### Johnson Film Put Together Very Quickly

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—"Let Us Continue" is the title of a documentary film which has been put together in record time by a pair of expert Hollywood craftsmen.

The finished product is expected to be previewed before high Washington officials today. What they will see is a 30-minute film which will introduce President Johnson to the people of the world.

On the day of President John F. Kennedy's assassination, a telephone call came from the United States Information Agency to Rod Serling and Bill Froag, creator and producer of "Night Gallery."

They were asked if they would be willing to produce a documentary about the new President. They said they would.

On Sunday of that fateful weekend, the two film makers were at the USA office in Washington. They were told what questions should be answered in the film.

Who is Lyndon B. Johnson? How will his ascendancy to the presidency affect the Alliance for Progress? How will it affect developing nations? What is his attitude toward the United Nations? How does he stand on Berlin? The nuclear test ban? Integration?

"It was an eerie meeting," Froag recalls. "We were discussing the film at the very moment the muffled drums were passing in the street outside as the casket was borne to the body of President Kennedy from the White House to the Capitol rotunda."

Froag and Serling were asked if they could produce the film in five days. They answered that was impossible, but they would work as fast as they could—at no charge to the government.

The two men dropped their own activities to help up in New York.

"Rod got a typewriter, a secretary and a dictating machine and went to work on a narration," said Froag. "I sat in the

### Ironic Twist In Threat of Ancient Ill

LAGOS, Nigeria (AP)—A disease that dates back to at least 1500 B.C. is spreading and threatens to become the No. 1 health problem in warm regions of the world. Efforts to improve living standards in backward areas, ironically, is helping to spread the disease.

Some 150 million people suffer from bilharzias, and it could become the main health problem as malaria recedes.

Traces of the disease have been found in 2,000-year-old mummies.

Bilharzias—small fever, or schistosomiasis, as it is also known—is a parasitic disease. It is not usually fatal in itself but saps human energy and makes the sufferer less resistant to other infections.

"Bilharzias takes man to the edge of the grave and, while he is in a weakened condition, another disease pushes him over the edge," said a World Health Organization (WHO) expert.

It is particularly prevalent in Africa, the eastern Mediterranean, the Far East, the Caribbean and South America. There is a related infection in North America called swimmer's itch which is no more than a nuisance, however.

Bilharzias is contracted by drinking or bathing in water containing a parasite which enters through the skin. Vast irrigation systems built to improve agriculture provide ideal breeding grounds for the parasite.

"Indeed it is possible that in some parts of the world the ravages of bilharzias far outweigh the benefits of the irrigation needed water brought by new irrigation dams," one WHO report says.

Hatched in fresh water, microscopic larvae are transmitted to humans by snails. They mature and mate in the human bloodstream. The debilitating effect is caused by thousands of eggs deposited in vital organs.

"Bilharzias is an ancient plague of the world and its early grip has been reported in the records of abdominal pain and

### Mail Total Falls Short Of Prediction

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Christmas mail rush may fall short of the record volume predicted. Postal officials are convinced the death of President John F. Kennedy is the reason.

For the first half of December, the mail volume was 2.5 per cent below that of the same period a year ago.

Unless the peak expected this week shows a significant spur, the Post Office Department expects the 1963 Christmas mailings to reach but not surpass the 10 billion pieces handled in 1962.

"I can't imagine what else could have caused the lag," Asst. Postmaster General Fredrick C. Belen told a reporter.

"The President was assassinated Nov. 22, and we're convinced people just didn't feel like buying and addressing and mailing Christmas cards and packages for a while after that."

Prior to the assassination, the department had predicted a record 11 billion pieces of mail would filter through the postal system over the yuletide season.

Every postal region except Chicago—center of the mail-order world—has fallen below expectations. Across the country, Christmas mailings by die-be-ginners of this week averaged 5 per cent below the predicted rate.

The biggest lag was in letter mail, including Christmas cards. So far, about 6.5 billion pieces of mail have moved through the system since the month began.

