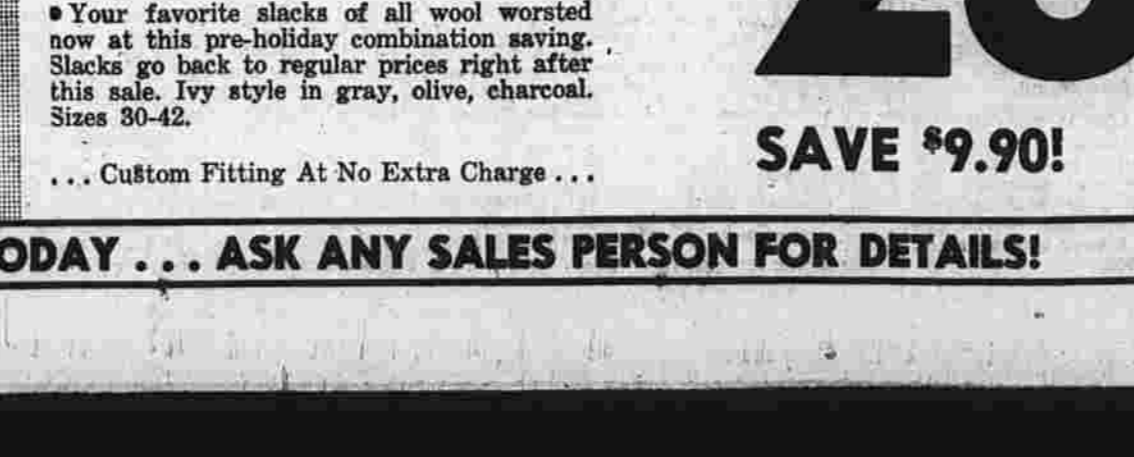
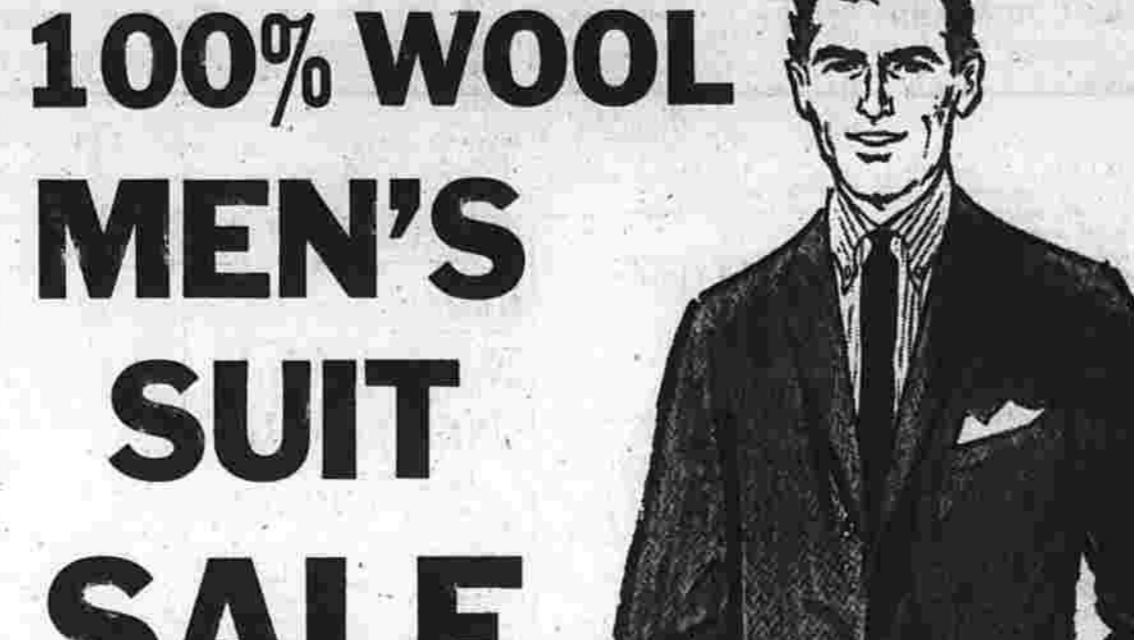

Race Crucial For GOP in Mississippi

By JAMES BAGGIE JACKSON, Miss. (AP)—Mississippi will settle its hectic race for governor next Tuesday in an election that may determine the future of the Republican party in this Deep South state.

Most estimates are that 200,000 to 300,000 voters will go to the polls. Phillips, who switched parties after once being public school commissioner, is generally considered to have between 100,000 and 125,000 votes.

Observers say a victory, or narrow showing, by Phillips could lead to high-financed GOP contests in future Mississippi elections.

Meredith away from the state after Meredith was arrested for protesting against the state's segregationist administration to permit both sides to have face-to-face negotiations...

Democrats have expressed confidence they will win a 60-to-40 vote margin, and some concede privately they are concerned about getting enough voters out in an election with almost no local issues.

Johnson will be making his fourth bid for the office. He lost twice in past Democratic runoff elections before winning the nomination in the August primary against former Gov. J. P. Coleman.

