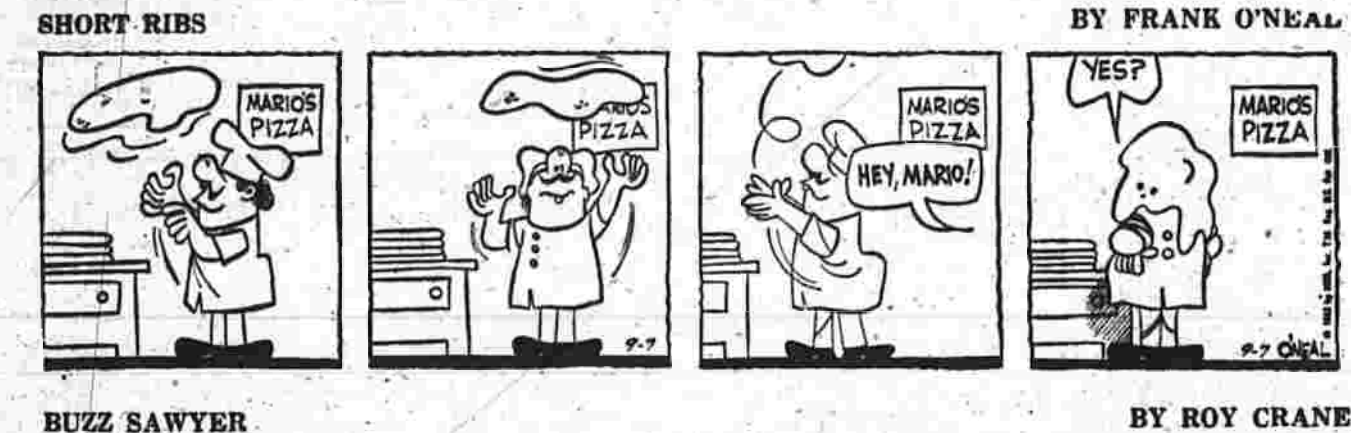
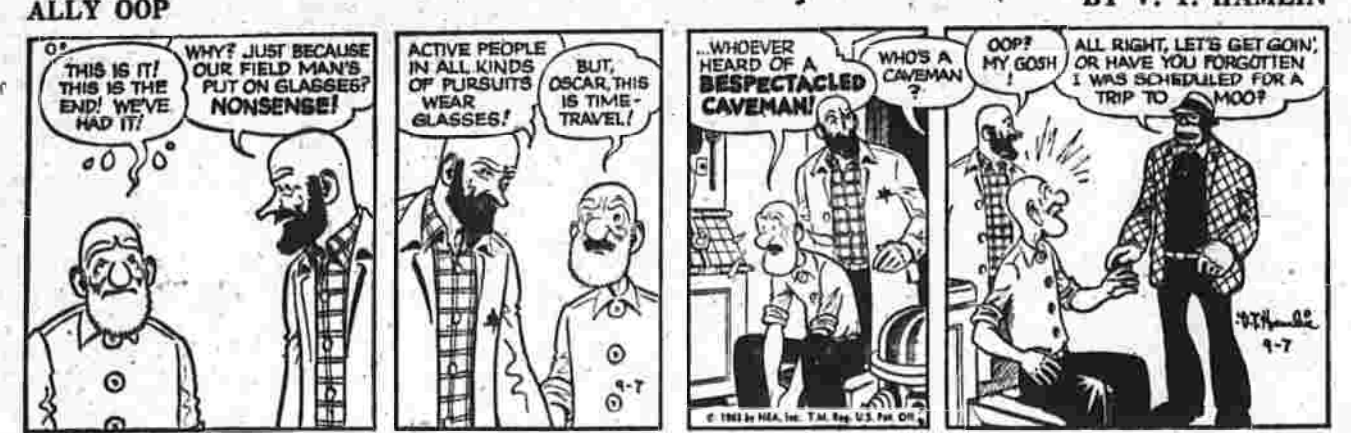
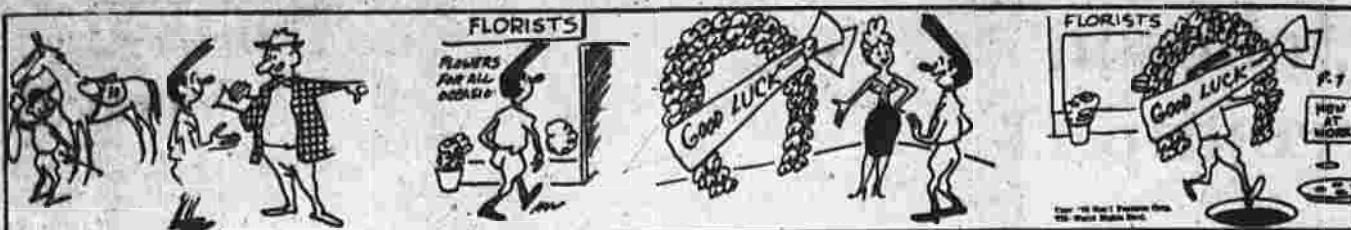

French Girls Sail for Home After Five Weeks in Area

A contingent of 22 French girls who have been living and studying in the Hartford area for the past five weeks left yesterday for the long voyage home to their native France.

