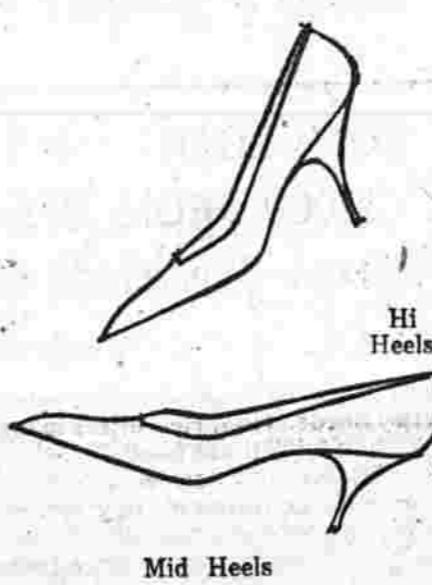

Daily Jobs For Inmates Works Well

 BALTIMORE (AP)—An advertising salesman clears his desk at the end of the day. South of town, a construction worker borrows his employer's pickup truck for a family drive. A laborer in a nearby quarry telephones to say he will be late for work. They are participating in Maryland's new work release program for prisoners.

There are 19 prisoners—16 men and 3 women—taking part. They include a truck driver, farm hand, kitchen worker, laundry worker, nurse's aide, electrician, construction worker and mechanic.

James W. Curran, commissioner of the Maryland Department of Correction, says the success of the participants often are misleading. "They are only labels," says Curran. "Most of the time there are extenuating circumstances."

The program began under a law introduced by Democratic State Sen. Edward O. West Jr., and passed this year by the general assembly. The first participants arrived on the job July 2.

Only North Carolina has a similar statewide program in effect since 1967, although Wisconsin authorizes local jails to operate their own work release program.

About 2,000 of Maryland's 5,160 prisoners are trustees and work each day, winter months included, outside the prison. But they wear prison uniforms and are under supervision and guard.

It's a different story for the work release prisoners. They leave the prison without supervision and wear their own clothes. Some work for the job. The 2d man, for instance, changes into a suit. Some walk to work. Others ride public buses. Sometimes the employer provides transportation.

"Our ultimate goal," says acting director Frederick E. Terriotti, "is to get the prisoner reabsorbed into the community." He says the work release program "teaches the prisoners to accept and learn obligations."

To be eligible, the prisoner can be serving a term of no longer than five years. Curran estimates that 80 per cent of the 4,000 prisoners committed each year fall into this category.

VIETNAMESE LOSE (AP)—The Laotian National Assembly elected Premier Souvanna Phouma's extraordinary powers for another year in a brief session today.

Under the special powers first granted to Souvanna Oct. 7, 1962 he is permitted to rule by decree.

Some assemblymen contended that Souvanna should report back to the assembly before it granted the extension. However, a vote of 27-9 approved the extension on condition that Souvanna report back to the assembly on his return from a tour of Europe.

OTTAWA (AP)—Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson's minority Liberal government survived two more votes of no-confidence Tuesday night.

It was a small revolt in the House of Commons over farm policies in Eastern Canada, such as dairy subsidies and the use of fertilizer, and posed no real threat to the government.

The first motion, introduced by the Conservatives, was defeated 134-66, with the help of the Social Credit and New Democrat parties.

The second motion, introduced by the Social Credit party and supported by the New Democrats, was turned down 206-22.

The Conservatives and the Quebec faction of Social Credit voted with Pearson's Liberals.

The tests were the fifth and sixth the Liberal has won since taking over the government last April.

PARIS (AP)—A French government spokesman says President Charles de Gaulle is giving serious thought to a trip to the United States to see President Kennedy.

Information Minister Alain Perrotin said after a cabinet meeting Tuesday that De Gaulle thought he should return to the U.S. President's visit to Paris in May 1961. He said no date has been set.

SOUTHALL, England (AP)—The British government will never agree to segregated schools, Education Minister Sir Edward Boyle said Tuesday night.

He told a mixed audience of English, Jamaican, Indian and Pakistani parents that he understood their anxieties but could not meet demands for segregated schools.

Southall, a town of 45,000 in Middlesex County, has about 5,000 colored workers, mainly Indians and Pakistanis.

Colored children outnumber whites three to two in the lowest grades, and white parents claim standards are being lowered because many of them come from illiterate families.

They also claim property prices are falling as a result of the influx of colored people.