The department reported the prospect of record sales for its 1963 Christmas Seal stamp, depicting the national Christmas tree and the White House. More than 5 billion are being printed.

# Pope to Visit India; To See Athenagoras

sent personal messages to ecclesiastical congresses. Pope John XXIII addressed the last congress in Munich, Germany, by a telephone hookup. It has been traditional for the Pope to delegate a cardinal to represent him at the congresses. With the unwritten restriction on foreign travel broken by the Holy Land pilgrimages, there would be no reason for Pope Paul not to attend the Bombay congress. Vatican sources said a tentative schedule had been worked out for the Pope's pilgrimage to the Holy Land. He will arrive by plane in Jordan's capital, Amman, at 1 p.m. Monday, Jan. 4. He will be accompanied by King Hussein. At 1:30 p.m. he will leave by motorcade for Jerusalem, stopping briefly at Jericho. His first stop in Jerusalem will be the Via Dolorosa, which Christ walked with the cross on His back on the way to Crucifixion. He will celebrate Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. From there he will walk to the ancient Damascus gate and then go to the apostolic delegation building for dinner. In the evening, he will go by car to the Garden of Gethsemane, devoting an hour of prayer at the scene of Christ's agony and capture. He will spend the night at the apostolic delegation. On the following day, the Pope will leave for Nazareth, Israel, crossing the frontier just north of the Arab town of Diemni. After a reception by Israeli officials he will celebrate Mass at the Church of the Annunciation. In midmorning, he will go to the Sea of Galilee, stopping at the small Church of the Primacy of Peter on the shore. At noon, he probably will stop at the Church of the Beatitudes, marking the site of the Sermon on the Mount. The Pope will go by car to the Jerusalem sector by way of the Mandelbaum gate for a second night at the apostolic delegation. He will grant audiences for church dignitaries that night and the next morning. Then he will go to Bethlehem, where he will celebrate Mass inside the Grotto of the Nativity. On his return to Jerusalem he will hold additional audiences. At 2 p.m. he will leave for Amman and the return flight to Rome.

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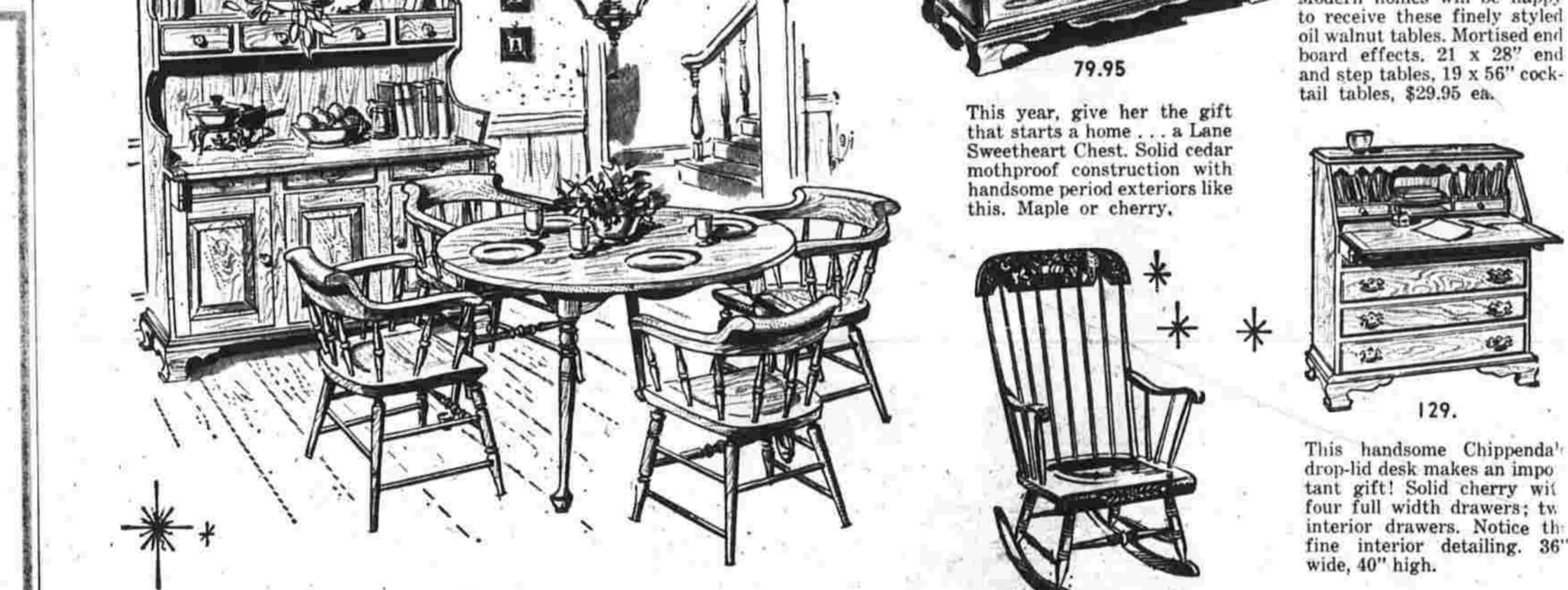

