You Should Know... Calvin C. Taggart

Calvin C. Taggart, lifelong resident of the Eighth District who has been superintendent of the district's sewer department since 1964, has been given a new title—Eighteenth District Supervisor of Public Works.

Taggart, who has been a volunteer fireman for the last 26 years, also likes to be called a gentleman farmer, although that title, along with being a hunter and fisherman, are avocations.

On his four-acre lot off Woodland St., he has two cows and numerous chickens and a garden.

Taggart was born in Manchester on June 23, 1914, son of Mrs. Maude Otter Taggart and the late Newton B. Taggart.

Working on a Breton Rd. pipeline excavation, he was buried alive in a ditch for almost five minutes. Walter J. Hubbard of Vernon jumped into the excavation and dug furiously for four minutes, who said he was conscious throughout the incident.

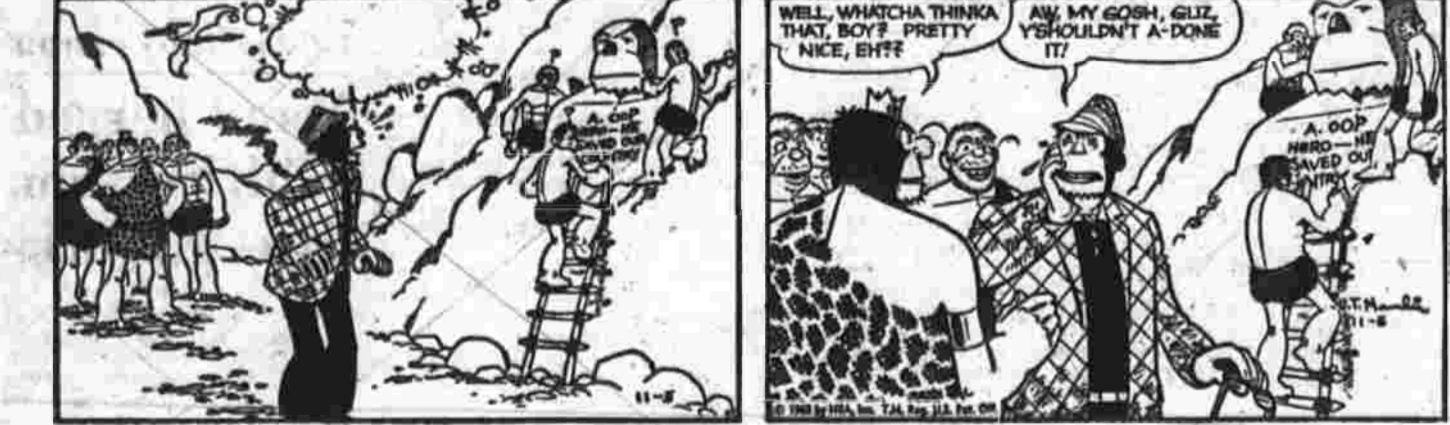

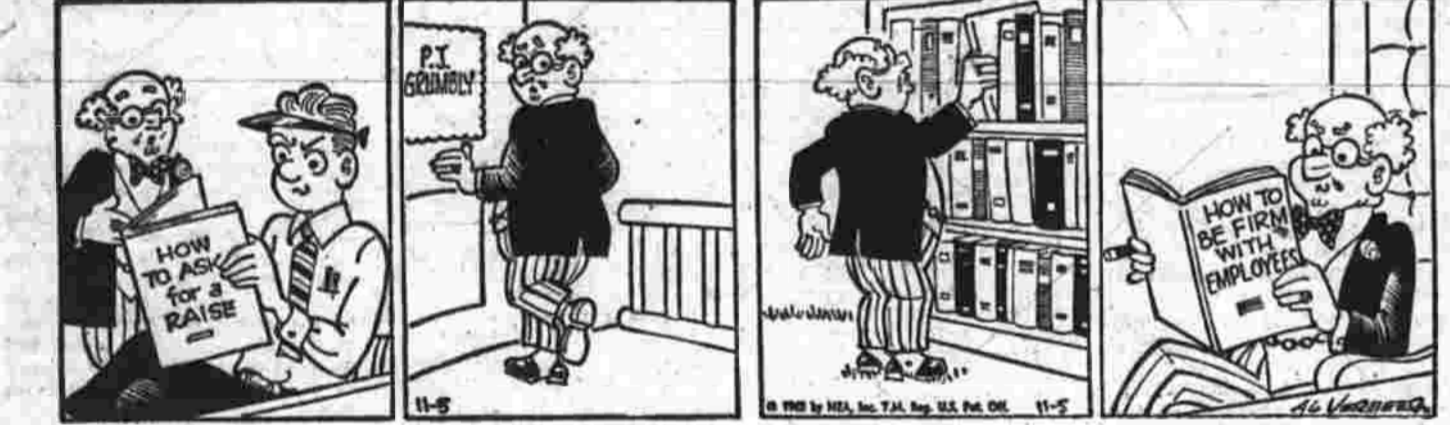
