By A. J. CHEMARI Gov. John N. Dempsey will be asked to take immediate action in the racial controversy at Andover Lake. The request comes in the wake of the refusal yesterday of the Andover Lake Property Owners' Association (ALPOA) to relax its membership policies, and its adoption, in the face of statewide criticism, of even stricter regulations.

The Rev. William Philpot, a Negro who has been turned down three times in his attempts to join the private lake association, has asked for a special meeting with the Governor and the state's attorney general in hopes of reaching "an immediate resolution" to the controversy.

The Negro minister said he hoped to meet with the two state officials early next week. "The action taken yesterday," he said, "proves that the basis of the organization is bias. It also shows that much more than a public appeal is necessary to guarantee the rights of property owners living there."

The Rev. Mr. Philpot has owned lake property for over eight years but cannot use the lake or its facilities until he is a member of ALPOA. He said legal action might be forthcoming if the state could not resolve the controversy.

At a heated meeting yesterday, ALPOA members turned down, by a vote of 100 to 31, proposals that would make membership automatic for lake property owners. Approval of two-thirds of the voting members is presently required.

**Rockville-Vernon PUC Agents View Sites to Relocate RR**

The fate of Rockville's redevelopment program rests in the hands of two Public Utilities Commission representatives who began an inspection today of the New Haven Railroad property in the heart of the redevelopment area.

Elmer C. Nissen, chief engineer, and Kenneth D. Faust, senior civil engineer, of the PUC arrived in the city at 11 a. m. to look over the area of less than three acres on which a purchase price of \$82,500 has been placed.

The price, approved by the city, the federal government and the railroad, is a little over \$400,000 as well as the cost of the market and Brooklyn Sts. The property is presently assessed for \$8,250.

Seventeen local officials, including businessmen and railroad representatives accompanied the PUC engineers on their inspection.

The investigation was ordered last Wednesday by PUC Chairman Eugene S. Loughlin, who presided at a hearing on the proposed sale of the railroad land to the redevelopment authority.

Without objection of the PUC, the \$2 million redevelopment project will displace the railroad tracks, since the federal government will not support the program if New Haven land is not available.

The investigators will inspect two parcels of land in the heart of the redevelopment area, a proposed freight station site and a proposed site for a new railroad building on West St. The two parcels are located on the east side of the railroad tracks, near the intersection of West St. and the railroad tracks.

# Hospital Is Still Growing Largest Cut of UF Goes to Hospital

When a group of town officials met in 1918 to decide on a proper memorial for those from Manchester who had died in service during the "Great War," a suggestion by C. E. Moore Watkins that a hospital should be built found a receptive audience.

Manchester depended on hospitals in Hartford, but as the town's population grew, it became clear that Manchester needed its own hospital.

A building committee was appointed in 1918 and a public campaign resulted in pledges totaling \$185,000. This was \$45,000 more than was needed to build the planned 50-bed hospital and indicated the enthusiasm that met the idea.

The hospital was incorporated on March 12, 1919. It was named president; Horace Cheney vice president; Walter Taylor, secretary; and the Manchester Trust Co., treasurer.

A six-acre tract on Hayes street was purchased in 1919. The cornerstone was laid the following August. The hospital was completed in June of 1920 at a cost of \$53 million. The chairman of the building committee, as in the previous expansion, was the late Raymond V. Gosse.

