NEW YORK (AP)—No one is quite sober in Manhattan in October. Everyone drinks the wine of every possibility.

Anything can happen: everything does.

New York City advertises herself as a summer festival, but she is even more of a fall fiesta.

Her festive children troop back from their summer hideaways, moonlight-crowned and full of tales of country adventure. But they really don't start living again until they cross the Bronx line, or enter the Lincoln Tunnel and leave New Jersey behind. Any time spent anywhere but here doesn't count—it's a period in a cocoon.

Now in October the moonlight time is over, and Manhattan again becomes a stren city, the American equivalent of the Riviera.

The word is "big." Everybody has big plans, big dreams, big hopes—the big angle. Every taxi, every train, every plane is loaded with big-eyed or star-eyed hopefuls who come here to seek the big chance, to beat the big city down to their size.

A crowd which sweeps away the heat and blows the dirt from new skyscraper lanes into your eyes. The subways are packed again with human surfboards.

The season of safety is over for the pedestrian. He must hop to it now to make it from sidewalk to sidewalk. A bus lane of gasoline fumes flows from traffic-choked streets. Truck drivers and cabmen curse each other with belated gentleness for who can harbor hate in October?

The hammering of new buildings going up and old buildings coming down echoes all day. Crews of workmen seem to rip up every pavement as they lay new utility lines or repair deep potholes.

"What are they all doing?" asks a curious stranger.

"The mayor's just digging for gold," replies a bus driver.

Old in Flushing Meadows, Bob Moses and his merry elves are clothing the skeleton of the giant World's Fair in a mad race against time to get the biggest show in history ready by next April. Will they do it? "Fess-up!" one Bob tells another.

Flying footballs replace the thump of baseballs in gloves on city playgrounds. The boys outside the Central Park Zoo get fever handouts, and the polar bears gambol gaily in their chilly pool. Old ladies wait for sunny afternoons to lean plump arms on pillars in cemented windows and stare down with timeless curiosity on the antics of mankind.

Everybody walks a little quicker to match the faster rhythm that pulses through the town. Got to get a move on if they're going to close that big deal and earn enough money for a big Christmas.

A fresh glitter comes to tawdry Broadway. Old shows close. New ones open—and some close. But in Tin Pan Alley the placid go on thinking forever.

On Fifth Avenue, the fabulous store windows drip with lux and jewels. Along the Bowery, hums silver and wonder where they'll get an overcoat. In expensive restaurants the get and get the way to the vodka martini.

A night's tawny moon glides Wall Street's business temples with enchantment, and shimmer on the Hudson and East Rivers, and makes the small sturdy tags look like little water bugs carrying lanterns in search of something lost in the dark.

"Cocktails between 5 and 7 p.m.," say ten thousand invitees, as the new season gets into full swing.

But life itself is just one big cocktail party in the big town on the Hudson.

From the Park Avenue mansions to Greenwich Village, the town has a feeling of constant celebration. For no one is quite sober in Manhattan in October.

The Doctor Says

RH FACTOR CAN CONDITION BABY'S ARRIVAL IN WORLD

One of the greatest hazards to the newborn is a result of Rh incompatibility. If your blood is Rh-positive you are one of the 85 per cent with this type of blood. The rest have Rh-negative blood. This grouping has nothing to do with the A-B-O groups which must be determined before a transfusion. Rh-positive may give birth to babies who have erythroblastosis, a blood-destroying disease that caused any deaths before the cause was discovered.

A woman with Rh - negative blood may become sensitized to Rh-positive blood through having had a transfusion with Rh-positive blood or through carrying a baby whose blood is Rh-positive like the father's.

A woman who becomes sensitized during pregnancy but who has not had a baby with erythroblastosis has a good chance of having a baby that is normal. Or it may have a blood disease, which is mild and can be easily controlled with a few small transfusions of Rh-negative blood.

