While the debris piled higher above us in the tunnel. The men... from the cave-in lasted that long. There were others later.

I believed for Louis but there was no answer. After a while we started crawling over the debris. All kinds of things were there: the shovel and our lunch pails... a hammer and a hatchet...

We started crawling around in a circle looking for a way out. We went this way and we went that way and sometimes we thought we were back where we started and most times we just didn't know.

There was no question about anything up then. The most room was between the top of the debris and the ceiling of the tunnel. It was four feet. Many times we were less. Always, sleeping, we got out on our hands and knees and crawled.

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White House Seen Lyndon Goal in 1968

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson is happily preparing to return to the political arena next year, riding the lurch that President Kennedy is going to win re-election by a narrow margin.

Although the President and Johnson, reportedly never have discussed the matter, there is every indication they will be teammates again in a campaign they will carry vigorously into every corner of the nation.

Johnson, who campaigned in 44 states in 1960 when Kennedy was the presidency by a whisker, obviously is going to have to hear in 1968 the brunt of Southern Democratic resentment against Kennedy's endorsement of racial demagogues and his pressure on Congress to act on civil rights legislation.

But if the lanky, dark-haired Texan is disturbed by the prospect of going into the South to tell possibly unresponsive audiences there that the time has come for all citizens to enjoy their constitutional rights regardless of color, he doesn't show it.

Neither is he perturbed by the likelihood that some of the party's liberals will grumble that he still is too tightly tied politically to conservative white southern Democrats.

For the last two and half years Johnson has been busy shedding the sectionalism that put him in the Senate and which appealed to the Southern bloc which engineered his promotion to national leadership position. There he became, behind Dwight D. Eisenhower, a happy-go-lucky president he still respects and likes—the second most powerful man in the country.

If it was a wrench for Johnson to give up his power to become vice president, the compensation lay in the fact that he was one of two nationally-elected officials of the government and might, in time, become the head man.

For all that goes well in next year's campaign, Johnson will be pointing for 1968. Rep. Carl Albert, D-Okla., the House majority leader, already is in record with the prediction that Johnson "will succeed Jack Kennedy as President of the United States."

In the process of broadening his horizons, Johnson has been a special pleader for conciliation in solving racial problems. He has said firmly that "half a loaf will not do" and that the racial which are not settled by justice and fair play will sooner or later be settled by force and violence.

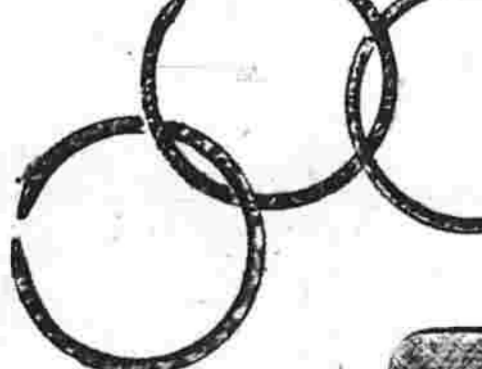

Diem Denounces U.S. Reaction To Crackdown on Buddhists

(Continued from Page One) monks and a nun have committed suicide by fire. Sunday, police and soldiers raided pagodas and arrested hundreds of monks and nuns. Martial law was declared. Diem on Tuesday postponed indefinitely a National Assembly election set for Saturday. The decree indicated the Government sees no quick end to the crisis that threatens to hamper its war against Communist guerrillas. At least 13 foreign embassies complained that their diplomatic channels had been blocked by Saigon authorities. Unlike the United States, the embassies rely on South Vietnamese telecommunications centers and have no direct line to home offices. In Washington a State Department spokesman declined to assess the role of the Vietnamese army in Diem's move against the Buddhists. Other authorities in Washington said continued enforcement of Diem's martial law declaration indicates the army is not planning a coup. U.S. foreign aid chief David Ball said in a Washington television interview that the United States views that to continue aiding the free people of Viet Nam against the Communist guerrillas but "we do not support repression in any country." U.S. authorities here announced the death of a U.S. Army pilot in the anti-Communist war. He was the 22nd American to die in combat since the American military buildup of December 1961. The pilot's twin-engine recon-