A Very Big \$65,000. One of the most worthwhile special annual appeals made in Manchester, and elsewhere in Connecticut, is that of the Connecticut Institute for the Blind. It is in the state, for a relatively modest amount, \$65,000. But from two aspects, this proves to be a very big and a very important \$65,000. It is big because every dollar donated to the fund drive now being conducted goes directly to the Institute for work it performs here in Connecticut. And this fund is important because it is the crucial financing for the irreplaceable operations of the Connecticut Institute for the Blind.

President Johnson's "Mere". There were some who awaited President Johnson's appearance before the United Nations yesterday with something more than the obvious question—what of whether he would continue exciting American policy toward that organization. There was a more interesting question in the minds of some people: Would President Johnson, perhaps, be more affirmative toward the organization than his predecessor had been? Early in his administration, President Kennedy had all too often referred to the United Nations as if it were something the smaller nations of the world needed desperately, while big nations could, after all, look out for themselves to a greater extent. This had to be a sort of folly, and it was encouraging to think, as President Kennedy continued his experience in office and in the world, that he was steadily revising his ideas, until he came to the part he believed that the United Nations was of supreme and critical importance to nations big as well as small.

Interferometry—Way Out. The interesting thing about the latest discovery about our universe—the observation of nine immense objects out on the very edge of our human detection range—is the rate at which the discovery has come to the stage where it can be announced. One of these objects first appeared as a photographic plate exposed at the Harvard College Observatory more than 80 years ago. It was then believed to be merely an ordinary star in our own galaxy. After 80 years, the scientific devices for peering to know more about this and similar immense way out objects began bringing things together in human minds. It was reasoned that the only way these objects could be well-being of mankind, or failing together, or gravitational collapse. Along with this kind of guess of the source of their brilliance, the British, receiving radio signals from these objects on antennas stationed 75 miles apart, and comparing the radio waves arriving at each spot by a technique known as interferometry, have come up with a general arrow pointing to the location of these objects. The Australians, using a dish antenna, and watching and timing the way the moon cut off the emissions from each of these great new objects, have pinned the locations down more precisely. The great Mount Palomar telescope in California has taken photographs in which the new worlds, or sections of universes, or whatever grandiose mystery they may be, can be identified. Some day some of us may go way out that way and give them some kind of name.