But once the mother is sensitized, the danger to the infant becomes greater with each succeeding pregnancy.

The erythroblastic baby may appear to be normal at birth, but becomes jaundiced within a few hours. The jaundice increases rapidly and may occur at the pallor that would go with the infant's anemia.

This anemia is due to the fact that the sensitized mother has developed antibodies that destroy the baby's Rh-positive blood cells. These antibodies are transferred to the baby through the placenta and umbilical cord.

In severe cases the baby can be saved if the possibility of the disease is recognized in advance and arrangements are made to give the baby an exchange transfusion.

This is a massive transfusion that replaces all of the baby's Rh-positive blood with blood from an Rh-negative donor of the same A-B-O group. Since the mother's antibodies are destructive only to Rh-positive cells the transfused Rh-negative blood is not affected and the baby survives.

When an Rh incompatibility is suspected, another procedure is also used to improve the baby's condition. Oddly enough, this is the induction of labor 14 to 20 days ahead of the expected date of delivery. This is because the transfer of destructive antibodies to the infant's blood occurs at an ever-accelerating rate in the last weeks of pregnancy.

Although it is pointed out in a previous column, the development of the baby in the uterus to full term has many advantages. This is one instance in which early induction of labor is the lesser of two evils.

The highest recorded tide in the world are in the Bay of Fundy, Nova Scotia, where they have been known to reach 60 feet. In the heart of Granville on France's Normandy coast, the tide rises and falls as much as 100 feet.

The highest tide in waters adjoining the United States proper occur near Calais, Maine, where water levels change by 22 1/2 feet. As a rule, tides that open directly into the sea and have narrow channels have the highest tides. In the open ocean, the greatest difference between high and low tide normally is only a foot or two.

World News Open Forum In Brief

MONTECARLO (AP)—A federal mediator is meeting today with shipping officials and longshoremen to try to avert a strike that could tie up three major ports on the St. Lawrence Seaway.

Judge Rene Lippe called the meeting after conferring Wednesday with Paul Asselin, president of the Montreal longshoremen's local, the 2,800 employees of Montreal, Quebec City and Trois-Rivières have threatened to strike Friday if their demands for a package increase of 22 cents an hour over a two-year period are not met.

Three thousand longshoremen in Halifax, N.S., and Saint John, N.B., may join the strike.

A strike would hamper the shipment of 40 million bushels of wheat to the Soviet Union, part of a \$500-million purchase made from Canada last month.

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP)—Ex-President Juan Bosch says he will not run for reelection in 1968. He has threatened to strike his administration against Communism in the Dominican Republic stemmed from fear of triggering Batista-type terrorism.

Bosch, deposed in a bloodless coup last week by military officers, was referring to the strong arm tactics employed by former dictator Fulgencio Batista.

Cuba, the military leaders said they ousted Bosch because he was leading his country into the arms of the Communists.

Bosch told a news conference Wednesday that many Roman Catholic priests helped instigate the coup. He said it was a Catholic priest who first accused him of being a Communist.

CHRISTCHURCH, New Zealand (AP)—Present prospects of commercial flights over the South Pole have been overestimated, an American official who blames the route from South Africa to New Zealand said today.

"I don't look for great loads of aircraft taking off from Cape Town for Australia and New Zealand," Rear Adm. James H. Bledy, commander of the U.S. Navy Antarctic Support Force, said on his arrival from McMurdo Sound, the American Antarctic base.

Before taking off Tuesday on the first trans-Antarctic flight from Cape Town, Bledy had predicted eventual establishment of a commercial airport in Antarctica.

Ready said the Navy has no plans to fly the polar route again, leaving from Washington to the Antarctic base via Cape Town each five hours longer than the flight across the Pacific via New Zealand, he said.

South Windsor Paine Gives View Of Town's Issues

In a recent statement, Gaylord Paine, retiring Republican councilman, offers a view on the town's issues, industrial expansion and our very form of government as basic major issues in the coming election.

