

Has Anything Really Changed?

The year 1963 was a year of spectacular talent and potential performance being cut down.

Two individuals, Pops John, and President Kennedy, had this talent, and were heading into that performance. Each brought an unusual individual

capacity to his official post. Each took aim at a far-off intangible

Each, in pursuit of that far-off intangible, did not hesitate to challenge the close high fences which had been erected by custom, by the design of the powerful, or by the fright of average people over the possibility of open exposure to change.

Each had begun to move some things in the bold directions he sought. Each, while playing a policy and political kind of game, in which the opposition was measured and respected and, if possible, maneuvered, had also dared touch things supposed to be untouch-

Pope John, with his Ecumenical Couneil, seemed to have things really moving. President Kennedy, after having fought a few nervous defensive battles. was just beginning to push out in the world arena with accumulatingly positive strokes on behalf of both the spirit and the substance of civilization. Then both were cut down.

After each death, there was renewed, broader, more intelligent appreciation of the direction each had selected. With Pope John, this was a grieved intensification of realizations which had already been present. With President Kennedy, there was a new and freer view of the spirit of his Presidency, freer because all partisan obstructions had been, for an awestruck time at least, removed from national thought and feeling.

After both deaths, there was a period of good emotional resolve, which seemed almost virtually unanimous. Those who could not join in it sincerely nevertheless would give it lip service, or simply keep quiet.

There was the illusory hope that suddenly everybody was going to go out and fight wholeheartedly for the same things the fallen leaders had fought for.

Then, in each case, there came scrutiny of the successor. Loyalty to the effort of Pope John seemed to carry over into the selection of Pope Paul, perhaps the man Pope John himself would have chosen. And the new Pope immediately pledged himself and moved himself in the directions pioneered by his predeces-

The new President also began by establishing a sense of continuity. Perhaps all that has really happened since, with the two new leaderships, is the demonstration that, although the goals have not changed, the methods may have.

President Johnson may have the same yearning for civilized standards of behavior among men and beliefs and nations as did his predecessor; if so, he conceivably may bring that quest an earthiness which his predecessor never did

But the real questions aching in the hearts of observers in these times cannot be answered at the top, or in watching the behavior and talents of particular leaders. Did we, the ordinary people, learn

anything?

Did anything change in our hearts? Do we have some slightly finer concept of what we want to do with our living, as individuals, as communities, as a nation, as a world?

· Or have we, already, begun to drift back to ordinariness, back to only a certain amount of interest and dedication, back to the dreadful business of being too busy just getting along? Has anything really happened? Any-

thing that counts? Are we beginning to shuffle off the emotion, the feeling of seriousness, the herp pang of resolve that such things sust be proved not to have happened

Have they begun to cut down the gains Pope John thought he had safely implanted? Are the brutalists at home and abroad beginning to assert their proof, again, that twentieth century man is not capable of President Kennedy's idea of civilized conduct? Both men, the old one and the young

Priority To The Preamble

We have thought for a long time that the making of resolutions has been allowed to become too glib and easy a Easy come, easy go; easily made, eas-

forgotten; these would seem valid descriptions of the spate of resolutions now seasonally in vogue. There is little justification for such

resolution-making. It would be better to make none at all than to make those of such light in-

It would be better to make one slight and very modest resolution which might have some slight chance of observance than to make a thousand big glamorous promises to one's self and to the world. The trouble with present practice lies, it seems to us, in the neglect of the pre-

If, before pledging ourselves to do or not to do so and so, we should force ourselves into the torturesome confessional process of setting forth the realistic and urgent reasons why we had very well better turn some kind of new leaf, we might end up really binding ourselves to some future favors to our-

The right preamble might make the resolution itself quite unnecessary. "I, John Jones, having made an insufferable bore of myself conversationally during the year 1963.

"Having been consistently and offensively great of tongue and small of ear, "Having been supremely interested in everything I have had to say and. "Having been merely marking time,

talking. "Having found each slightest anecdote concerning myself a wide-screen

"Having displayed summit respect for a wide range of opinions so long as they were my own. "Having succeeded in improving my stories so that even those who heard them twice never heard quite the same

thing, and "Having been careful to speak always with a voice loud enough to drown out anybody else trying to wedge in an anecdote or an off-color story or an opinion, and

"Having likewise become most profi cient in the art of backing into a corner anybody who really needed to hear what I might have to say, and

"Having, throughout 1963, and more years before that than I care to recount, carried on this brand of conversational art with a spirited and dedicated air, in which I pretended to a high good opinion of myself and my capaci-"Now therefore I do resolve . . . "

Put in the right preamble, say we, and the resolution itself becomes almost superfluous, or, to exhibit that learning we normally resolve for conversations, de trop, which is, in case you don't follow us, from the French, a language some of us find more expressive than the English whenever, of course, we are fortunate enough to find our talents in a setting and surroundings worthy of some effort which raises communication between human being to some level higher than that of gastronomical gruntings, if we may venture to introduce a casual sample of that kind of alliteration which can also help make conversation an exciting thing, on the right tongue, trippingly, to the properly receptive audience. So much, this year, on how to make a resolution not to keep on boring people.
