Bobby Eases Back to Job

WASHINGTON (AP)—Slowly and quietly, Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy is easing back into the public life that was so shatteringly altered by an assassin's bullet three weeks ago.

He still is the attorney general, the nation's top law enforcement officer, even though he no longer holds the intimate White House role he delighted in when his brother, John F. Kennedy, was president.

He attended a groundbreaking ceremony Wednesday—his first official public appearance since his brother's funeral. He didn't say anything. He just went, and stood, and watched, because the playground is in the heart of the city, and he frequently has shown concern for the city's underprivileged children.

He had made no public statement of his plans. He has permitted no news interviews.

The general understanding continues to be that the attorney general, 38, will remain on the job as long as President Johnson wants him to.

"I'm not worried about Bob one bit," one close friend said. "I'm convinced he'll always be in public life—and that he will get along just as fine on his own as when he was part of that brother team. But as far as I know, he's kept his own counsel about his plans."

MOUNDSVILLE, W. Va. (AP)—Camp Fairchance, West Virginia, a home for trustworthy convicts, is being closed. Too many of the inmates have proved they can't be trusted.

The minimum-security facility, a branch of the West Virginia Penitentiary located about 1 1/2 miles from the penitentiary, houses about 200 convicts.

Penitentiary Warden Otto C. Bolen said he is discontinuing the 18-year-old camp because it needs renovation and escapes have become too frequent.

and Camp Gary, San Marcos, Texas.

McNamara said the overseas installations will not be announced until a later date, so that the United States can discuss the prospective actions with the foreign governments concerned. He did not identify the countries, either.

No naval ships were on the list of Army, Navy and Air Force bases due to be axed or reduced in scope.

Rumors Wednesday said McNamara would move to close naval shipyards in Boston, Philadelphia and San Francisco. One base in Ohio also was mentioned.

House Speaker John W. McCormack D-Mass., acting for the Massachusetts delegation carried to President Johnson Wednesday night a bipartisan protest against rumored closing of the Boston Navy Yard.

Other protests raised on the White House from Pennsylvania, California, New York and other state congressional groups.

There were demands for investigations by House and Senate Armed Services Committees.

Through it all the Defense Department maintained a steady "no comment" on the reports.

One hurried official noting the anguished cries from Capitol Hill, said ruefully, "There is no painless way to something like this."

In an apparent effort to avert the storm, Deputy Secretary of Defense Rowell L. Gilpatrick went to Capitol Hill to explain the situation to affected congressmen. He was aided by Secretary of the Army Cyrus Vance and Secretary of the Air Force Eugene M. Zuckert.

But they didn't succeed, at least to the hard-hit New York delegation.

After being informed that seven bases had been tapped for the docket in New York State, Rep. Leo W. O'Brien, D-N.Y., angrily denounced the Pentagon as an arrogant, O'Brien called the base-closing decision "a preposterous, unwarranted action."

He quoted Gilpatrick as having said it was not the Defense Department's job to consider unemployment and to respond to a request for economy.

This appeared to refer to Johnson's emphasis on economy since succeeding to the late President John F. Kennedy Nov. 22.

Johnson told a news conference last Saturday he and McNamara were making a study of defense installations to determine which could be eliminated as a way of curbing spending.

Johnson inaugurated the McNamara in May 1961, about two months after the Kennedy administration had taken office.

At that time the Pentagon listed 6,700 bases and installations of various sorts, about 4,500 of them in this country and the rest abroad.

Since March 1961, the Defense Department says, about 4,500 installations have been closed or reduced in scope.

Claimed savings: About \$18 billion a year.

McNamara told Congress last January his goal was to take more such actions so that by the end of the fiscal 1965-June 30, 1966—the annual savings will be increased to \$42 billion.

The Navy's 11 shipyards have been a source of some controversy for years. Two years ago, Kennedy overruled a Pentagon staff recommendation ordered the Boston, San Francisco and Philadelphia yards kept open.

Basically, a Navy-sponsored study showed earlier this year private yards can do the work more cheaply.

Navy yards now are limited to overhaul, modernization and repair, with private shipyards handling what one Navy authority estimated is 80 per cent of the new naval construction.

Guide Posts For Market Newcomers

NEW YORK (AP) — Rising prices and heavy trading in recent days and weeks have increased public interest in the stock market. More persons are getting into it, either by actually buying shares, or vicariously by talking about the going on.

Yet a lot of the terms used are vague to many a market watcher. Here are simplified explanations of a few of the common ones you run into most.

Blue chip — Common stock in nationally known company with good long-term dividend record and strong investment qualities. Penny stock — Share selling for less than \$1.

