ent his marrying a Russian girl.  
Vyacheslav Yelutin, the Soviet minister of higher education, told the students at a meeting that the riot was not a Communist plot. He said that an autopsy indicated that the student had been drinking.  
The angry African students surged into Red Square Wednesday, almost under the windows of Premier Khrushchev's office. They scuffled with police and swept past a barrier of troops and the invasion of Red Square.  
Moscow's showplace for state functions, secured after the students gathered in front of the Ghanaman Embassy to protest the student's death. They insisted he had been stabbed by a Russian.  
It was the first anti-government demonstration in Red Square in years.  
Guards shut the gates of the Kremlin to prevent the students from storming in. Police finally cleared the square by late afternoon.  
Soviet papers haven't carried a word about the demonstration or the death. The two Russian language news services also has ignored it. As far as the Russian people are concerned, it just never happened.  
The English-language service, distributed abroad, has reported the student's death but nothing on the demonstration.  
Tass sent abroad today a dispatch saying the Moscow prosecutor's office is making a thorough investigation into the student's death. It reported the official position: the student was killed by a Russian. The two Russian language news services also has ignored it. As far as the Russian people are concerned, it just never happened.  
As to how the Ghanaman got to such an exposed spot, Tass put up this theory: "It may be that he fell himself unwell and left the train—he was on his way from Moscow to Kailash. It is probable that, being drunk, he fell off the train and was disregarding the frost."

A spokesman for the First Family said Wednesday that the Christmas decorations will be pretty much in the White House as followed previously by the Kennedys, including a nativity scene in the east wing.  
The Johnsons, who plan to spend the holiday away from the ranch, are sending out white Christmas cards with the presidential seal and the crest of the White House. The President and Mrs. Johnson will sign a blessed Christmas and a happy new year.  
GREETINGS: President Johnson sent Christmas greetings to the men and women of the armed forces Wednesday.  
"This is the time of Christmas—when the spirit of peace and brotherhood burns brightly in the hearts of all men of good will," the message said.  
"It is also a time of remembrance of the good things of the past—the strength and courage of our forefathers. The spirit of the countless blessings with which our country and people have been favored.  
"And, Christmas is a time for all Americans to be thankful for what is ours and what is promised us."

### PLANES - LIGHTNING

The Federal Aviation Authority recommended Wednesday that all jet airliners be equipped with devices to drain off static electricity.  
The FAA said its recommendation was based on the fact that the metal and plastic rods called "wicks" in the trade can improve the planes' radio communications and might, for some protection against lightning, have never been officially banned for any crash, although it is not rare for lightning to strike an aircraft.  
Last week, the Civil Aeronautics Board reported evidence that lightning hit the left wing tip of a Boeing 707 jet airliner that crashed Dec. 8 near Boston, Md., killing all 81 aboard.  
The Air Transport Association announced that it was going along with the FAA recommendation and that the 117 jetliners "wicks" would receive them as soon as possible. The rest of the 400 jets operated by U.S. airlines have been equipped by the factory with the devices.