Jimmy Breslin. Trading Stamps. Whether trading stamps have succeeded in putting a real penny into the pockets of the poor, the stamp collectors may be doubted, but the fact that they may turn out to be of real benefit to the public is clear. Nothing else has shown so clearly, what price-maintenance means for the distributor. The system for providing "free" gifts, coupons for cut-price coffee, discounts on trading stamps, the justification for resale price maintenance—the manufacturer's price for the goods in the shops—has been that it makes for orderly trading, providing security for the consumer in return for his acceptance of no more than the manufacturer's price. The stamp war has demonstrated that the margins guaranteed by resale price maintenance are not enough to make for orderly trading; worse, they force competitors to make for an unhealthy and unhealthy system of price reductions into the unhealthy channels of the "free" and trading stamps. ### Municipal Employees Asking Increased Fringe Benefits

Higher pay, increased fringe benefits, and a new Municipal Building—these are the high lights of the requests which the Municipal Employees Group (MEG) has presented to General Manager Richard Martin. ... MEG is requesting an increase in the number of sick leave days from 10 to 15. ... One day of sick pay for each full month worked. ... A total of three days off per year for illness in the family. ... A total of three days off per year for attending a child's wedding. ...

At present, the bulk of the town's administrative employees are housed in the Municipal Building—but others are quartered in the old Hall of Records across the street, and in rented offices near the Center. ... 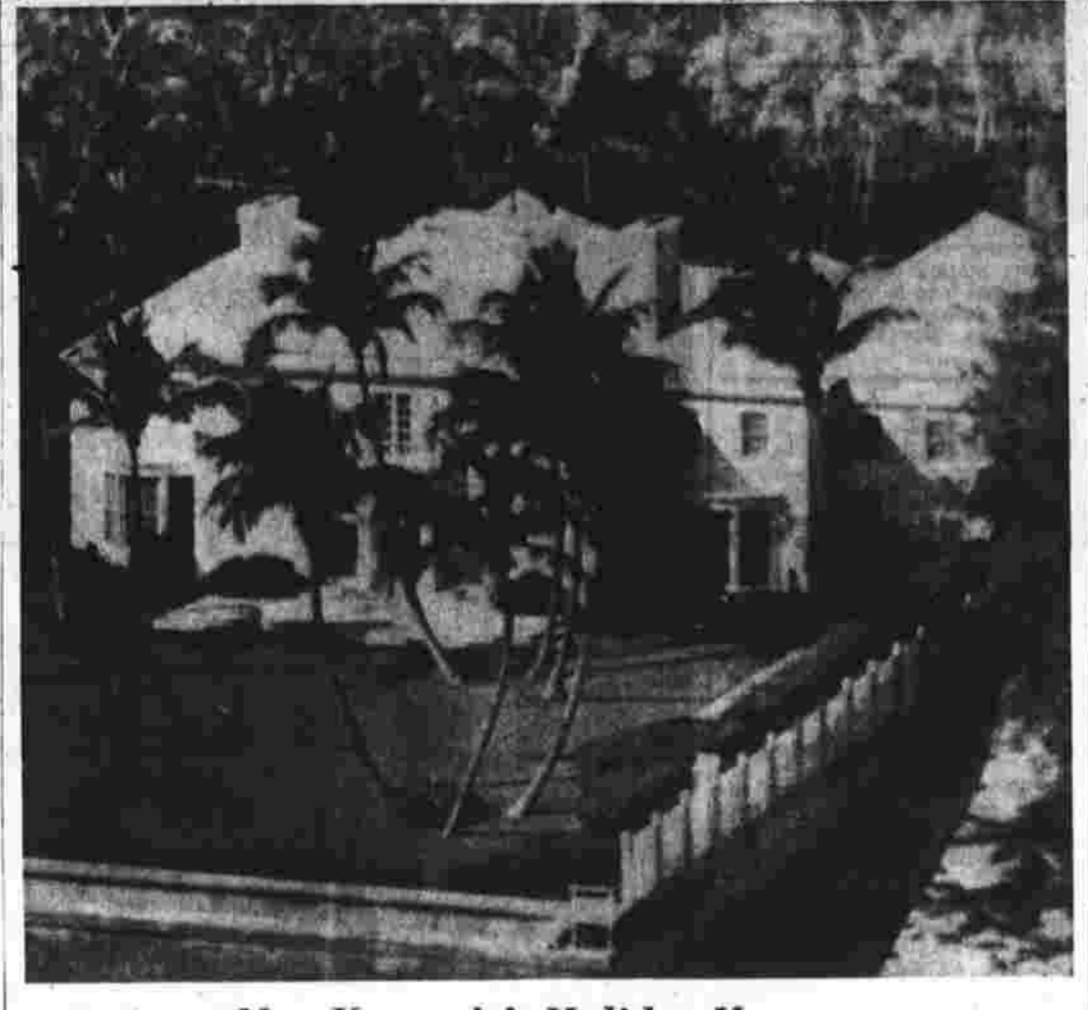