The 22 girls of the Organisation Scolaire Franco-Americaine, guided by their tour director, Prof. Pierre Maurey, have been living with Hartford area families since Aug. 1, studying, playing, and working under a unique cultural program.

Sponsored locally by the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women, most of the girls were guests of families in the West Hartford and Hartford areas.

Two of the girls, however, had been staying with local families. They are Dominique Alleaume, 21, of Paris, who lived with Mr. and Mrs. Ernesto Garaventa, 199 N. Lakewood Circle; and Marie Lamoureux, 18, of La Boule, who was the guest of Dr. and Mrs. William L. Conlon, 102 S. Lakewood Circle.

Major objectives of the girls' stay were to better acquaint them with American culture and, of course, to improve their skills in speaking English.

Consequently, each girl was placed in the home of a different family, where she could live as a member of the family group, and where she would be forced to communicate mainly in English.

In addition, all the girls attended classes daily from 9 to 11 a.m. at St. Joseph's College in West Hartford, where they studied English grammar, composition and literature.

Because each is quite fluent in the language, the girls were able to sample Poe, Mark Twain, Stephen Crane's "The Red Badge of Courage," and even Shakespeare.

Integrated into their studies were numerous field trips and excursions designed to add to their appreciation of the literature; for example, a trip to Mark Twain's home, tours of the Wadsworth Atheneum, and historic Old West Hartford, and attendance at the Stratford production of "The Comedy of Errors."

A visit to the State Capitol, a carillon concert at Trinity College, and tours to Mystic Seaport, Yale University and the Berkshire Music Festival were also on the girls' agenda.

But all was not "work" or cultural in nature, and the group had ample time to relax and socialize at swimming parties, cookouts, and the like, sponsored by various Catholic women's groups; and to engage in sports and leisure-time activities.

Marie Lamoureux, who stayed with the Conlons, was typical of the girls in the group, who ranged in age from 16 to 22. Dark and vivacious, Marie savored every new experience of her visit, according to Mrs. Conlon, "never tiring for a moment all day long."

Two which particularly impressed her, Marie said, were a visit to New York before coming to Manchester, and a drive by auto to Saratoga, N. Y., with the Conlons.

"On the drive, we saw such quaint old towns, and the houses and lawns here are so much more open and spacious than at home," Marie said.

She explained that her home is in La Boule, a seacoast town of 20,000 in the province of Brittany, and there the land is barren and rocky, and the houses are smaller and built mostly of stone.

At home, Marie is attending the French equivalent of the first year of college, and next year hopes to go on to a four-year university to major in languages. Among the 10 major subjects she carries are three languages, including English, which she has studied for six years. After the university, she hopes to find work in the field of public relations.

Had the stay here increased her fluency in English? "Very definitely," she said. "When we went to the Comedy of Errors, I could understand very well, in spite of the language barrier."

Although the tour group, the Organisation Scolaire Franco-Americaine, has been making summer tours to Great Britain for many years, this is the first time it has come to America.

Prof. Maurey, who made arrangements for the stay through the Archdiocesan Council, decided to bring the group to this area because of its natural beauty, the availability of cultural facilities, and the enthusiasm of people in the area for the program, Mrs. Conlon said.

Summing up the success of the stay here, Mrs. Angela Kenney, public chairman for the Archdiocesan Council, termed the program an unqualified success.

"Not only did the girls increase their understanding of English and America," she said, "but all of us learned a great deal from them."

"When they left yesterday were in tears," she added. "We felt as though we were losing members of our own families."

Although plans are not firm as yet, the success of the stay indicates that the Organisation Scolaire Franco-Americaine will return for another visit next summer, Mrs. Kenney said.

Police Make 286 Arrests in Month

A total of 286 arrests, summons or notices were reported in the Manchester Police Department Consolidated Daily Report for the month of August.

When is a star, and what goes into the creation thereof? Well in the theater, you've made it when they put your name above the title of the show . . . and in television, you've got it made when your name is the title of the show. Lovely little Patty Duke's now got it made all around. She holds the honor of being both the youngest actress ever starred on Broadway (as Helen Keller in "The Miracle Worker" to Anne Bancroft's Annie Sullivan). John's wife Ethel has added notably, too. It was she who quick-coached Patty for an "old soft shoe with Ed Wynn" which was much acclaimed a few seasons back. But aside from that, ex-dancer Ethel