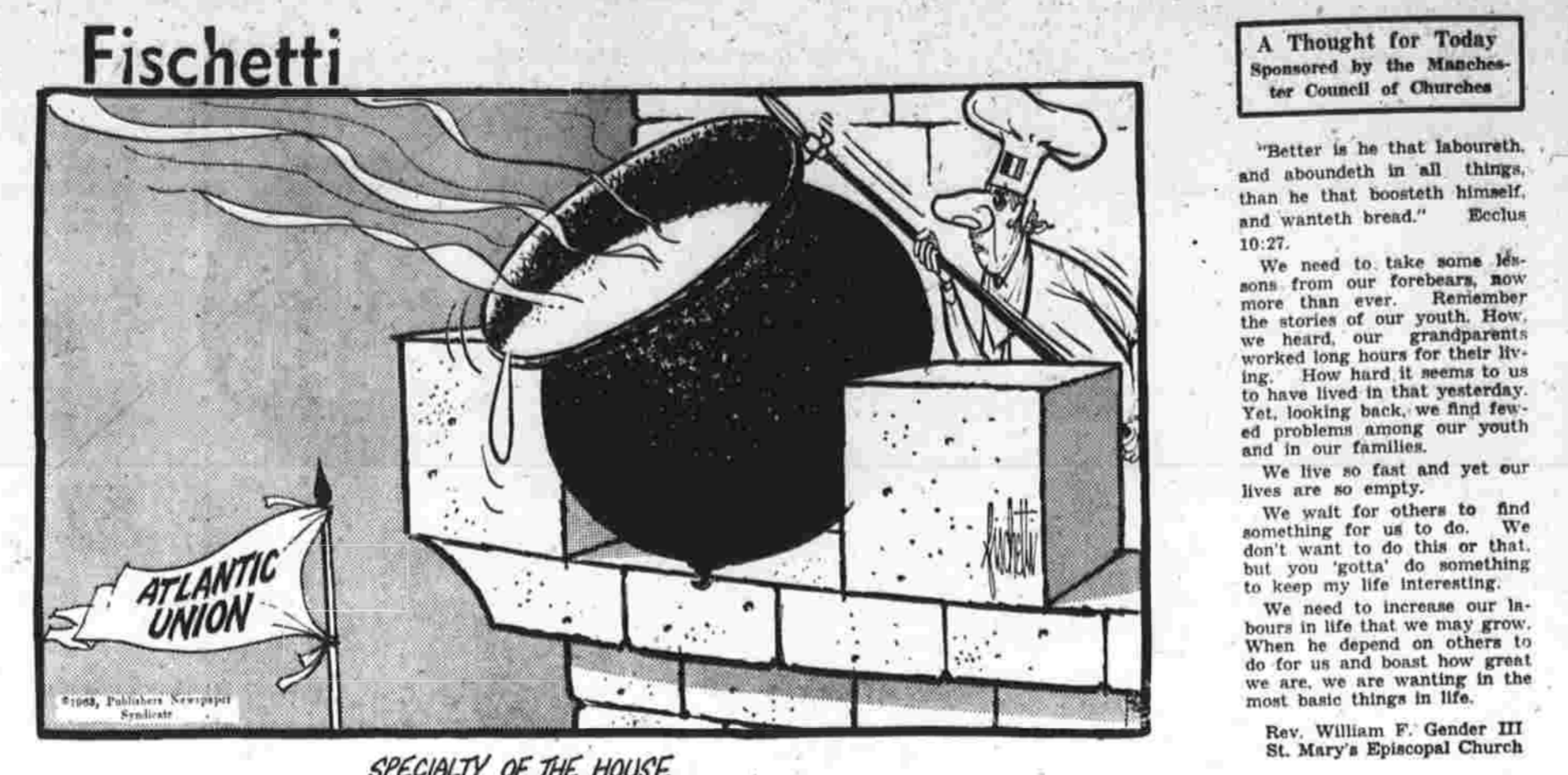

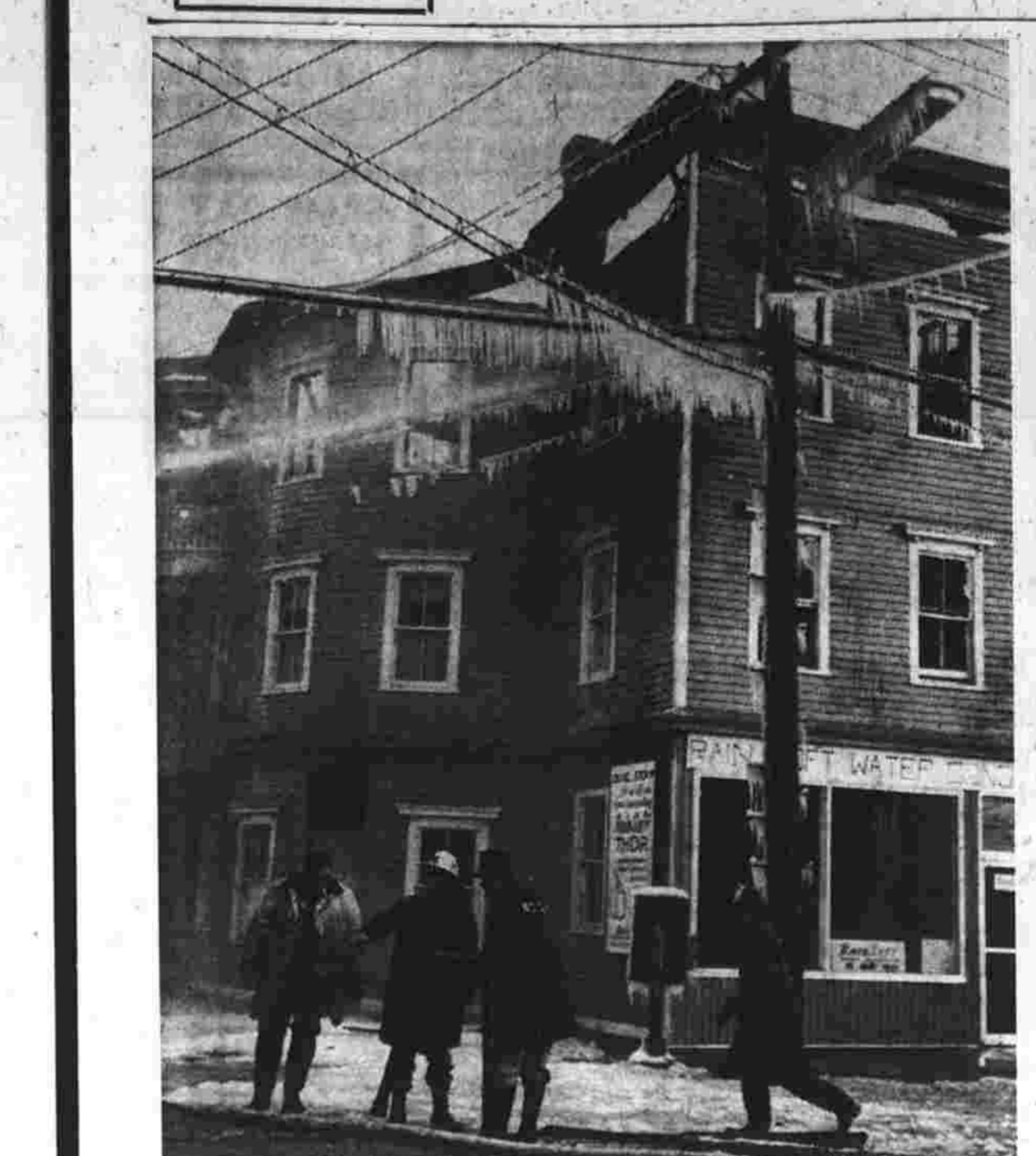

### Pope Will See New Church At Site of the Annunciation

By ERIC GOTTRETT, Associated Press Staff Writer  
 NABAZREH, Israel (AP) — Pope Paul VI will see a new cathedral being built over the site where the Archangel Gabriel is believed to have announced the birth of Christ.

The new basilica in this town of the Annunciation will be the biggest and perhaps the most beautiful place of worship for Christians in the Middle East.

The architect is Giovanni Michelucci of Milan, the construction workers are Christian Arabs, Moslems, Arabs and Jews.

The new church of the Annunciation will be the fourth over the grove in which the Virgin Mary is said to have lived and heard the heavenly message. The first according to legend was built there by order of the Fourth Century Emperor Helena who during her pilgrimage to the Holy Land is said to have rediscovered the true cross in Jerusalem.

Others assume, however, that the first Christian basilica was erected in Nazareth only after the death of the emperor about 326 A.D. The funds, according to historians, were given by a converted Jew, Count Joseph of Tiberias, an ardent follower of Constantine the Great, Helena's son. Archeological remains of that basilica still can be seen today.