### Town to Submit Plans, Map Detailing Use of Nike Site

General Manager Richard Martin has informed the Boston office of the General Services Administration (GSA) that he will soon submit a complete plan and map for the proposed use of 36.80 acres of deactivated and surplus Nike-site land off Keeney St.

#### Ruth Millett

Martin has indicated to R. W. Jones, regional director of the GSA, that the town will abide by federal regulations and will specify that the land use will be restricted to park and recreation facilities, and to the erection of a water distribution reservoir.

By specifying to what use the land would be put, Manchester will be eligible for a benefit allowance (up to 100 per cent) for that portion to be used as a public water supply, as well as an allowance of up to 50 per cent for the portion to be used as a park and recreation area.

Both reductions would be based on the fair and approved market value of the land. The town now owns property of almost equal acreage to the west of the surplus area, both sections lying on an elevation west of Garden Grove and south to Gladstone.

The town-owned land has many government-leased easements, all of which will be released when the GSA approves the sale of their 26.80 acres.

The sale would not include the adjacent housing project (off Lakewood Circle), which the government would continue to utilize.

Improvements on the surplus property include an administration building, a barracks building, and a mess hall, all of which will go with the sale.

Plans for a water distribution reservoir for the water-starved Keeney St. area date back to 1948, when the New York engineering firm of Buck, Seibert and Lord made a study of the town's water needs and made up with that recommendation.

Martin has stated that if the GSA approves the town's bid for the land, the reservoir will be built during the 1964-65 fiscal year, and will probably be financed by a bond issue.

