Civil War Brought Day of Contrasts

RICHLAND, Va. (AP)—The same scene slowly to the hazy, jagged Confederate capital, and snow clouds draped the city like a mourning shroud. It was Christmas 1863, but there was little rejoicing in the city that day. The Civil War had taken the toll and its end was yet 18 months away. Richmond was an American city observing its little Christmas under siege. It was a city of contrasts and paradox, suffering and joy, famine and plenty, a nightmare in a Christmas setting.

Inside Capitol Square the bells of St. Peter's Protestant Episcopal Church tolled, summoning worshippers to the east. Outside, hundreds of breakfast fires for warmth. Beyond the trenches Union guns were silent.

Not far from the square, J. R. Jones saw his family off to church from their meager home, opened his diary and wrote:

"It is a sad Christmas, cold and dreary, and to most of the youngest children, however, have decked the parlors with evergreens, crosses, stars, etc. They have a cedar Christmas tree, but it is not decorated. Candy is held at \$8 per pound.

"A few pistols and crackers were fired by boys in the streets—and only a few. I am alone; all the roof being at church. It would not be safe to leave the house unoccupied. Robberies and murders are daily perpetrated.

"I shall have no turkey today, and do not cover one. It is no time for feasting."

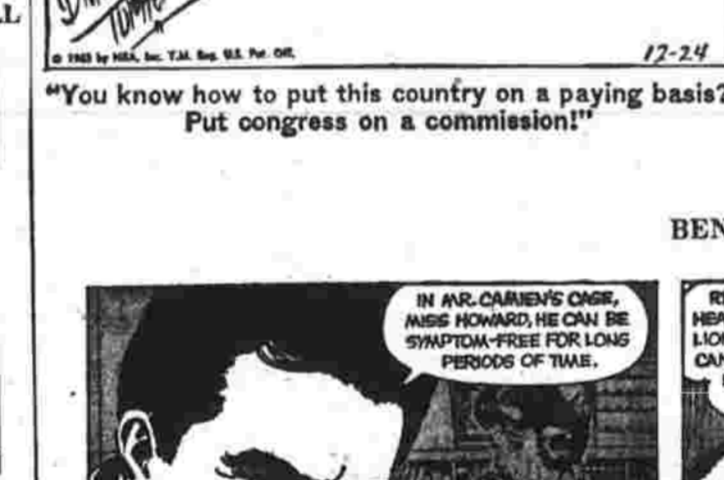