When the Crusaders conquered Nazareth in 1099, the same year they stormed Jerusalem, the sanctuary was in ruins. It was rebuilt on its old foundations by the Crusader commander, Tancred. Almost two centuries later, in 1283, it was razed again by the soldiers of the Mamluk Sultan Baybars.

In 1620, Franciscan monks erected the third basilica on the site. It was beautiful and enlarged in 1780 and for the second time in 1871, partly with funds provided by the French government.

The grove of the Annunciation has been the center of all the basilicas. Worshippers and tourists reach it by descending the steep slope, leading into this

Archeological remains of a preceding Israelite settlement and even traces from the early bronze period were unearthed, so that the new church compound will virtually enclose a whole archeological museum.

The new basilica is being erected by the Solel Boneh Building and Public Works Co., an Israeli cooperative enterprise, sponsored by trade unions. Architects on the spot are the Rev. Benedetto Antonucci of the Franciscan order and L. M. Ledwith of Tel Aviv, a pupil of Prof. Muzio. The Rev. B. Bagutti of Jerusalem serves as archeological advisor.

The new Nazareth cathedral will be 217 feet high. The concrete foundations go down 48 feet as much. The interior decoration, including marble and alabaster, will cost two to three times as much. The funds are being contributed by Catholics all over the world.

### From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

 "Stollen is an important part of the Christmas celebration in Germany," says Mrs. Edwin Naschke of 22 New St. "I have a special interest in Christmas Stollen," she added, "because both my husband's and my father are of German descent. Since I do not make it any other time of the year, this makes it very special to my family. The original recipe is given to me by my mother-in-law. Over the years I have changed it to suit my family's taste. Each year I make from 30 to 40 to send to my special friends at Christmas time when our thoughts are on 'Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.'"

**German Christmas Stollen**  
 Combine  
 1 1/2 cups scalded milk  
 1 cup sugar  
 2 teaspoons salt  
 1/2 cup shortening  
 1/2 cup butter  
 Soften  
 2 eggs  
 1/2 cup warm water  
 Let stand  
 When milk mixture has cooled add  
 2 cups flour, sifted, (mix well)  
 1/2 teaspoon ground cardamom  
 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
 2 eggs, unbeaten, and yeast mixture and mix well.  
 Add 2 to 2 1/2 cups more of sifted flour, enough to make dough easy to handle. Remove dough from bowl and let rest for 10 minutes on floured board. Knead until smooth. Place on greased cookie sheet and cover with waxed paper. Let rise until double in bulk, about one hour.  
 Combine:  
 1/2 cup raisins  
 1/2 cup candied fruit  
 1/2 to 1 cup chopped almonds  
 Knead dough has risen, blend in fruit mixture. Let rest 15 minutes.  
 Divide dough into two, three or four parts, depending upon how large you want the stollen to be. Flatten dough to about one-half inch and spread with melted butter. Fold in half lengthwise and brush with butter. Place on greased baking

sheet and let raise about one-half hour. Bake 20 to 30 minutes in a 350 degree oven. The smaller stollens take less baking time.  
 This recipe may be doubled. Mrs. Naschke says she has made as many as 12 small stollens from a doubled recipe. She also says that she bakes them before any other time of the year, this makes it very special to my family.  
 Mrs. Naschke is a native of Worcester, Mass., and grew up in the state of Connecticut. High School there. She and her family moved to Manchester six years ago. She says, "We find living in a town very refreshing compared to city life. Friends are easier to make and people are more thoughtful of each other."  
 Her husband is a tool designer at Pratt and Whitney, division of United Aircraft Corp., East Hartford. The couple has four children, Judy, 10; Jim, 12; Paul, 9 and Carol, 2. The family attends Emanuel Lutheran Church.