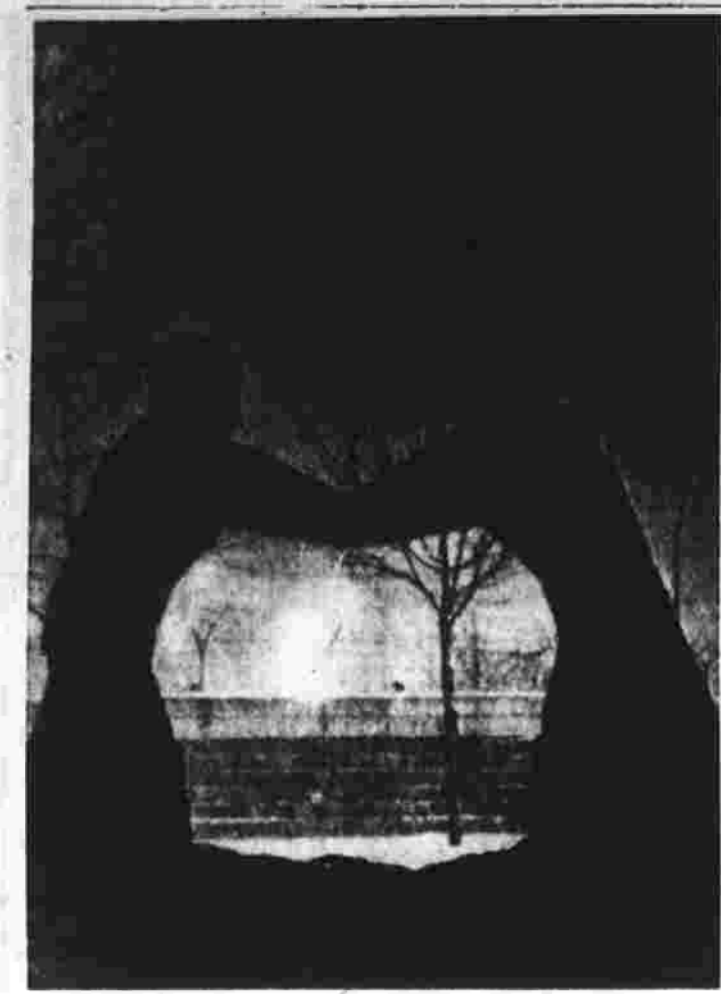

### Sharp Drop in Military Aid Predicted for Next Year

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Johnson administration may hold its military aid request next year to the lowest level since the global program began 14 years ago, it was learned today.

Key U.S. officials indicated they expect a new budget request for military aid to be limited to a little more than \$1 billion.

This will be a bit above the ceiling that Congress imposed for this year, and a \$400-million slash from what the late President John F. Kennedy asked for in 1949.

The top authority said \$1 billion for military aid is about as little as we can live with, the country is offered.

As it is offered, said limiting military aid to that level will force a stretch-out in modernizing the obsolete arms of vulnerable allies such as Korea, Greece, Turkey and Nationalist China.

These countries and others were described as badly in need of newer model artillery, tanks, armored troop carriers and planes as they can stay on all forces threatening them.

Nine countries, most of them in the shadow of Red China, account for 70 per cent of U.S. military aid. Among them they must about 3 billion men under arms. Few can afford this without help, American officials contend.

These countries are South Viet Nam, Korea, Nationalist China, India, Pakistan, Iran, Thailand, Greece and Turkey.

The Koreans and Chinese in particular cannot support themselves and there are indications the United States may urge both to trim their big armies somewhat. Korea has about 500,000 men in uniform, the Chinese the vessel Bella Vista with 60 persons aboard sank after colliding with the launch Garcia Medina about 30 miles from the town of Rio Sulo in west central Colombia, police said.

### Trap for Burglar Kills Store Owner

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP)—"I've killed myself," roared B. C. Russell, 61, after a shotgun rigged for burglars fired at the back door of his food store Tuesday.

He stumbled to a front counter and died. The charge struck him in the chest.

A pistol pointed in the same fashion killed an ex-covict, 21, in 1959 as he started inside the store at night. A shotgun charge took the life of a 19-year-old prowler in 1961 when he touched some cigarettes back of a counter.

Russell had suffered a wound from the pistol in 1960. Police said this caused him to remove the pistol trap but he set the shotgun after another burglary of the store, in suburban Evermore.

The store's butcher, J. E. Riley, 61, said Russell obviously forgot about the 12-gauge shotgun. He was taking a box of trash outside.

### Art Shorts Says: Christmas Trees For Sale Only This Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 20 and 21.

Mrs. Philip Lees of 40 Deepwood Dr., Wapping, firmly believes in "decorating the halls," but not with boughs of holly. Her exquisite holiday decorations have long been the envy of all her friends. She only "books" them a year in advance.

Simple perhaps for Mrs. Lees, as she is one of those talented people who can tackle anything and produce fantastically well. The first Christmas she and her husband were married, Carol Lees couldn't quite see spending so much money on tree ornaments, so she began making her own. By the time they bought their first home several years later, she had decorated a large tree.

It proved to be uniquely beautiful for much love went into that project and it showed.

Over the years she was continually acquiring new ideas which she incorporated with a wonderful imagination and her artistic ability. Her table trees and over-the-tree ornaments this year will probably be very hard to beat.

The tree ornaments are either round or in leaf-drop shape, made of styrene foam. These are marked into sections and sawed through; the number of divisions depending on what size base is being used, but these sections are glued together. Round cookies or doughnut cutters, found in most kitchens, are used as following devices.

