President Signs College Aid Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Johnson signed today legislation providing a billion dollars in federal aid to higher education over a three-year period and said he was "proud and happy to do so."

A big delegation from Capitol Hill, educators, and government officials watched the signing. Johnson said this and other legislation in the field of education would mark this Congress as one of the greatest in history in providing the tools to fight illiteracy, poverty and disease.

The late President John F. Kennedy fought hard for aid to higher education, Johnson said, and called the legislation a monument to Kennedy, as well as to all those in Congress who assisted in its passage.

Johnson used 60 pens in his first ceremonial bill signing. He ran out of the first supply of pens at one point.

The remainder of that portion can go to both public and private undergraduate colleges for building libraries, and science, engineering, mathematics, and foreign language classrooms.

Dam Collapse Studied

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Three hundred million gallons of water roared out of a gaping hole in Baldwin Hills Reservoir, leaving three persons dead, at least \$10 million damage — and one big question: Why?

The giant wall of water from the breaking dam swept blocks of homes away. Only deep, eroded gullies remained where attractive dwellings stood.

The flood smashed through an expensive canyon residential area, hit a garden court apartment development, spread through two business districts and another residential neighborhood, then piled into a flood control channel and found its way to the ocean about five miles away.

Supreme Court Holds For Segregationists

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court overturned today contempt convictions of two officials of the national states rights party, an Alabama segregationist group.

The Jefferson County, Ala., Circuit Court found Fields and Lyons in contempt and sentenced each to five days in jail and \$50 fine.

The order cited a decision of some years ago in the case of "Shuffling" Sam Thompson, a Louisville Negro. The court, in the Thompson case, set aside his arrest on the grounds that there was no evidence to support the action of city police.

The U.S. Supreme Court acted on the case with unusual speed. It heard arguments in the case last Tuesday and Wednesday. Ordinarily, weeks or even months, pass before a final decision is announced when cases are argued.

WASHINGTON (AP) — In the news from Washington:

**CHRISTMAS GIFTS:** Members of the White House staff have received prints of a painting of the Green Room that President and Mrs. John F. Kennedy had planned to give them as Christmas gifts.

**BAKER:** President Johnson will sign an executive order opening to the Senate Rules Committee the income tax returns of Robert G. Baker, former secretary to the Senate Democrats, who resigned under fire Oct. 7.

**ASSASSINATION INQUIRY:** Chief Justice Earl Warren might another meeting today of the presidential commission in-

vestigating the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The panel has been studying a five-volume FBI report on the Nov. 22 assassination. Government sources predict it may be a year before the inquiry is completed.

**LIFT OFF:** The airlift of a 15,000-man Army Infantry division to Korea has been postponed indefinitely. Recommended for March by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, it will not be held during the fiscal year which ends June 30.

### Hebron Rham Fixes Stern Rules On Conduct

Some fairly stern regulations are in force at the Hebron High school at basketball games. Smoking will be allowed on the prom area only for students who have smoking permits issued by the school. No smoking will be allowed anywhere else in the gymnasium or on the school grounds. Only those with smoking permits will be allowed in the smoking area. Those who do not observe this rule will be suspended from school and will not be allowed to attend games for the rest of the season. Also prohibited is walking on the basketball court, refreshments in the gym, sitting in the lobby during second intermissions, and the like. There is to be no leaving before the end of a game except to go home and all must be seated during games. No student may attend games who has not been in school that day. Students riding on buses to away games must have tickets, and must return to the local high school on the same bus. Violation of these rules or of any regular bus regulations will be reported and bus privileges may be suspended if found necessary.