The election took on another unusual note when Negro druggist Aaron Henry of Chicago announced he would head a "Freedom ticket" and asked Negroes to write his name in on the ballot.

State Atty. Gen. Joe Patterson has ruled their votes will not be counted because Henry's name makes no provision for write-ins unless the nominee dies before election.

Polly's Pointers NEED DIAPER-STORAGE? DEAR POLLY - Newspaper Entrepreneur Assn. DEAR POLLY - If you have space for baby's diapers it's limited to a cost in the range of a couple of yards of cloth and a rectangular piece of cardboard...

DEAR POLLY - When sewing with a single thread, the one end of the thread to the needle and then, of course, knot the other end. This will keep the thread from slipping out of the needle as it often does if not tied to the needle. It's good when hemming dresses and skirts; in fact, for any kind sewing where a single thread is used. -MRS. J. O. A.

DEAR POLLY - Carrot skins may be removed easily by dropping the carrots in boiling water for five minutes. Then drop in cold water and slip off skins. My husband's idea is to use a toothbrush holder, with oil toothbrushes, over his work bench as a handy gadget for cleaning small tools. -MRS. J. B. McN.

DEAR POLLY - Please ask the readers for advice and methods they have used to obtain antique or furniture. I need step-by-step instructions and a list of what tools are needed. Thank you for all the hints. I find them a great help in beginning home-making. -A. G.

DEAR POLLY - I have found the reverse side of oilcloth bought at the discount is much cheaper than canvas oil painting. To get a dry cleaner's effect in hanging my drapes, I pull each pleat sharply between thumb and fingers, from top to bottom, and then clip each pleat with a bobby pin. Let them hang for a few days with the drapes drawn and then remove pins. There should be no marks from the clips. -MRS. H. T.

DEAR POLLY - When sewing buttons on by sewing machine, I use cellophane gummed tape to hold them all in place, sew through the tapes. Work goes much faster than placing them one at a time. D. L. C.

### Lee Favored To Win Race In Elm City

NEW HEAVEN (AP) — The mayoralty race here Nov. 5 features a rematch between incumbent Mayor Richard C. Lee, a Democrat, and Republican Henry H. Townshend Jr.

An added attraction in the campaign is Raymond H. Paige, the first Negro to run for the chief executive's seat in the city's history.

Lee is favored to win his sixth successive term in city hall. The political experts think he'll do it by more than the 4,000-vote margin he bested Townshend the last time out.

Paige's candidacy plus a 5,000 dip in the number of eligible voters could work against Lee. However, it is expected that downtown redevelopment — a federally-financed undertaking which has brought New Haven national acclaim — will be a plus factor in this year's balloting.

Especially helpful to Lee's reelection bid is the construction of the new H. H. Macy Co. store now going on in the Church Street project. A downtown renewal area which serves as a showcase for the city's redevelopment program. In 1961, the valuable central business property was one big, sprawling parking lot, which was a convenient campaign topic for Townshend.

Townshend has lost this campaign prop, and with it has gone his entire redevelopment argument. He has concentrated his efforts on education, principally a pledge to provide New Haven with a new vocational school.

Lee, on the other hand, backed by handsome grants from the federal government and the Ford Foundation, is dwelling on the administration's efforts to open up new doors in education and employment for minority groups particularly the Negroes who number about 8,000 of the city's voting population.

Two weeks ago, President John F. Kennedy himself invited Lee and a group of prominent New Haveners to the White House to announce the awarding of an \$800,000 federal grant to the city for putting into action juvenile delinquency control programs developed under an earlier federal grant.

New Haven has one of the largest voter registrations in Connecticut. The latest count puts the total number of voters eligible for the Nov. 5 election at 60,000. In 1961, there were approximately 74,000.

The traditional turnout here in a municipal election is about 80 per cent, which means about 50,000 will go to the polls. Local political observers are giving Paige a vote of anywhere from 1,000 to 2,000, and many figure it to be closer to the higher number. This means that Lee and Townshend will have only about 50,000 to split between them. The last time Lee collected just over 30,000 while Townshend drew 26,000 votes.

One Republican issue which Lee has altered since 1964 involves the city's board of education and school superintendent, Laurence G. Pappas. The GOP, with lesser lights on Townshend's ticket, providing the heavy ammunition on this front, have attempted to cloak the board and Pappas with a mantle of ultra-liberalism, a move which they anticipate will win votes for them among traditionally conservative New Haveners.

This maneuver is expected to pick up some votes for the Republican contingent but not nearly enough to overcome Lee. Each party appears to be concentrating on getting out the vote on election day. The activity on the ward level is described as the most energetic in years by either party.

This election, for the first time in the past several years in New Haven, Lee will not be primarily interested in building up a big plurality as a means of enhancing his chances for higher office.

