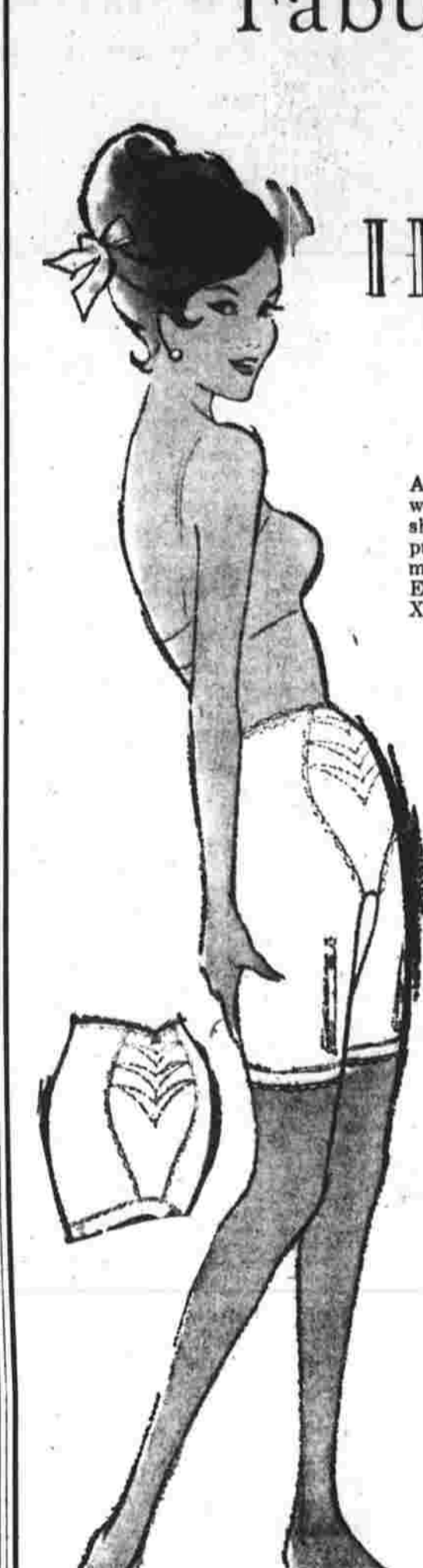

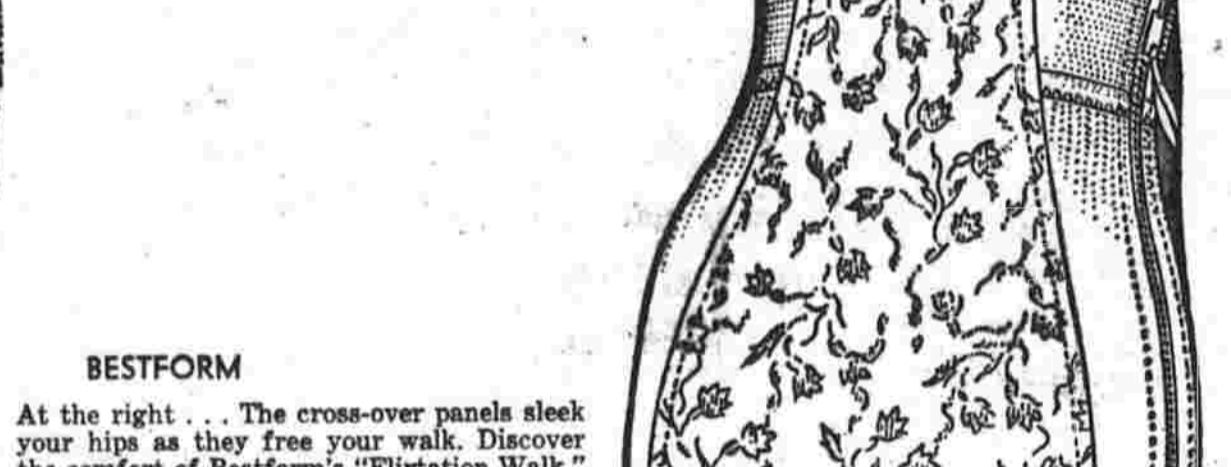

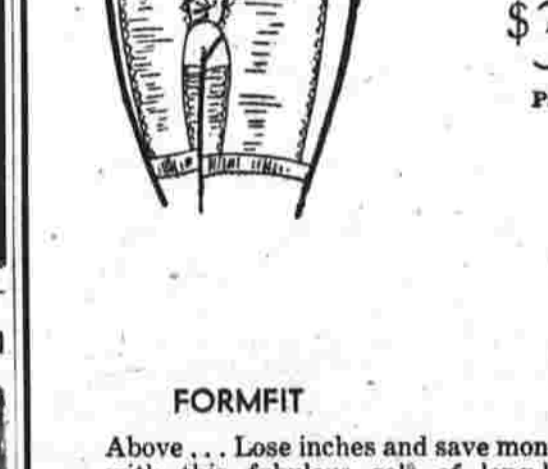

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Barry Goldwater's Republican Senate colleagues got their bets down today — and the smart money was a bid for the White House by the Arizona conservative.

