Committee Making Survey Of Homework Practices

A committee of teachers and principals representing all elementary schools, King and Ernest Junior High, and Manchester High School are making a survey of homework practices in the Manchester school system.

The committee of 15 is headed by Miss Catherine Shea, principal of Vesperock School. Its members were chosen by principals through the Administrative Council. The board of education has asked the group to survey all the schools to find out what is being done at each level regarding the kind and amount of homework given.

Questionnaires formulated by the committee have been distributed to teachers in each school, Miss Shea said. When they are completed, returned and analyzed, a report from the committee will be made to the board of education in the spring.

The board of education requested the survey because it wants to know whether teachers, particularly on the elementary level, are assigning homework as a regular policy.

A board directive on homework, issued some ten years ago, stated that "in general, no regularly assigned homework should be assigned by the (elementary) teacher."

Zoners Hear Bids Dec. 16

The zoning board of appeals (ZBA) will hold a public hearing on Monday, Dec. 16, at 8 p.m. in the Hearing Room of the Municipal Building, to consider five requests for variance, and one request for an extension of start of construction time.

Charles Ponticelli and Barney Peterson are seeking a variance at 36 and 44 Greenwood St., Residence Zone B, to erect a four-family dwelling where regulations permit only single or two-family dwellings. The applicants claim that the topography of their lots presents a problem and hardship.

Leslie Knox of 140 Woodside St., Rural Zone B1 is requesting a variance to convert four chicken houses into a commercial venture for storing boats and boat trailers.

Richard and Jennie Schubert are asking for a variance to alter a porch which is closer to the street lines than regulations permit. The porch, which is now set back 15 feet, would be set back only 15 feet after alteration. The regulations call for a setback of 20 feet.

Sylvester Thomas of 230 Green Rd., in Residence Zone A is seeking a variance to erect an attached porch which would be closer to the sidewalk than regulations allow. The proposed porch would be 10 feet wide, compared to the required 10 feet. The applicant claims a narrow passage be built to avoid a storm water sewer run on his property.

The fifth variance request is that of Harley Lovell, who is seeking permission to erect a detached garage at 32 Dorothy Rd., in Residence Zone A. The garage would be in the farthest part of his corner lot, as regulations require. The applicant says that he wants to build in a manner that would not detract from the appearance of his house.

The request for extension of time in which to start construction is being asked by Michael Krause of 62 Hartford Rd., in Residence Zone B. Krause in March had been granted a 12-month extension to erect an addition to his florist business, with a provision that construction was to start within 120 days. He was refused a building permit last week because of the 8-month time lapse. Regulations require that he must now ask for the extension.

West opened the five of hearts, and East won with the jack. Back came a diamond to dummy's king, and South drew three rounds of trumps. Then he led a club.

West took the ace of clubs at once and led another heart. South had to ruff the third round of hearts and found he couldn't collect all of his club tricks.

If he led a club to dummy's jack he could not get back to his own hand. If, instead, South cashed the king and queen of clubs, overridding dummy's jack, he would be able to discard only one diamond from dummy. Eventually, trumps would lose a diamond trick.

The point is that South must preserve a way of getting back home. In bridge terms, he must keep an entry to his hand.

Start Early

The only entries to South's clubs are his trumps. He must start the club before he finishes drawing the trumps. He may draw one or two trumps if he likes, but he cannot afford to draw a third trump.

For example, suppose declarer draws the second trick with dummy's king of diamonds and draws two rounds of trumps with the ace and queen. Then he leads a club, losing to the king.

The defenders lead hearts, forcing South to ruff the third round.

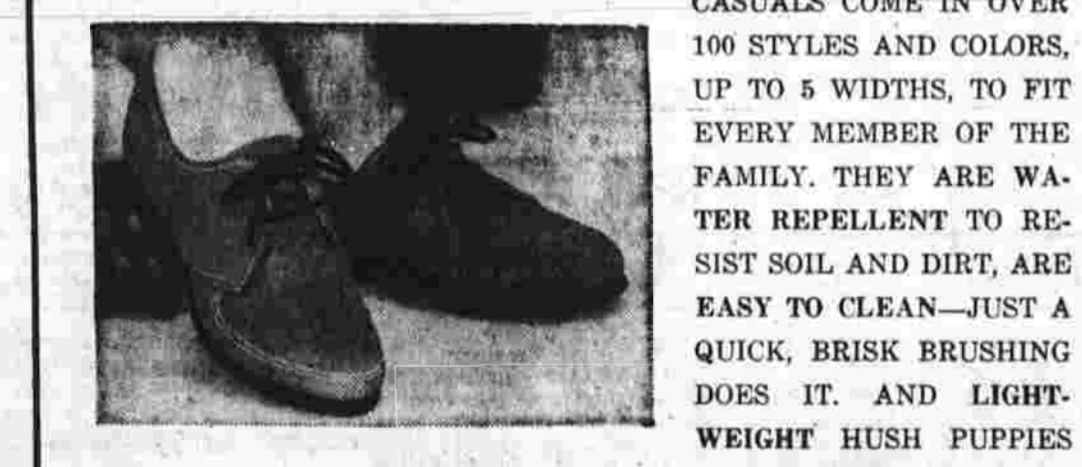

W. P. Gullander, president of the NAM, and A. C. Rubel, president of Union Oil Co. of California.

Champion said there are signs of reaction against "ill-conceived economic ideas" that have developed in recent years.

