WASHINGTON (AP)—A congressional subcommittee today accused the State Department of "hiding the facts from the American public" by restricting newsmen in South Viet Nam.

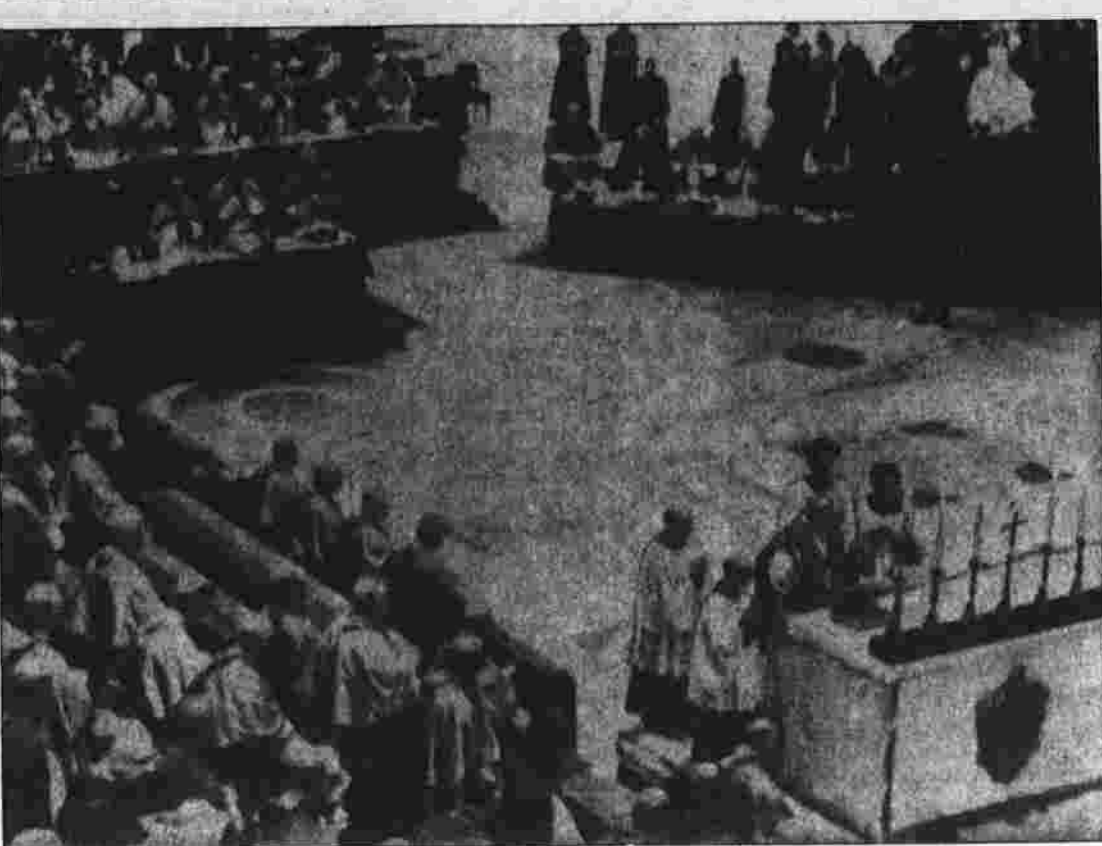

**The "Single City"**

Yesterday, reopening the Ecumenical Council originally called by the great predecessor Pope Paul VI demonstrated two of the wise and beautiful uses of great power and prestige.

The first thing that must have made his hearers yesterday, and his readers today, catch their breath and become aware of an expression of unusual significance was a display of humility and modesty. For the man in the post of Pope and even for the institution of the Church itself.

This phase of "Pope Paul's unusual depositary of the principles and the grace of power came as he was addressing himself to those non-Catholic Christian observers who were present for the occasion. He referred to the "deep sadness we feel at their prolonged separation."

Then he said the following:

"It was in any way to blame that separation, we humbly beg God's forgiveness and ask pardon, too, of our brethren who feel themselves to have been injured by us."

From that adding of pardon which he displayed humility striking and unusual in even the head of a great religious organization. Pope Paul went on, later in his address, to one of the most moving exhortations of our time. When he spoke of the power and prestige of his post and of his Church were being employed, this time in a powerful message of hope and incentive and encouragement to all the possibilities of good in this particular age of our world.

"The courage, rulers of nations," said Pope Paul in this memorable passage, "today you can give to your people many good things necessary for their life, bread, education, work, order, the dignity of free and peaceful citizens, provided only you truly know who man is and only Christian wisdom can show you this in its true light. Working together in justice and love, you can create peace, that greatest good which is so longed for and which the church defends and promotes so greatly, and you can make of humanity a single city. God be with you."

Two of the phrases in this exhortation have the ring of some familiar and yet very hopeful significance for our time. When we truly know who man is, and this is really the quest which absorbs us all in so many fields, in our relationships among ourselves, in our relationships with other nations and other peoples—when we truly know who man is, we shall not be able to reach the conclusion, and the mandate of all philosophy and all civilization—that there must be "of humanity a single city."
