### Club Spends Almost \$20,000 In Improving Golf Course

The Manchester Country Club, which rents 145 acres of land in the town of Bolton, has also been built, at a cost of \$10,000.

This appears to be the first of a series of capital improvements that the financial report says it was paid for by the club last year.

Improvements listed include a \$10,000 maintenance garage and almost \$9,000 in new grounds construction.

The financial report shows the club can a \$4,167.41 deficit as of Oct. 31, 1963—which is substantially better than last year's \$7,000 deficit, or the \$11,000 loss that had been anticipated this year.

John M. Riester, secretary-treasurer of the club, also said in his report to N. Charles Boggin, the liaison man between the club and the town, that there were eight outside tournaments played at the club during the year, and that more than these resulted in the greens being closed to green's fee players for the full day.

In January, the town received the lease with the club, designed to overcome objections of both members and non-members green's-fee players to the then existing arrangement.

Under the terms of the new lease, the club was permitted to raise both regular membership dues and greens fees.

Dues went from \$20 to \$30 for annual single memberships and from \$10 to \$20 for family memberships.

The financial report shows \$27,152.50 in dues during fiscal 1963, as compared to \$4,296.50 for the 1962 year, as compared to \$21,828 last year when the fees were \$2 and \$4.

A complaint frequently voiced about the club's operations in past years was that non-members were restricted from playing because of a number of days of tournament play when the course was closed to non-club members.

Dr. A. B. Moran reminded the town directors of these past complaints speaking during the open portion of the Dec. 3 directors meeting.

According to Riester's letter to Boggin, the club entertaining only eight outside tournaments during the past year.

All were terminated by 2:30 p.m. according to the schedule provided, and thus no resulted in the course being closed all day to green's fee players.

These figures exclude capital improvements on the greens, and an additional \$6,000 that the club paid the town in rent in November.

The capital improvements on the financial report total \$48,850 in greens construction. Riester noted in his accompanying report that as of Nov. 30, the club has expended \$9,919.99 on greens construction, \$4,426.49 during November.

The eighth hole was relocated during November, with new tee, fairway and green, and the
