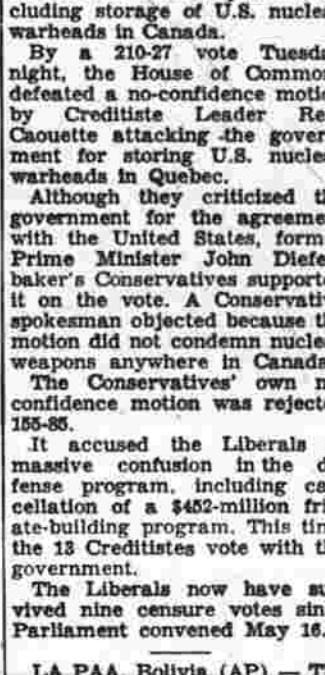

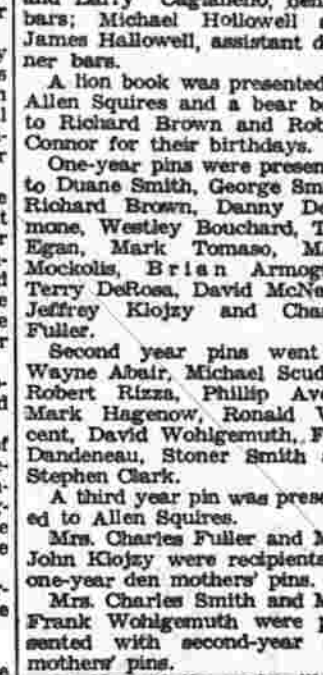

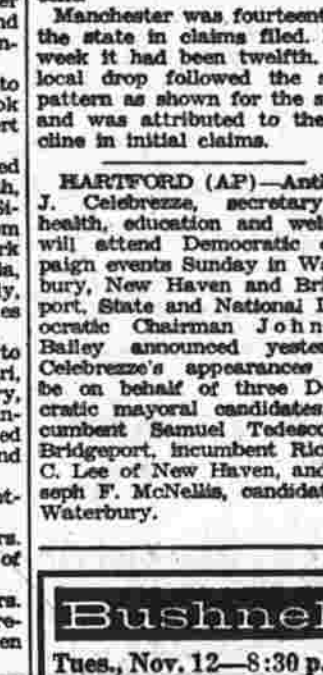

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Henry Gonzalez is ready to fight, either "Marquis of Queensberry rules or alley fight rules." But his intended opponent, Rep. Ed Foreman, says, "As far as I'm concerned, it's over with."

So no rematch of Tuesday's one-punch fight just off the floor of the House of Representatives is in prospect.

Foreman said, "I didn't call Gonzalez a punk or a Communist. What I did say was that his ultra-liberal left-wing voting record was a disgrace to the Constitution of the United States and furthered the Socialist-Communist cause."

Gonzales took umbrage at a news story that quoted Foreman as calling him a punk, and confronted the fellow Texan yesterday on the House floor.

It's still like to have it out with him man to man, but he's a 300-lb. Spanish for a yellow-livered stayer," Gonzalez said.