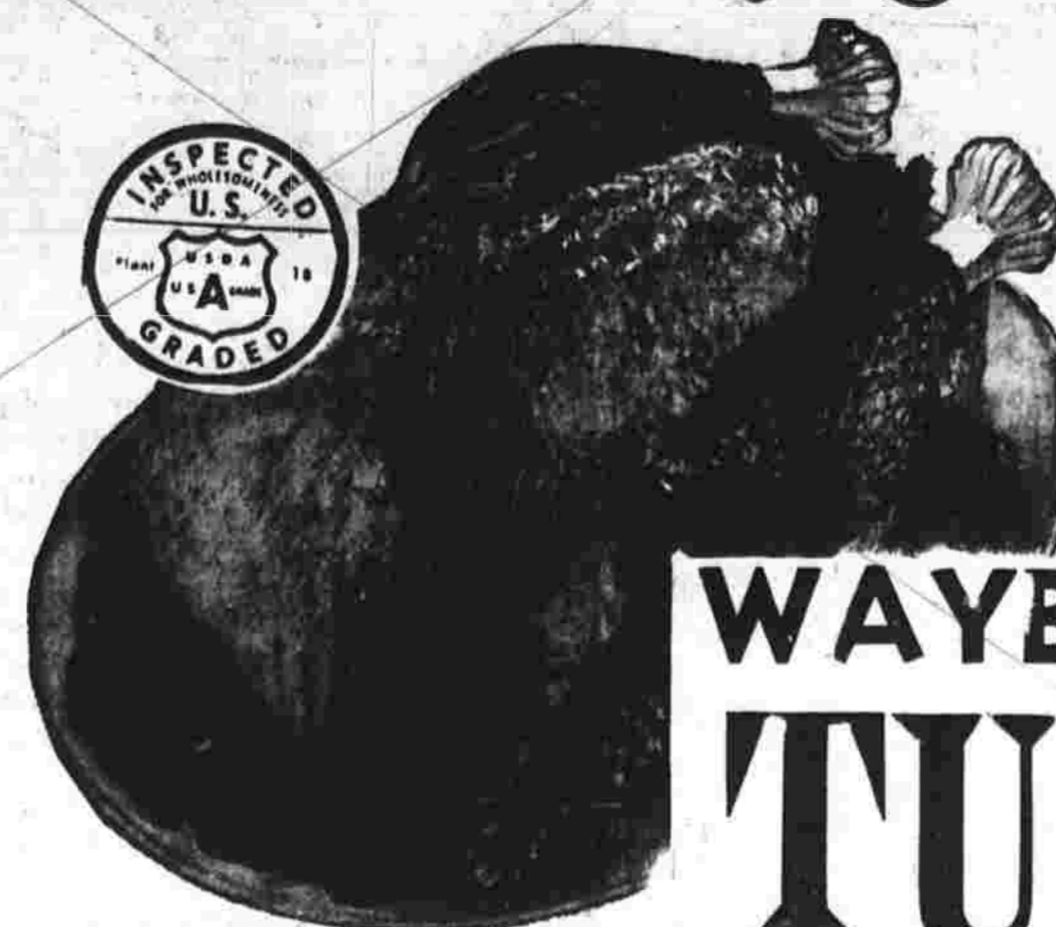