Goldwater gives his yes or no Friday at a meeting of Arizona Republican leaders in his native Phoenix.

The setting, his hilltop home overlooking the city, and the audience of state GOP leaders Goldwater chose seemed to hint he might plan to talk about an Arizona race — for re-election to his Senate seat.

But Goldwater spread word of his plans in a telegram Monday to his supporters across the country, as senators scattered from an adjournment Monday.

Loss Totals \$110,000 In Three State Fires; Coventry Grill Burns

HARTFORD (AP) — Fires in Avon, Coventry and Winsted early today and last night caused an estimated \$110,000 in damage.

The largest of the three was in Avon where fire destroyed the Shantook Ice Cream Bar on West Avon Rd. with loss estimated at \$50,000.

Also today, fire gutted the Pireade Grill on South St., Coventry, with the loss set at up to \$35,000.

Last night in Winsted, fire gutted a 10 room house causing damage of from \$20,000 to \$25,000 and leaving two families homeless.

Firemen from six communities battled a blaze of undetermined origin that wrecked the Firemen Grill in Coventry. The restaurant, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Basoula of South Avon, formerly known as Hinkley's Restaurant.

The Basoulas had left the building at 6 p.m. Twenty minutes later, the building was discovered in flames.

The fire started at 8:30 below zero when firemen from South and North Coventry, Andover, Columbia, Esplanade and Mansfield responded to the alarm. Despite the bitter cold, 100 firemen, the one-story frame building was termed a complete loss.

The building itself is valued at about \$14,000, according to town records, but damage has been estimated at up to \$35,000 with equipment and furnishings.

Firemen were hampered by the freezing cold that froze hoses. Winds that tended to blow flames from the burning structure led firemen to water down the nearby house of Mrs. Douglas.

Two firemen were injured though not seriously. Esplanade Fire Chief Howard Reynolds stepped on nail and Fred MacDonald of the South Coventry fire department was injured.

'64 Seen Sharpening Russia-China Conflict

WASHINGTON (AP) — Cold war tensions between the Soviet Union and the West should continue to decline in 1964. But the new year is expected to bring a sharpening of the conflict between the Soviet Union and Communist China with an unpredictable impact on world affairs.

Officials of the new administration of President Johnson are optimistic about the outlook for East-West efforts to strengthen peace.

Initial probes go well, particularly in disarmament negotiations, a meeting between Johnson and Soviet Premier Khrushchev stands high on the list of international possibilities.

U.S. officials are sensitively aware that the new government of Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home in Britain is actively interested in a top-level conference.

Also, political observers here think it may be possible that Johnson, who presently has no summit plans, would find a summit session useful for dramatizing his own declared interest in seeking more peaceful East-West relations.

This would hold particular interest if preliminary talks laid a basis for a Johnson-Khrushchev meeting on some new measure to follow up the limited nuclear test-ban treaty of 1963.

Johnson already has said he would go anywhere anytime he felt a meeting with another world leader would have constructive results.

Chou Softens Warlike Tone In Morocco

PARIS (AP) — Softening Peking's strident tone, Premier Chou En-lai said Monday night Chinese Communists believe in peaceful coexistence with capitalism and don't think another world war is inevitable.

In an interview broadcast by the French government television service, Chou said the United States and not Red China is putting obstacles in the way of peaceful coexistence — by its "hostile political policy in regard to China and particularly its "occupation" of Formosa.

"The Chinese people," Chou said, "have friendly feelings toward the American people, but we oppose the policy of aggression and war of the American government."

Waterbury Ban Delayed by CEA WATERBURY (AP) — Mayor-elect Joseph McNellis has won 15 days to try to save the Waterbury Public School system from Connecticut Education Association (CEA) sanctions.

School officials say the sanctions would prevent them from hiring new teachers.

The CEA agreed at an executive board meeting yesterday to delay the sanctions until Jan. 15. They were to have gone into effect tomorrow — the day McNellis takes office.

McNellis asked for the delay to study means of obtaining additional money for the schools. He is reportedly considering the possibility of a special tax levy.

The CEA said sanctions would be imposed because insufficient school funds were provided in the municipal budget.

The Waterbury Teachers Association and McNellis have sought a \$7.4 million budget. The outgoing administration of Mayor Edward D. Bergen approved a budget of \$6.8 million.

The CEA is a professional organization of teachers and school administrators. The state branch is affiliated with the National Education Association.

The organization announced earlier this month that any millions of others will crowd into night clubs, hotels and private homes the world over for the organization.

The sanction would not apply to teachers already in the system.