Cats & dogs — Low-priced, highly speculative issues. **Convertible** — Preferred share, bond or debenture that can be turned in for common stock of the company.

Dollar averaging — Investing fixed sums at regular intervals in a given stock regardless of price change. **Share in a company** — Share in a company thought likely to make above average gains in earnings and net worth over a long period.

Margin account — The account of a trader who operates partly on money borrowed from his broker, currently set legally at no more than 30 per cent of price of the stock.

Margin call — Demand on trader to put up more cash or securities with the broker when skidding prices mean that customer's equity in stock falls below or dangerously near the legal minimum or below standard set by the stock exchange or by the brokerage firm.

Round lot — Unit of trading on the exchange, which is usually 100 shares except for a few high priced or inactive issues. **Odd lot** — Amount of stock bought or sold in less than the established round lot unit of 100 shares for most issues. Odd lot trading is popularly supposed to be the badge of the small investor.

Short sale — Borrowing stock to sell at the market price in expectation of buying back at lower price later for a profit. If price goes up, stock still must be bought some time for replacement, at a loss to the trader.

Over the counter — Market maintained by security dealers for stocks usually unlisted on the exchange.

Right — Privilege given stockholders to buy new shares in the company, often at lower than prevailing price; right can be exercised or sold.

This market — Few bids to buy or offers to sell or both, often because most of the shares are closely held with only a few available to the public.

Tid — Current dividend rate

Unity in Korea Sought by U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The U.N. Political Committee Wednesday voted a new appeal for a united, independent Korea and called upon the Communist government of North Korea to accept U.N. objectives. The resolution — sponsored by the United States and 13 other countries whose troops fought under the U.N. flag in Korea — was approved 12-1, with the Soviet bloc and Cuba casting the negative votes. Twenty-two countries abstained and 14 were absent.

Previous resolutions along this line have produced no results. **ROSE IS NOT A ROSE** — ASHLAND, Ore. (AP) — Steve Barnett, an Ashland high school student, lost his job doordrilled skunk several weeks ago. This week a neighbor called him and said the animal was in her yard. CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — Radio flight records, especially those on the control system of the first stage, are being studied by engineers seeking the trouble that sent a Polaris A3 missile off course Wednesday night.

U.S., Soviets Funnel Aid To Somalia

MOCADISHU, Somalia (AP)—Over the sun-scorched horn of Africa, tall, thin men in long skirts known as futa patiently lead long camel caravans. At dusk they hold stacks of branches and grass mats, crouching around fires, they chant a poetry called gabay. Nearly 75 per cent of Somalia's inhabitants are nomads, moving from place to place in search of pasture for camels, sheep, goats and cattle. The total population is estimated at 2.5 million.

While most of the country remains primitive, plans are being drawn to bring progress into the nation. American and Soviet technicians compete in building schools and hospitals. Both East and West invite young Somalis to study at their universities. Small Italian cars flash along Mogadishu's dusty, heat-struck

streets. Stores with giant fans turning under the ceilings advertise tape recorders and cameras. A store's throw from the capital's airport runway, herds of camels and cattle graze guarded by halfhearted shepherds. Air traffic halts at dusk for lack of light.

The country, covering an area of 280,000 square miles, does not have a railroad. American technicians are developing the port at Mogadishu. The Russians are building one at Berbera in the north.

It is a nation of old and proud traditions, with one of the few working democracies in Africa. Six political parties compete for national and municipal jobs. Authorities have a hard time trying to keep men and women from voting several times in elections.

There is not one political prisoner in Somalia. Criticism of the regime and party in power is free.

