Speech To Both Sides Of An Ocean What has seemed to many observers much more of a gap or a vacuum than it has been in reality was filled the other day, by a speech made out in San

The gap or vacuum was that of our known policy toward Communist China. The speech was made by one Roger Hilsman, Jr., assistant secretary of state for Far Eastern Affairs. It was a considered speech, which deliberately set out to be the first public description of policy toward China which had been made in either the Kennedy or the John-

The fact that it was made out in San Francisco, before the famous Commonwealth Club, comprising business and civic leaders, was fitting and significant. For the West Coast, although it has its strong ideological convictions, often feels as close to the Asian mainland as we do to that of Europe, and never really stops thinking of what the natural commercial relationship between the two sides of the Pacific once was, and most probably will be again some different kind of day.

So Hilsman made this set speech, and we will attempt to illustrate its purposes and moods by some quotations. First, Hilsman spoke to Americans

"We have tried to be objective, and to see to it that dislike of Communism does not becloud ability to see the facts. We shall be in danger if we let our policies be guided by emotionalism, or our thought processes by cliches."

Next, he talked to Americans in analysis of certain events inside China: Discussing the failure of the "Great Leap Forward," he said: "As their educated men must know, they have above

all else to blame their own attempt to

rewrite economics. . . . "Though the economy collapsed, the regime did not. . . .

"When their survival depended upon it, they showed flexibility . . . we have no reason to believe that there is a present likelihood that the Communist regime will be overthrown. . . .

"The more sophisticated second echeion of leadership undoubtedly knows that it was simple ignorance of the techniques of administering a complex economy which led to many of the mistakes of 1958. . . .

"The leaders may not know it, but the intellectuals know that the official explanation is not adequate as a description of reality. As these ideas seep upward or as the present leaders retire, this awareness may eventually profoundly erode the present simple view with which the leadership regards the

That possibility—that the simple view

might yield to something more tolerable and coexistential-became the Hilsman speech's condition for any marked change in the way we can get along with Communist China. It has to grow out of its simple view of nations and history. It has to recognize that "certain interests-notably survival-are shared by all mankind" and that "there are common interests which cross ideological lines" and that suspicion cannot be a policy and that, most factually important of all, we are firm and unyielding in our own determination that "our prime objective concerning Communist China is that it not subvert or commit aggression against its free world neighbors. It must not be allowed to accomplish for Communism through force of arms that success which it has rarely schieved at the ballot box."

Against that background of description and reasoning, the Hilsman speech then looked forward, in the following

"We do not know what changes may secur in the attitudes of future Chinese saders. But if I may paraphrase a classie canon of our past, we pursue today toward Communist China a policy of the open door. We are determined to esep the door open to the possibility of change, and not to slam it shut against any developments which might advance our national good, serve the free world, and benefit the people of China. . . .

"We will not sow the dragon's seed of hate which may bear bitter fruit in fu-

ture generations of China's million But neither will we betray our interests and those of our allies to appease the ambitions of Communist China's

Hilsman's final paragraph was this: "We hope that they will rediscover the Chinese virtue of tolerance for a multitude of beliefs and faiths; and that they will accept again a world of diversity, in place of the gray monolith which seems to be Communism's goal for human society."

Realism, some unemotional appraisal, some mild hope, and willingness to entertain more-these would seem to have been the messages of the speech. Perhaps, in actuality, the speech contained nothing new, and presented nothing that had not already been part of our actual policy. It seemed healthy, however, to nave it all discussed formally and openly, for both sides of the Pacific to pon-