The little wooden figures used in decorating the interior scene can be purchased at gift shops, florists, or from specialty companies dealing strictly in such items. Carol's figures are imported from Italy and are handmade. The more ambitious could make their own as they are so simple in design.

The artificial greens and figures are arranged in the center section, then put permanently in place with any glue recommended as a good adhesive for the foam. When these have set well, the two end sections may be glued to the center section. Straight pins or toothpicks may be used to hold the sections together while the adhesive sets, thus eliminating any possibility of slipping.

The first step in covering the ornaments is entirely up to the individual.

"I use green weight velvet to cover the spheres. It is heavy because the material has a little give to it, making it easier to curve gracefully and wrinkle free," explained Carol.

When surreal, she coats the piece of material, she coats the section of the ball with glue then fits the material over the top. To prevent slipping while drying, she tacks it into place with straight pins which are removed when the glue is completely dry.

Gold or silver tinsel, available in any fabric shop or department store, is glued over the raw edges of the material, and again pins are used until the adhesive has set. Beads, miniature tree ornaments, sequins, or any decorative materials may be used in completing the piece. The picture shows that Carol used beading, beads, large foil sequins and sequins for trimming.

The hollowed trees may be used effectively on cocktail tables, mantles or for centerpieces. For a first attempt, at carving foam, these projects will prove easier than the spheres.

The first step is to slice about an inch off the bottom of the foam, thus allowing more freedom while shaping the openings. When the hollowing procedure has acquired the desired proportion, the bottom section can be glued back on. After this is thoroughly dry, the tree shape is covered with velour using the same technique as applied in covering the spheres. The picture illustrates the use of the straight pins for holding purposes.

The scene may be inserted into the hollow either before or after the trimming is done.

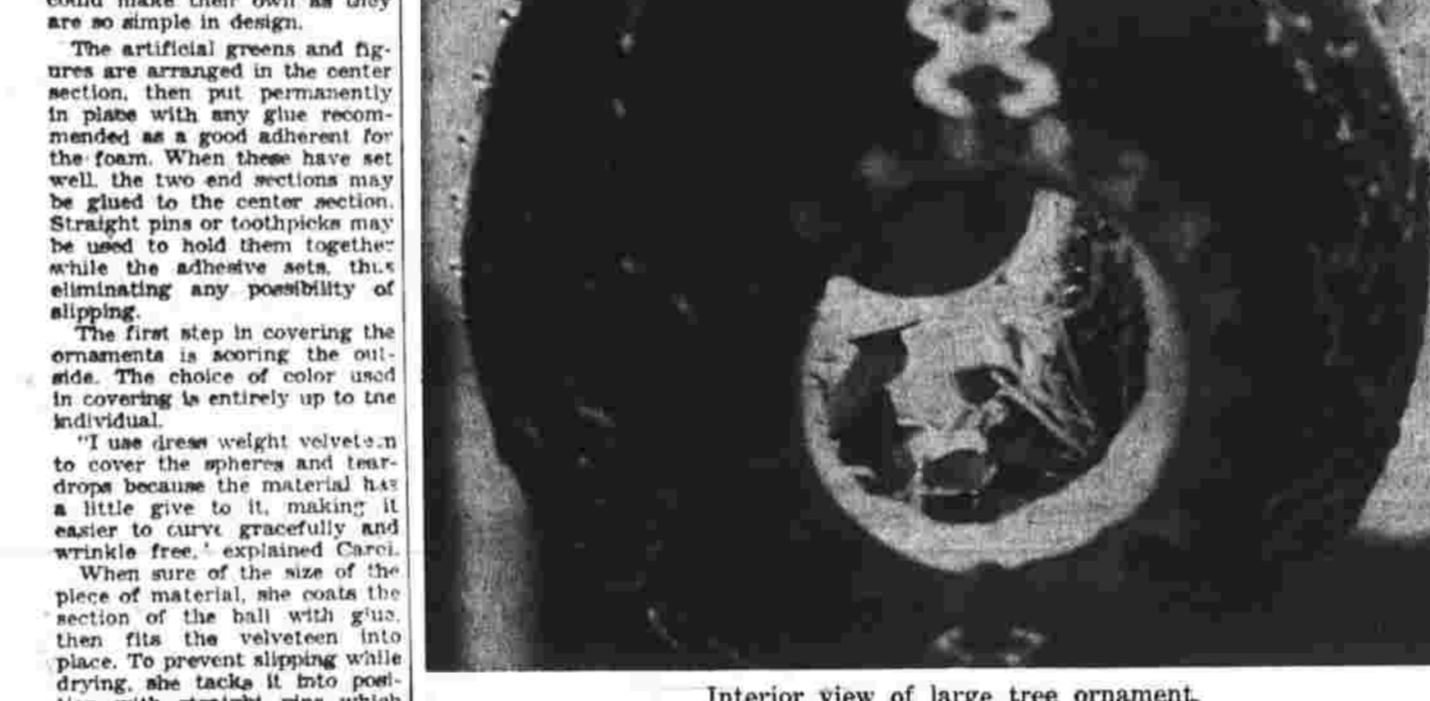
Materials used in decorating are the same for the tree ornaments. The base can be decorated.

