Health Capacias gives helpful information Reforms Aim Of Anglicans

By GODFREY ANDERSON-LONDON (AP) — With less than three out of 27 million bap-tized Britons showing up in church even once a year, the Church of England is trying desperately to develop a new look

Aside from the gimmicks of individual parsons, whose efforts have ranged from jazzed-up services for teen-agers to socalled kitchen sink communion brought right to the home, the church at high level is bent on reforming its image.

A new form of government to give laymen more say in how the church is run has been given the green light. This plan would combine the centuries-old convocations of Canterbury and fork with a new house of lay-

men. The new body would be known as the General Synod of It would replace the present church assembly, but bishops and clergy would still sit sep-arately and have a final veto on synod decisions.
Other reforms involve the

handling of church finances.
Since 1947 the ecclesiastical treasury has been nominally managed by the church commissioners—92 of them including the exception of Centerbury. he archbishop of Canterbury the prime minister, most dioc san bishops and laymen appoint d by the church assembly. The commissioners meet once a year to rubber-stamp decisions of three church estates commissioners who handle daily business. These three hold the purse strings and act as joint managing directors.

They control investments running to nearly \$50 million a year and the distribution of invest-ment income for helping pay and house the clergy. Eately their public image has suffered badly. They have been

attacked for boasting of their in come and advertising penditure like any wealthy cor-poration. They also have been under fire for acting as high little to their parsons. The average stipend is about \$56 a week, although this may be augmented by church collections and other sources. Worried over the bad publi-city, Dr. Michael Ramsey, archbishop of Canterbury, set up an inquiry committee headed by Sir Edwin Herbert, a prominent businessman. This body has pro-

posed reforms. Its main recommendation stresses the need for consultation on statements by the com-missioners that might hurt the church's public image. ~ Because it is the state established church, Parliament has the final say on any major re-

forms.
The archbishop says the church "needs greater liberty to control its own affairs, particularly to revise its forms of worship. That ought to be possible within the present establish ment. But it is essential that the church secures greater liberty. Two long-range goals are a re-vised prayer book that would permit experimentation with new liturgical forms, and the selection of bishops and cathedral deans by clergy instead of by the crown as now.

Cambodia Head Welcomes Break

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP)-Cambodia's chief of state Prince Norodom Sihanouk, said today he "would be happy to break diplomatic relations with the United States."

Sihanouk said that U.S. Am bassador Philip D. Sprouse had delivered a protest to his gov-ernment that was a "thinly disguised threat to break rela-"Let us then hope for an early

break in relations between the United States and us," Sihanouk declared in a speech in the province of Takeo.
"Then all the United States can do is to threaten to make war on us and to send us their

famous Polaris bombs if, however, they do not fear being cilled by ridicule." In Washington, the State De-partment denied that Sprouse ad delivered a protest. It said ne had requested clarification of the language used in a broadcast by the Cambodian government radio station Dec. 9 which J.S. officials interpreted as derogatory to the late President John F. Kennedy.

U.S. monitors reported the broadcast ordered celebrations because of the deaths of South Viet Nam President Ngo Dinh Diem, Thailand's Premier Sarit Thanarat and "the great boss of these aggressors." Officials in Washington took the latter term as a reference

to Kennedy.

The Cambodian government press service denied that any such celebration had been ordered for Kennedy's death and said he had the "unanimous respect of all Cambodians." The prince said Sprouse's protest had caused him to recall Ambassador Nong Kimmy from Washington, along with all or his staff except the cultural at-Relations between Cambodia teriorated steadily in recent months because of Sihanouk's States and South Viet Nam are arming and supporting Cambodian rebels seeking Sihanouk's


