of a successful television series that the set becomes a little world of your own," he observed.

"In a way you have more freedom than in motion pictures. You don't have to check with a bank to see if a certain actor is acceptable for a part. You can pick completely unknown actors as leads, and give them a chance to show what they can do."

Stack recently completed his 29th film. This winter he will make one in Europe based on a German war novel.

A local boy who made good, Bob has known Hollywood notables on a first-name basis since his youth, when he first won renown as a national champion skeet shot. Later he served as a gunnery instructor for the Navy during World War II.

This early acquaintance with entertainment figures engendered in him a lifelong love for the motion picture world.

Bob brings to his job a zest that springs from his own physical vitality.

"I believe strongly in enthusiasm," he said. "There has to be a joy in action, a real lift in life and work."

## Teacher Role Series Topic

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Television series, no matter what viewers sometimes suspect, are not always found under cabbage leaves like Topsy nor even between the covers of a book.

Finally he had an idea for a central character—a practical idealist, a man who wants nothing more than a chance to take a crack at ignorance eight or 10 hours a day, a great hero for the public.

"Young people today are begging for discipline and understanding," he said. "They aren't the way they were shown in 'Dobie Gillis' and 'Our Miss Brooks.'"

At any rate, James Franciscus, an idealistic looking young man, will play the hero-type teacher. Dean Jagger will co-star as the wise, older school principal. And except for guest stars, the rest of the cast will be bona fide high school students, recruited in groups from nearby communities and paid the regulation \$25 a day as extras. MGM has reserved space where the students can continue their studies, with their teachers, when they are not needed on the sets.

"We're on a campaign to improve the image of teachers," said Neuman. "We're going to have ours fall in love, smoke and even take a drink."

"You have to get a level of joy in everything you do."

Bob is philosophic about his "You have to learn to enjoy things to the fullest when they happen," he remarked. "After all, success is just a ouija board."

## TV Personalities

**Robert Vaughn**  
HOLLYWOOD (AP)—You may not, at the moment, know Robert Vaughn by name, but if you watch more television his face is familiar.

And this is precisely why we'll soon be seeing Vaughn playing a Marine Corps captain in NBC's new "Lieutenant" series. Vaughn, a good-looking dark-haired character actor of 31, does particularly scary villains. They are usually the well-dressed, well-mannered, chilly kind. But not for the next season, at least.

"It's that image thing," Vaughn explained. "I'm going to try to get an association of the face with the name."

The actor has been much in demand as a guest performer—one of the lucky ones who each year makes a profitable circuit around a dozen or so series, doing one role in each.

But even this steady employment, he feels, has some disadvantages because he almost invariably plays an unsympathetic character.

"You're opposing the continuing characters," he continued, "so usually a guest star in the antagonist and in conflict with the heroes."

Financially, of course, he'll also do better. Vaughn expects to appear in all 38 episodes of "The Lieutenant," exactly four times as many shows as his yearly average, with a fourfold increase in income.

Vaughn's character, an older career officer in the peacetime Marine Corps, was added permanently to the series after he appeared as a guest star in the pilot film. Gary Lockwood plays the title role.

Vaughn, incidentally, is a serious student of acting and directing. He already has his master's degree in communications and is now only a few credits away from his doctor's degree.

"The Lieutenant" is NBC's new early Saturday evening entry. But it may take more than a landing party of Marines to get that situation well in hand. The 7:30-8:30 time slot has been securely held by CBS over the years—first with "Perry Mason" and recently by Jackie Gleason.

Pvt Boone, Tommy Sands and Gary Crosby, start in "Mardi Gras," a musical romance in color on NBC-TV's "Monday Night at the Movies" Aug. 26 (7:30-9:30 p.m. EDT. Repeat of May 20, 1963.)