Another type of table tree may be made by inverting a footed doornut or candy dish and gluing a cone of styrene plastic foam to the base. The dish can be left in its original state if it is decorative or may be coated with glue and then sprinkled generously with glitter.

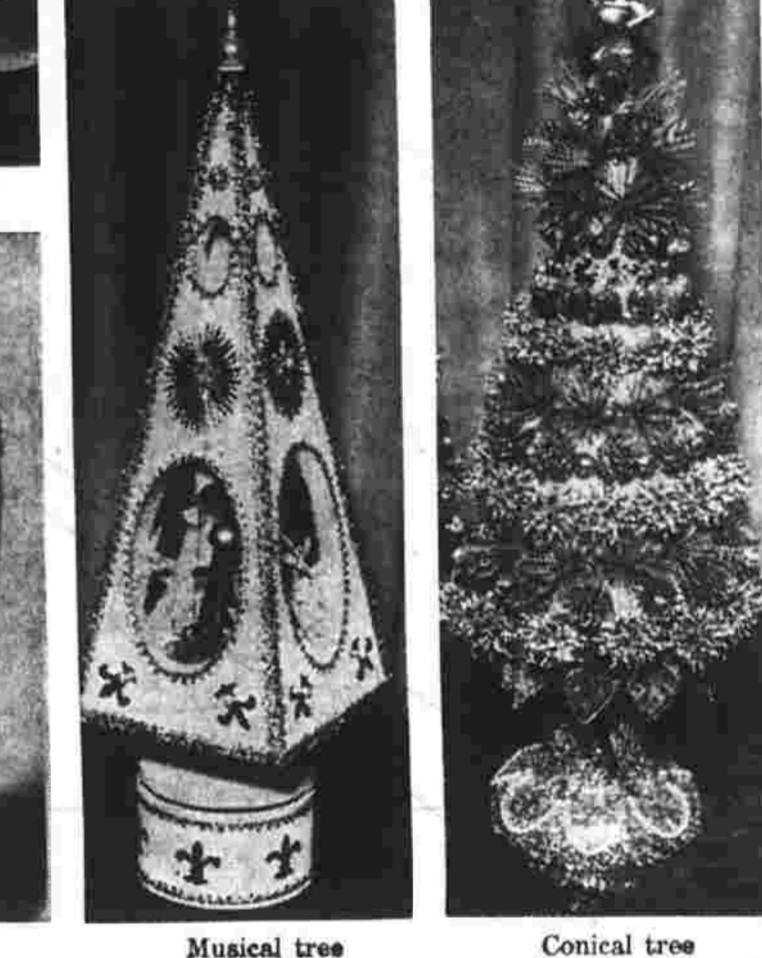