(1) **Soning:** The Republicans and the Mayor have expressly favored steps to temporarily curtail residential building through proper zoning and planning changes. (3) **Experienced personnel:** The Republican candidates and the independent candidates for council offer a wealth of experience in recent government. The Democratic candidates offer no council incumbents and only two with recent board experience — one of whom was the man the present council refused to meet as a zoning board member.

(4) **Obstructionism of automatic losses by the Democratic organization:** ... never openly favored the conditional manager form of government ... refused to urge adoption of our charter ... refuses to follow charter provisions in the nomination of board of education candidates ... blocked the council for nearly a year from completing its appointments to the zoning board because of its insistence upon seating a man who later, after half the Democratic councilmen refused to seat ... planning and zoning policies despite obviously changing problems ... its chairman opposed the establishment of a police force claiming it unnecessary.

In conclusion, Paine hopes that the electorate will recognize that it has a choice — not between parties but between individuals who represent greatly conflicting viewpoints. He claims as "essential" the election of the Republican candidates and Mayor John Madole to the council, and also backs the candidacy of writer-candidate for the board of education Christian Woodruff.

Mrs. Jean Romney, Republican candidate for re-election to the Board of Education, has issued a statement regarding her views on current local educational problems and goals.

She notes that the school enrollment has more than doubled in the past five years, "forcing the Board of Education to spend much of its time on the endless problems connected with the rapid growth of the town. ... the board has tried to improve the quality of our schools by hiring additional administrative personnel; improving and expanding ... recruitment program; revising curriculum; beginning a new pay plan for teachers which rewards outstanding performance."

Mrs. Romney expresses a particular interest in a planned program of public information: "such as expansion of our Board of Education newsletter 'Notes and Quotes'; regular community informational meetings ... increased newspaper coverage of school news; use of citizens committees to work with the board on certain specific problems, and regular evaluation of our progress through community questionnaires and/or other means."

She also feels that a "major topic ... is the proposed accreditation of public schools by the Connecticut State Department of Education. South Windsor is not one of the 22 school systems in the state being used as a test-town for this plan; however, 'our administration is planning a self-evaluation of our local system based on the tentative standards ... we would fall short of accreditation in several areas.' Including: insufficient number of personnel particularly in special fields such as social workers; lack of home economics and industrial arts in grades 7 and 8; school year of less than 185 days."

Monetary Deficits Not Peculiar to U.S.

Editor's Note—The U.S. balance of payments deficit is unique in that it is the only one of its kind in the world. But Sam Dawson, AP business news analyst, in this third of five articles on the problem, says that other nations can get into the same trouble, and have.

Underdeveloped countries usually are dependent on loans and grants from others to balance their payments with the rest of the world. This is especially true of those with big ambitions—the ones who want to grow industrially at jet speed. Aiding them has helped push the United States further into the red.

Industrial countries like Britain have periodic payment problems when their exports slump or consumer taste for imports gets too rich. France, West Germany and other European countries went through rough years after the war. West Germany built up her present affluence by assisting France to help it out of its inflationary straits that caused the franc to lose its value.

But in the United States exports go right along topping imports. Another classic form of deficit is in a one-commodity nation—where the country exports one commodity, rubber or sugar—when demand slumps abroad. The country hasn't the wherewithal to pay for the imports of manufactured goods and food stuffs it needs.

Bad internal financing practices have caused many a balance of payments deficit. Brazil is being accused of that today because it dumped its holdings of the local currency, the cruzeiro, when the American and other financial authorities worry about it.

Today the Yankee dollar, for all its problems, isn't shunned. It does buy as much in goods and services as it once did. But most foreigners are willing to hold onto most of the dollars they get up to a point. And it's that point American and other financial authorities worry about.

That could upset the arrangement under which much of the world's trade and financial dealings operate. Or it could lead to devaluation of the dollar. And that would upset the apple cart both at home and abroad.