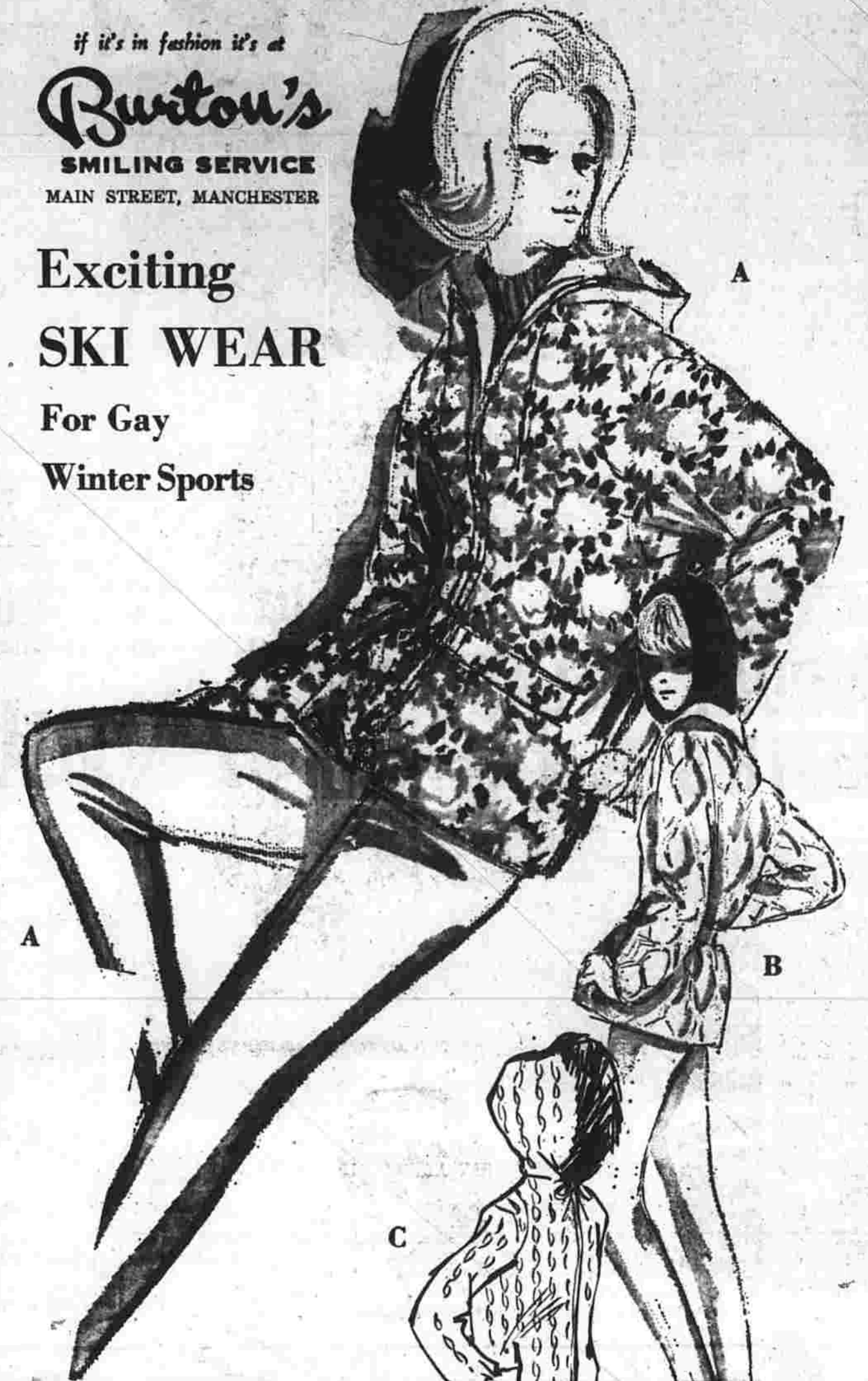

Most Predict Spring Gain In Business

By SAM DAWSON AP Business News Analyst NEW YORK (AP)—Increasingly good business in the next two months—a seasonal hesitancy perhaps in the first couple of months of 1964—and then a moderate but quite healthy gain in the spring.

That's the pleasant expectation of the majority of industrial executives and their economists now being proffered to Americans in a steady flow of predictions. Minorities on both sides of the average offer their variations.

Some see a strong advance assured for all of 1964. A few others think the present upswing in the economy is in its final months, with or without a federal tax cut.

But autumn's flow of increasing corporate earnings, many evidenced by higher profit margins on sales, and the happy excitement in the stock market with each piece of good news, strengthens the expectation of the majority of business executives that good times are likely to get better before their pocket-out.

And the majority discounts all indications that the turn-about already may be gestating. Corporate profits and stock prices capture the headlines. But they are only two of the indicators that corporate economists consider favorable.

The factory work week has lengthened, reflecting both the increased business confidence and now doing and their expectations of still more sales to come. Housing starts have increased, assuring happy days in the construction industry in the summer and also bespeaking the confidence of the general public that good times will continue.

That good times in general—with some regional and industrial exceptions—are with us today is attested by most of the important business statistics. Personal incomes continue to rise, as do consumer spending and retail sales hit a record in the summer and seem sure to better the mark in the final months of the year. Auto sales are booming, and that always reassures the public.

Industrial production has climbed higher fairly steadily. Current demand and new orders in some industries have been so good that companies are beginning to consider advancing their prices and make it stick.