Haitians Say 'Papa Doc' Is Under Curse

By Robert Berrelier PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti (AP) —Haitian roulette is more complicated but no less deadly than its Russian counterpart. Suppose you drive by the heavily guarded national palace at night on four very bad tires. You have a blowout," explained a Haitian businessman, "it's the end. The explosion will draw a barrage of fire from every trigger-happy guard on duty." Even if apocryphal the account of this new local sport serves to dramatize two facts of life in the Haiti of dictator Francois ("Papa Doc") Duvalier: 1. Very real fear of a blowout in front of the palace is only one of many varieties of terror flourishing here. 2. The main force of this terror is the palace, the ornate fortress which Papa Doc, in a bizarre pact with his sense of bizarre mission, has pledged to turn into a "Himalaya of bodies, rivers of blood" in any attempt to depose him. Two small invasions by anti-Duvalier armed bands this month resulted in a wave of reprisals here and in the interior demonstrating that Papa Doc is not making idle threats. Scores are believed to have been killed or imprisoned—where death sentences are the only parole—on suspicion of disloyalty. Operating in the invasion area, Duvalier's special security corps, the Tonton Macoutes, are said to have hurled hand grenades into homes of those thought to have even smiled at rebels. There were reports of executions of officers and civilians in the ill-famed prison of Ft. Dimanche. These new victims are only a fraction of those thought to have paid with their lives or limbs for real or imagined lack of faith in Duvalier since he came to power in 1957. Political reprisal business became so brisk in his time that Duvalier converted the basement section of the National Palace, and the one-time military barracks at Ft. Dimanche into special prisons equipped with torture cells. Here and in the National Penitentiary, solitary confinement means enclosure in the "jolibou" tiny cubicles with just enough room to squat or stand hunched over. The low ceiling is sheet metal on which you can panbroil a steak in mid-day heat. A shallow can in a corner serves the daily hygiene needs. Survivors of these political prisons are reluctant to relate their experiences in detail. But the northern frontier invasions by his enemies have exposed signs that Papa Doc is now a captive of the fear he exploited to stay in power. Duvalier distrusts the army which he purposed to weaken while arming his own civilian militia and Tonton Macoutes. When heavily armed terrorists mounted a spectacular attack on his forces in Fort au Prince's foothills last month, the dictator refused to send in the regular army until the militia was routed with heavy losses. Even then Papa Doc showed an astonishing reluctance to part with heavy ammunition he keeps locked up in the palace. Sore of the long tradition of fragile loyalties among Haiti's partisans of power and of the spreading curd, the dictator has virtually buried himself in the palace, his last sanctuary. There he is surrounded by a powerfully equipped special palace guard, the only tanks and cannon left in the country, most of the ammunition—and his deep voodoo faith. But many Haitians will tell you nothing will save Papa Doc because the mahogany presidential chair has a "fragile" pronounced run-jay-or misadventure and anyone who sits in it goes mad and dies.

The Doctor Says
NO SERIOUS MEDICAL PROBLEMS

 Q — What causes dark discoloration under the eyes? What can be done for this?
 A — If other members of your family have the same condition it may be a hereditary tendency to have very thin skin in that region. This would allow the dark, venous blood to show through.
 State hours with not enough sleep in another cause. The condition is often more noticeable in the girl who respects herself too closely than it is in friends. In any case it is not a great deal, if it bothers you a serious deal, you can use cosmetics to hide it.
 Q — I am a housewife. What side effects am I likely to get from mafenone phenpropionolone (Dorbanol)? My doctor says it is a male hormone and that it will improve my appetite and help me to gain weight.
 A — The usual side effects from male hormones are less severe with this drug than with some of the other male hormone preparations. It may, however, cause acne, hairiness, increase of facial hair, and some menstrual irregularity. These side effects are usually easily controlled by decreasing the dose.
 Q — I am over 80 and am troubled with itching ears and eyelids. What causes this and can it be helped?
 A — The causes of itching are legion but, when it chiefly involves the ears and eyelids, a common cause is seborrheic dermatitis, a disease that is associated with excessive dandruff and that is usually improved by controlling the dandruff. This and allergy are the two commonest causes of the kind of itching you have.
 Q — I have excessive sweating of the hands. Is there anything I can use to control this?
 A — Sweating of the palms is not always due to instability of the nervous mechanism that controls the caliber of the blood vessels in the skin. This mechanism makes them dilate in a warm environment to permit increased sweating and contract when the environment is cold. The antiperspirant preparations used in the armpits are of no value for sweating of the hands. Coffee increases nervous tension and should, therefore, be avoided. Propylthiouracil bromide taken by mouth has been used with success by some persons with this condition. Consult your doctor for the amount and frequency of the dose required.

Learn Steps To Close Up Your Cottage

Newspaper Enterprise Assn. A more homelike find themselves mistresses of two houses. A new routine is added. Closing the summer or vacation house at the end of the season is not simply a matter of flicking off the lights. Knowing something about how to close a house may save costly repairs next spring. Even if you plan to use your vacation home periodically during the year, plan for the long stretches between occupancy.

First step is to check your insurance policy to determine whether the period your summer home is closed complies with the policy provisions. If a discrepancy exists, have the policy amended immediately.

Remove all rugs, tape, turpentine and other flammable materials. Clean and unpolished furniture must be protected.

Cover all chimney tops with heavy plastic to prevent squirrels from entering the house.

If heat will be shut off, drain all plumbing to avoid frozen pipes. If heat will be left on at a reduced temperature (to protect musical instruments or decorative pieces) arrange for periodic inspections. Coat chrome fixtures and bathroom fixtures, metal grates and sporting equipment, deep hinges with a thin layer of petroleum jelly to keep rust from forming.

Cover furniture with sheets, disconnect electric cords, and turn off all pilot lights except for the heating plant.

Notify police your absence and leave your regular address and telephone number with a permanent resident of the area to insure prompt notification in case of emergency.

Elementary School Principal Charles G. Bennett announced today the total enrollment, reaching 420, of the Hebron School District.

Adjustment of the school budget, to meet the \$3,535 cut made by the board of finance, was approved as follows: Teachers salaries reduced by \$2,000; substitute teachers, reduced by \$100; heating, \$500; contracted services, \$500; teachers' book, \$10; site, \$175. It is hoped that this adjustment will meet the appropriation without hardship.

One of the needs to which D. Benton Critchfield, chairman of the building committee, calls attention, is a fence between the elementary school and the Coolidge property, which was agreed upon by the town when a part of land owned by the Coolidge family was bought to enlarge the school grounds. Funds, however, are lacking to pay for it. The selection report there are no funds in their building committee budget. It is hoped that this adjustment will meet the appropriation without hardship.