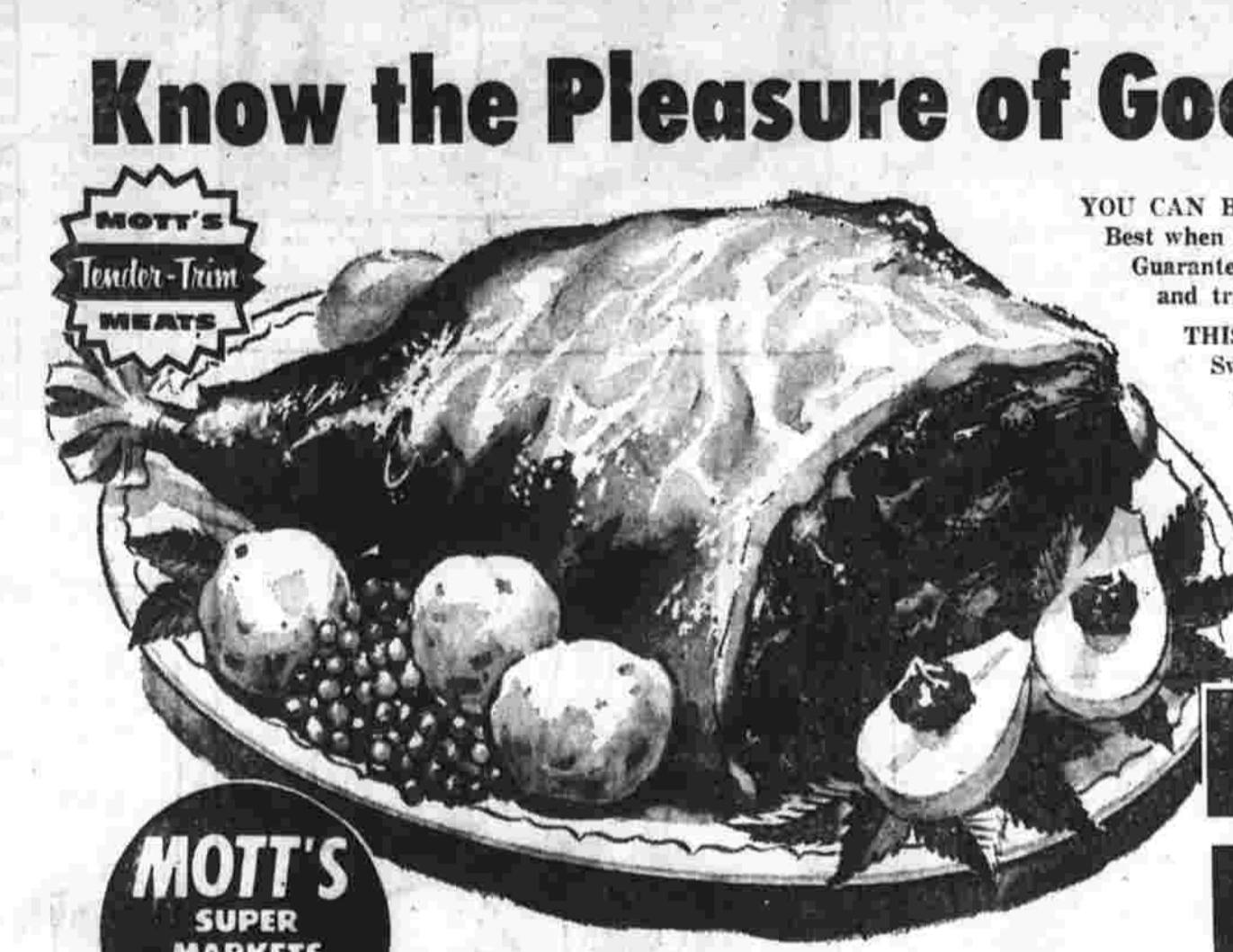

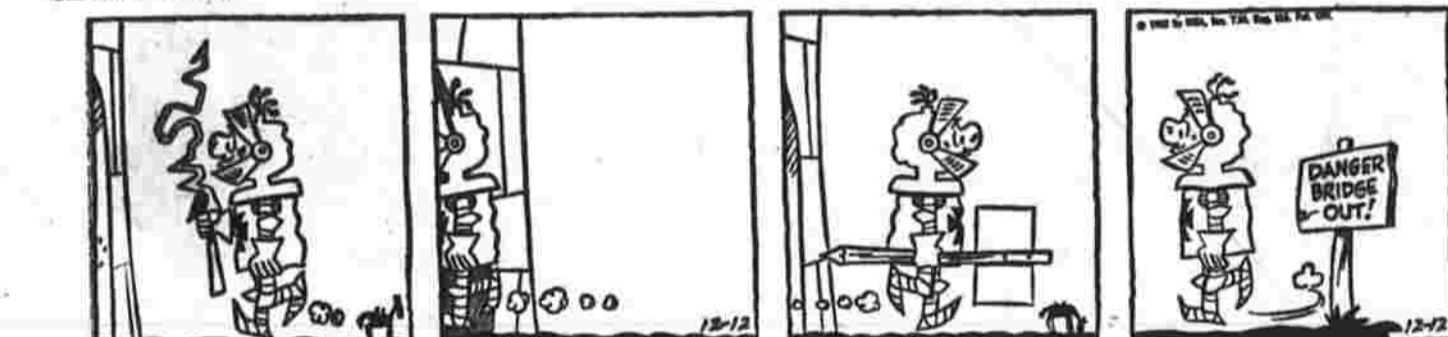