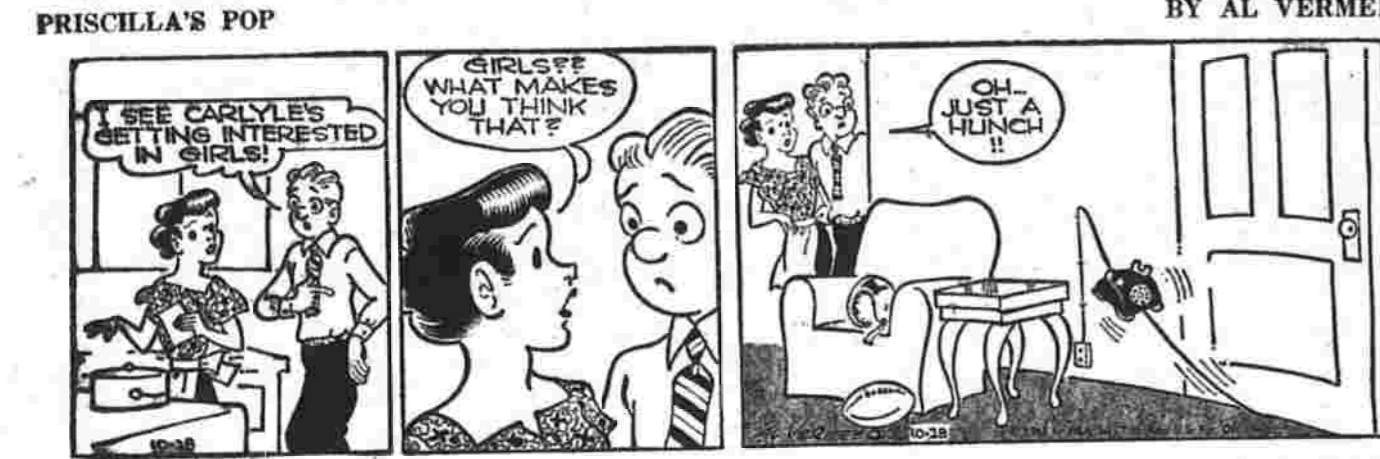
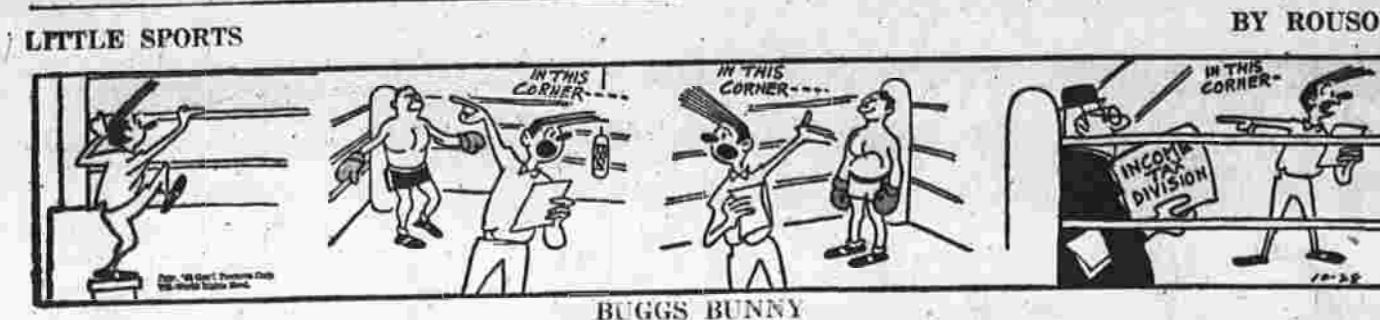

Housing Project Rises Fast

Progress on the state-sponsored portion of Rockville housing for the elderly is moving along at a fast clip, according to Francis J. Pitkat, executive director of the Rockville Housing Authority. The 40-unit project is slated for completion in June. Pitkat said today that partial occupancy may be accomplished earlier.

State units will be heated by radiant electric heat. Pitkat said that testimonials have been received by the state from residents of other projects stating that this type of heating provides relief from many of the painful afflictions of the elderly.

Men 60-years old and women 49-years old are eligible to apply. Income of applicants must not be over \$1,724 annually for individuals or over \$4,068 for couples. Pitkat said he would welcome the opportunity to discuss eligibility requirements and answer questions regarding applications.

The state project, presently under construction, will have a number television antennas system leading to each apartment. For added safety, each apartment will be separated by firewalls from other units.

Plans for the second project have already started. Bids will be opened Oct. 31 at City Hall at 2 p.m. Construction of the federal government, is expected to begin shortly thereafter. The federal project will be located near the state - financed project.

The federal project will include a community building to house the manager's office, an activities room, a boiler room for a central oil heating plant to heat all units, and a maintenance shop.