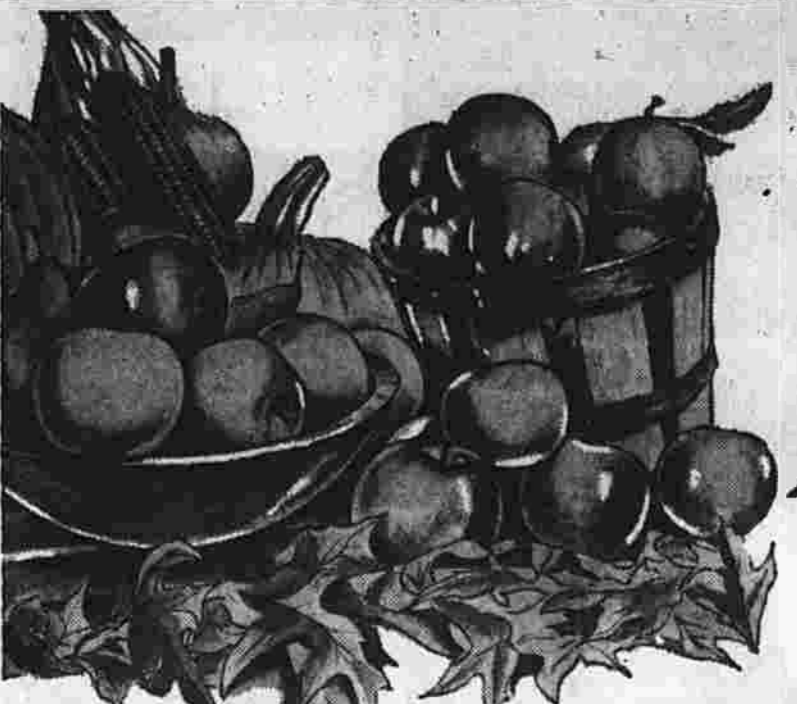
All the higher state elective offices are now held by Democrats. Lee's task the time is just to carry his party back into office, regardless of the plurality.

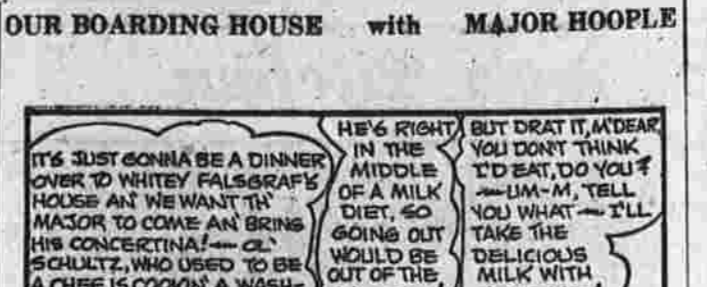
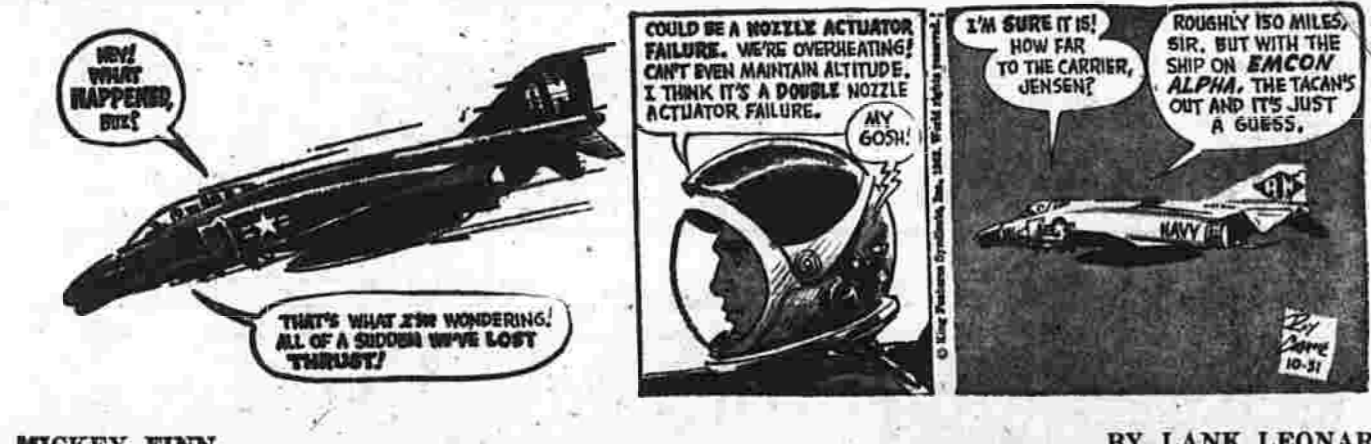

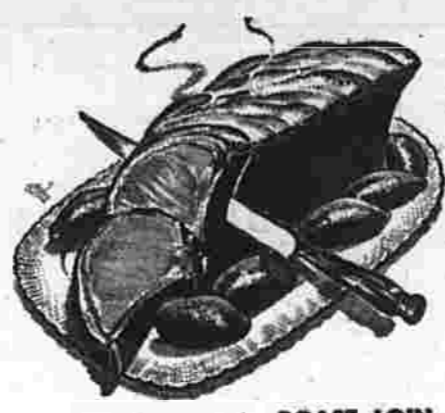