"It was not without meaning that wheat farmers this past spring voted down the tax-repealing controls that had been proposed for them," he said.

"Their revolt was not a mere whim, it was a feeling that has even made itself felt on college campuses. In the spread of organizations dedicated to personal freedom, individual initiative and more effective limitation of government."

"There is a rapidly growing reaction against bureaucratic pressures from Washington for more centralized control and decision-making."

Gullander said concentration of political power is destroying the market place as a regulating mechanism in the economy. He said proposed legislation affecting packaging, credit, patents, mass transportation and retail prices "would have the effect of taking the responsibility for regulating our economy even further out of the hands of those who invest, produce and consume—out of the market place."

Profit, said Union Oil's Rubel, is "the economic manning in our free market economy" and "should rank alongside such hallowed concepts as home and mother and the American flag."

Ruby's Trial Date Moved to Feb. 3

DALLAS, TEX. (AP) — People throughout the nation saw Jack Ruby kill the accused slayer of President John F. Kennedy and they are likely to hear nearly all the evidence before Ruby's trial in Dallas.

Steps to set two formal inquiries in motion raised the trial date from Dec. 10 to Feb. 3, set for Dec. 9. The trial was held in Dallas on Dec. 10, 11 and 12. Both the prosecution and defense said they needed more time.

Press information said that light meanwhile about both Lee Harvey Oswald and Ruby. Oswald was charged with the Kennedy assassination, and Ruby, 22, a Dallas night club owner who gunned down Oswald before thousands of television viewers just two days later.

In Washington a former Marine Corps lieutenant in whose unit Oswald served for a time, John E. Donovan, said Oswald's military discharge and departure for the Soviet Union in 1959 caused a stir.

"That compromised all our secret radio frequencies, all signs and authentication codes," said Donovan, now a physics teacher in a private school. "He knew the location of every unit on the West Coast and the radar capability of every installation. We had to spend thousands of man-hours changing everything."

It was learned in Dallas that the Internal Revenue Service is trying to collect \$20,880 from Ruby through four liens filed with the county clerk. The government claims he failed to pay all the taxes he owed and the liens cloud title to any property he holds until they are paid.

An apartment house manager in Dallas, Mrs. Dean Roberts, said a man who placed a newspaper ad demanding answers to a dozen questions from the Kennedy assassination has left town.

Mrs. Roberts said this man, Bernard Weisman, and a roommate, William Burley, paid a month's rent Nov. 3 but unexpectedly departed Nov. 27—five days after a \$1,000 check had been paid and wounded Texas Gov. John Connally. She said Weisman left a New York forwarding address.

Two congressmen have called for FBI investigation of the American Fact-Finding Committee, for which Weisman said he purchased the newspaper space.

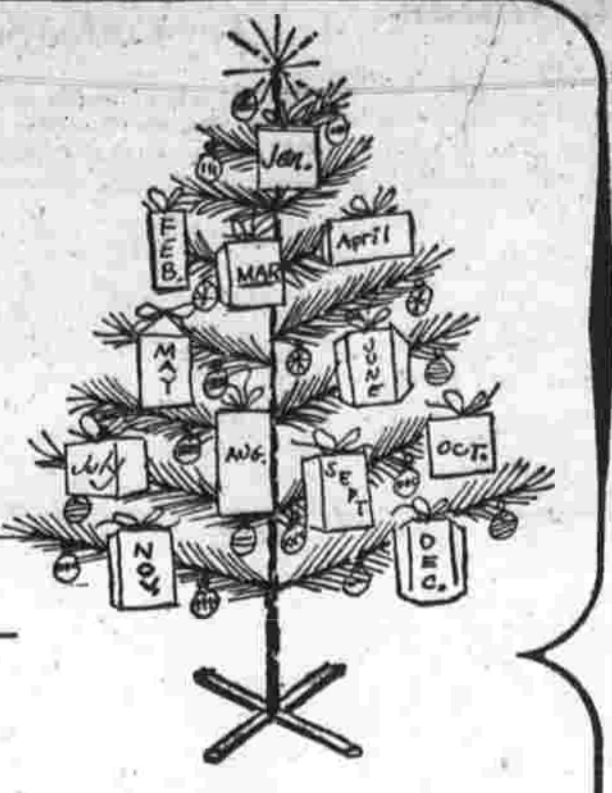

Hospital Expands Power Capacity

A \$50,000 expansion of the power circuit at Manchester Memorial Hospital which will more than double its electrical capacity is now under way and is scheduled to be completed early in 1964.

"If we do but that, this nation, under God, will have a new birth of freedom," he said. "If we do that, we shall not perish from the earth."

He said Kennedy was the first to see the need for an effort to change our racial attitudes and to amend our racial practices hardly short of a voluntary revolution.

"But instead we are here in a memorial service—we have a memory and a knowledge of what might have been," said Dr. Blake. "I shall not attempt any theology to justify the ways of God to men, to try to explain why the Almighty has permitted this dark cloud of tragedy to come upon us all."

"Rather I ask that we pray to God by His sovereign power He will now use us all to transform a death into a new life—and a monstrous wrong into a great new right."
