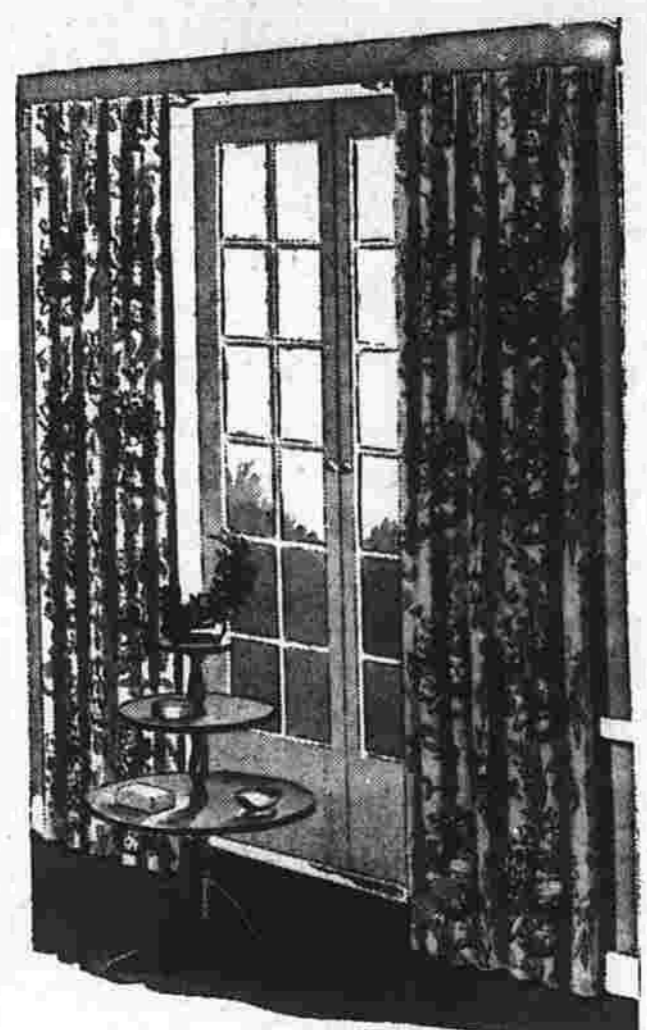

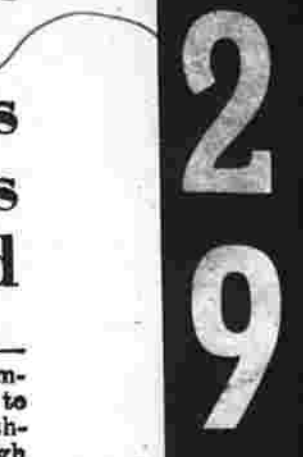

King, Algerian Meet, Cease-Fire Top Hope

of an "imperialist" attempt to smash Algerian socialism.

To strengthen the Moroccan position at the talks, Hassan's government said its troops were eight miles from "Tindouf," well within the territory claimed by Algeria.

The Moroccan king told his nation by radio Monday night that he would press for adjustment of the frontier, most of which has never been formally marked out. It was doubtful that Ben Bella would concede much to the Moroccan claim to the "Tindouf" area.

A deep ideological rift remains between the two nations. Ben Bella's regime, committed to a socialist program, has no sympathy for the traditionalist Moroccan monarchy. The Communist bloc has accused Morocco of firing in the watershed area.

TPC Delays Charter Talk

The Town Planning Commission (TPC), meeting last night, delayed a scheduled discussion of a proposed charter change which would devolve the TPC of its planning director, and establish instead a separate planning department.

The proposed change will be discussed with the Charter Revision Commission at a future meeting.

The same subcommittee, "Executive Powers," also recommended a change which would give the general manager of executive powers, whether now appointed or elected, and place them in the hands of the mayor or board.

The general manager, now appointed by the mayor, is to be elected by the board of directors. This is a change from the present practice of electing the general manager by the board of directors.

Changes Would Cut Powers of Manager

A subcommittee of the Charter Revision Commission last night recommended that the board of directors be empowered to review the work of the general manager every five years, and, by a majority vote of the full membership, "summarily remove him from office."

The towns charter now permits the appointment of the general manager for an indefinite term, and provides for a long, involved method of removal for improper performance of his duties.

Members suggested that the functions of the library board be exempted from the jurisdiction of the proposed department of public works, as is the case of education.