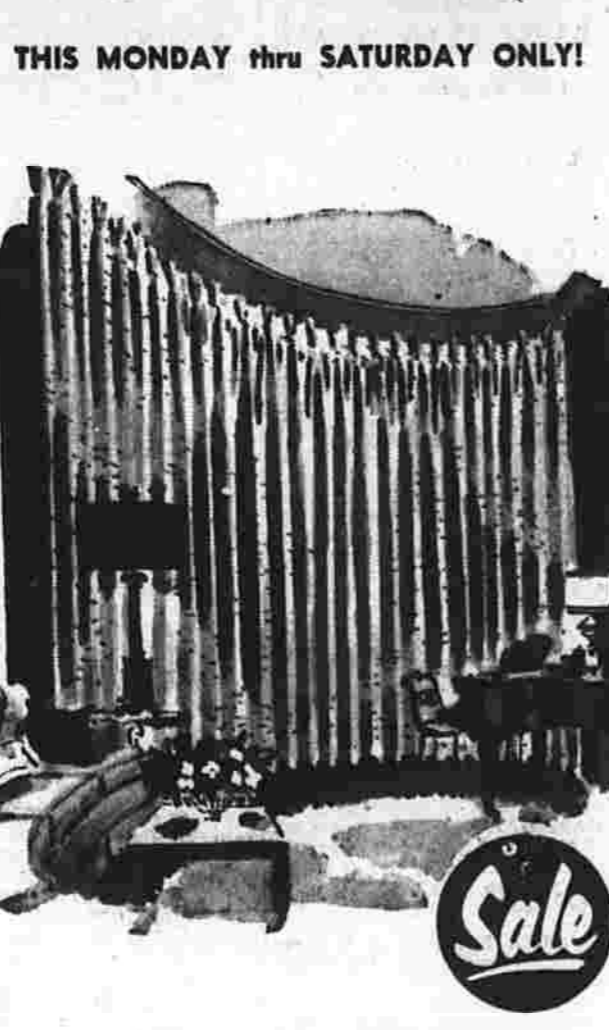
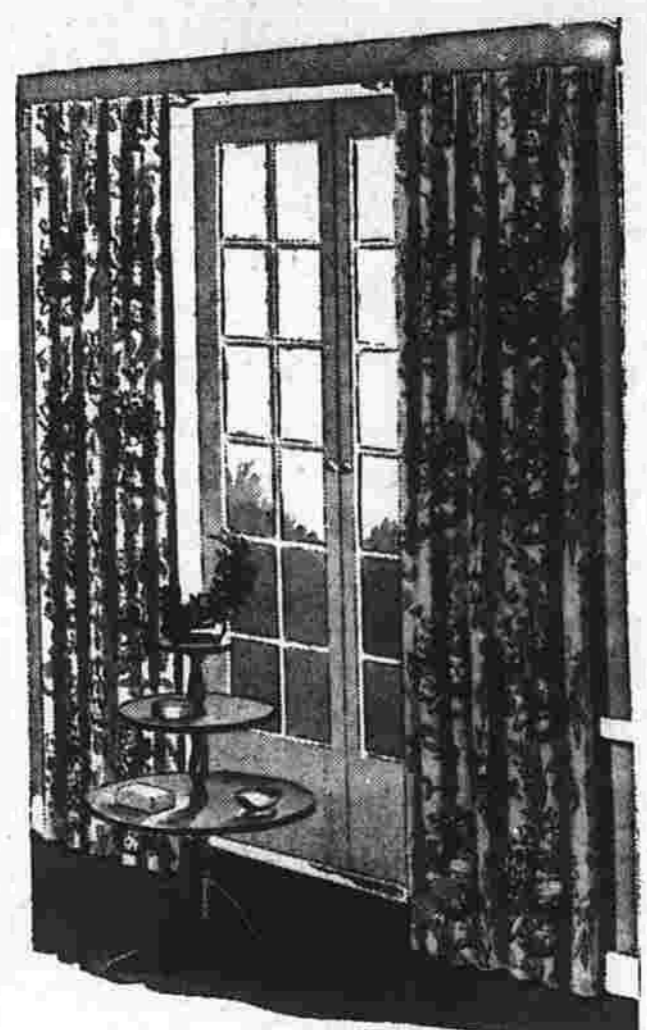

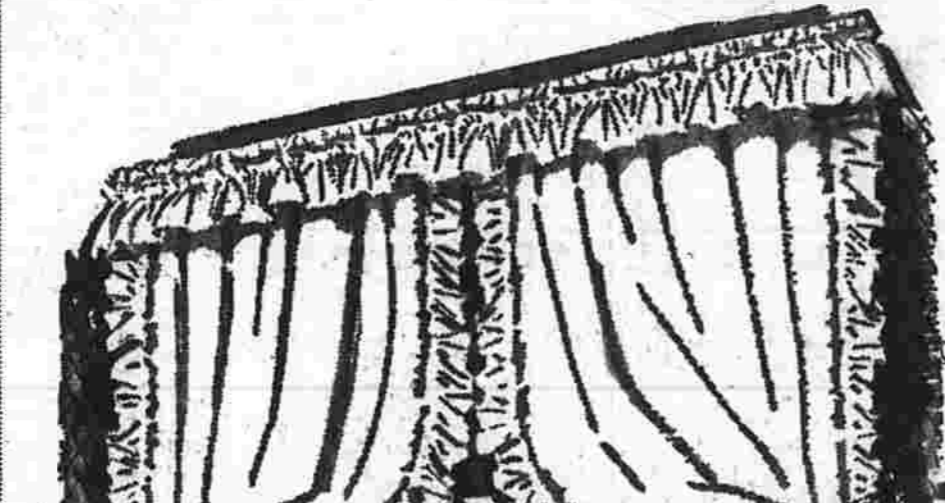