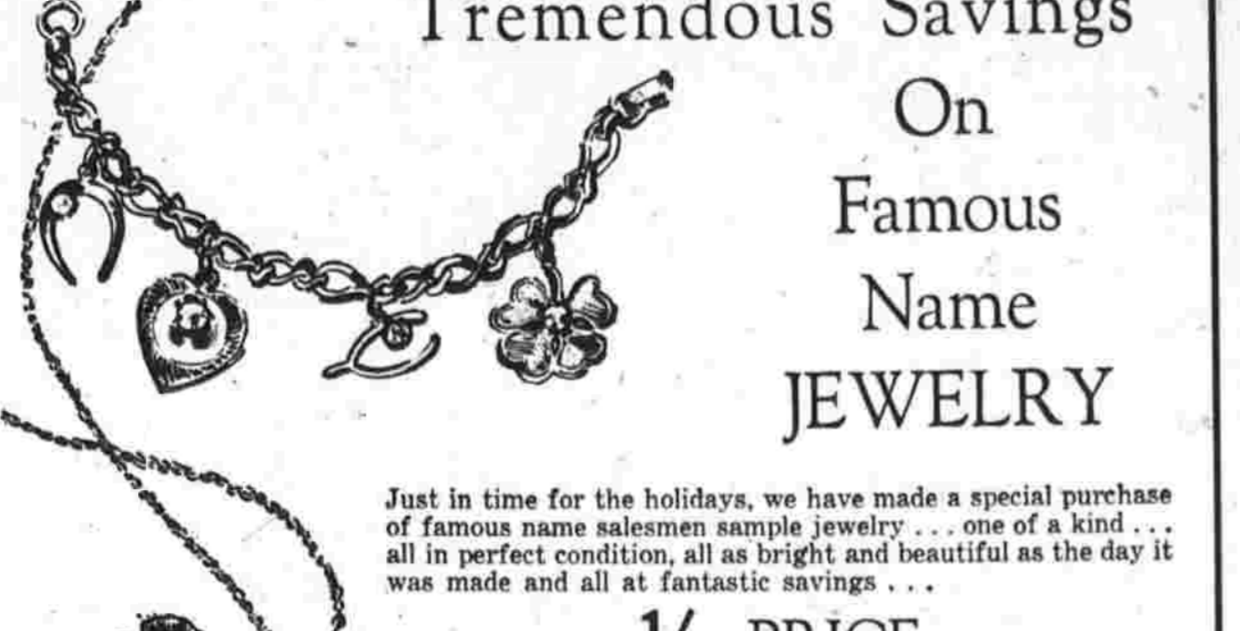

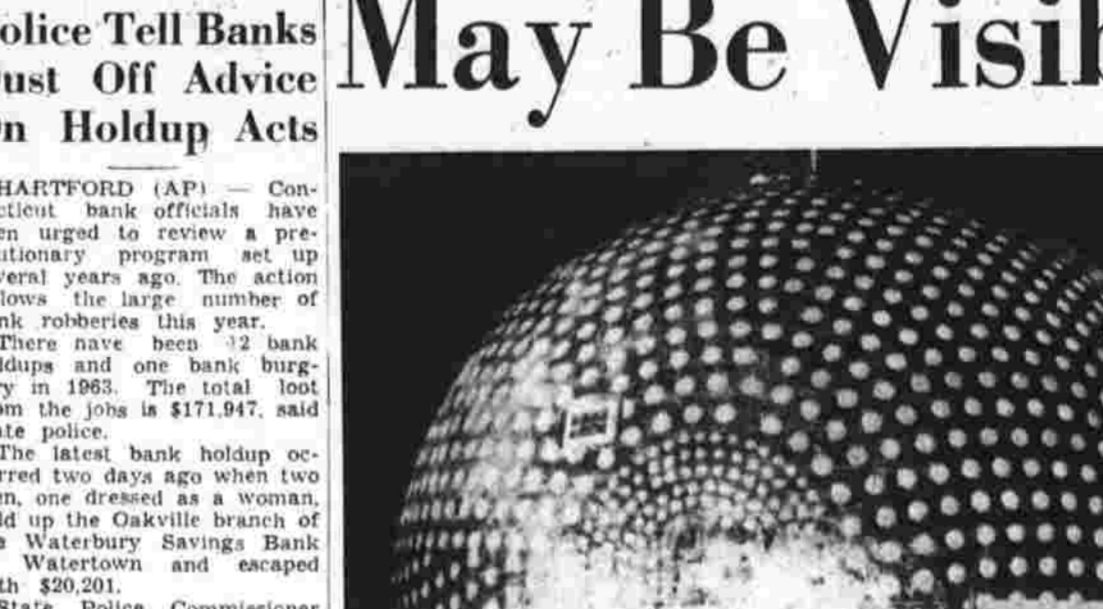
