# Johnson's Record On Major Issues

**EDITOR'S NOTE:**—One of the most demanding offices on earth, President Johnson brings to the nation a record of major issues in his first two years. How he stands on major domestic and foreign issues is described in the last in a series of three articles by Helman Morin, an associated Press Pulitzer Prize winner.

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — The towering domestic problem in the United States today, and a sticky political issue in the battle for the presidency next year, is the question of full equality for the Negro. President Johnson is a Southerner. But speaking on the Gettysburg battlefield last Memorial Day, Johnson said: "Until justice is blind to color, until education is unaware of race, until opportunity is unceremoniously snatched away, until segregation is not a proclamation but a fact of life, we do not answer him—we do not answer those who lie beneath this soil—when we reply that we are not a nation of two colors." The U.S. ambassador to Finland, Carl T. Rowan, is a Negro. At a dinner in Helsinki last September, Johnson called him "one of our most outstanding young Americans."

He went on to say: "Today, Americans who are a racial minority—those of Negro ancestry—are persons of our land for the greater fulfillment of the American dream. Their petition is being heard and heeded." Johnson's guide to civil rights legislation through the Senate in 1957 and 1960. As a political realist, he knows his position on civil rights can cost him votes in the likely event that he is the Democratic nominee in 1964. In 1960, only Johnson's record on civil rights issues is going to hurt us. It may be a factor in parts of the North too. Some Northern politicians call civil rights an "elephant issue" because it is more hidden than visible, opposition to Kennedy administration proposals in this field. Where does Johnson stand on other landmark issues?

He has described himself as both a liberal and a conservative. Political labels are slippery. However, over the years, he has broken out on virtually every major foreign and domestic issue. His votes are on the record. Here are some of his statements.

**Cuba** — "We shall not be content until the last of the forces are withdrawn from foreign soil. The members of the Organization of American States are mutually determined that the Cuban people shall have the opportunity to determine their government freely and without oppression."

**Foreign aid** — "No nation can long enjoy affluence when all the other nations are impoverished."

**China** — "We cannot be done with our dangers or even our duties by next weekend or next year. We are in for a long pull and it is our duty to begin pulling."

**Communist China** — "America stands firm with her Chinese (Nationalist) allies and we shall continue to do so until freedom is secured."

**Disarmament** — "We now face the prospect of destroying ourselves. I am calling for an open curtain for full discussion of the immediate, urgent problems facing our people. We should be on the right to state our case on disarmament in detail to the Soviet people."

He said this in 1957, before the agreement to ban nuclear testing in Latin America. "We must re-evaluate our diplomatic corps with ambassadors who know and understand our neighbors and their language and have qualifications other than contributing to campaign chests."

"We must offer to the people of Latin America the very best technical know-how which will help them to develop their skills and to make and sell their own products."

Johnson's voting record shows: Labor — In 1947, he voted to override President Harry Truman's veto of the Taft-Hartley Labor Relations Act. In 1952, he voted to request the President to invoke the injunction provisions of the Taft-Hartley Act in the steel strike. In other votes, he opposed requiring unions to elect their officers by secret ballot every four years and requiring a majority vote, by secret ballot, before a union could call a strike.

Education — In 1949, he voted for a \$500-million federal aid to education bill and against an amendment to restrict aid to public schools. In 1953, he voted to provide \$217 million a year

The Kennedy Memorial Joseph P. Kennedy and Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy today are in Hyannis Port, Mass., for Thanksgiving dinner and a family reunion at the seaside home which has been their summer home for years.

The late President's two surviving brothers and three sisters and their families are expected to arrive in Hyannis Port today, and John F. Kennedy's widow, Jacqueline Kennedy, is expected to arrive there on Thursday. So is Jacqueline Kennedy, the young widow of the late president, who is today, and John F. Kennedy's widow, Jacqueline Kennedy.

No other man ever had three sons who held the office of president, attorney general and U.S. senator at the same time. The shattering loss of the youngest son has been borne with grief, but without hysteria, according to an old family friend, the Rev. John Cavanaugh, president emeritus of Notre Dame University.

Word came Tuesday night that Mrs. Kennedy, who would interrupt the task of packing for her move from the White House, to fly Cape Cod Thursday morning with her two children to visit her grandparents at Thanksgiving.

Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy and Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., who occupies the Senate seat once held by the President, are expected at Hyannis Port either late today or Thursday morning with their families.

John F. Kennedy was the first of the senior Kennedy children to die violently. Joseph P. Kennedy Jr., a Navy pilot in World War II, was killed in 1945 in the explosion of a bomber over the English Channel.

A daughter, Kathleen, was killed in a plane crash in Europe shortly after the war for them.

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Today the Kennedy family celebrated the 30th birthday of the youngest son. He is expected to arrive in Hyannis Port today for the third year in a row. She could have expected her smiling, handsome father to come and watch the sun set at least a moment. He always did.

She could have expected her surprise, she said, when she learned that her father had provided for two birthdays in his 100 years—celebrating in the White House projection room.