All of this has raised the grand-daddy of the statistics, the Gross National Product, to a record high, well above what had been expected for the end of the year. This dollar total of all goods and services produced is set at an annual rate of \$68.2 billion in the third quarter, a hefty \$2.5 billion gain over the April-June quarter. A further rise in the final months of the year seems all but in the bag.

So why does the small minority of economists fret? For one thing, the current business upswing is 27 months old, against an average of 27 months for this phase of business cycle. The worriers caution that all that goes up must come down, and they had a federal tax cut, if any, may come too late to cushion the downturn, but merely cushion it a bit.

For another, the economy's two chief weaknesses—the hard core of unemployment and the deficit in international balance of payments—may be a bit still are fundamentally unsolved.

But until the current news turns sour, whenever that may be, the majority of business and consumer, too, are unlikely to see anything ahead but a continuation of today's good times.

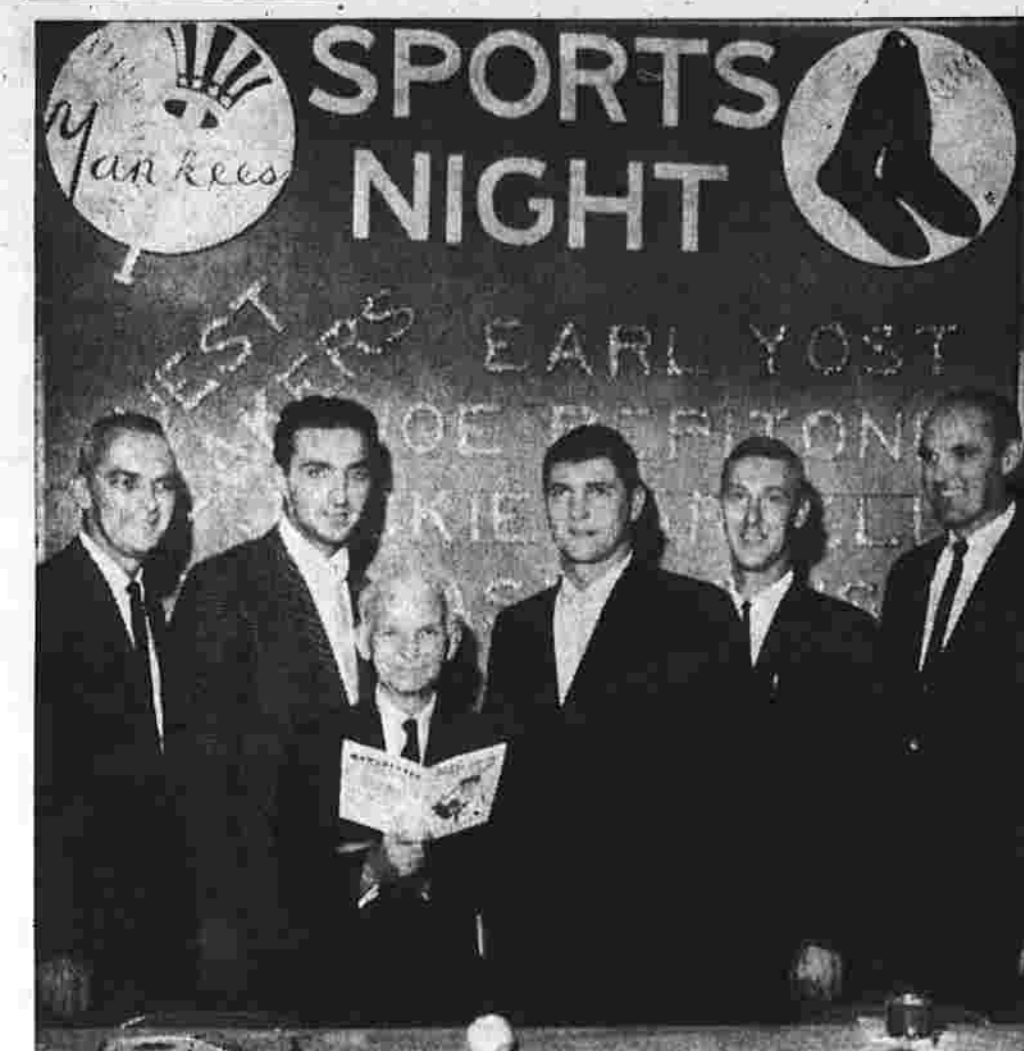
