TDG to Discuss Transit District

The Town Development Commission (TDG) will meet at 7:30 p.m. tomorrow night in the Municipal Building to consider Manchester's membership in the Greater Hartford Transit District.

The Transit District, created by a 1961 State Legislature enabling act, would have the authority to buy or lease existing bus routes, to set routes and fares, and to subsidize routes that would be unprofitable to run by existing bus companies.

The enabling act was passed at the urging of the Capital Region Planning Agency (CRPA), with an eye toward the future when bus companies throw in the sponge, as far as profitable operations are concerned.

The CRPA-sponsored Greater Hartford Transit District has been approved by six towns, including West Hartford, Westfield, Bloomfield and Windsor to the west of the Connecticut River, and Vernon, east of the river.

Mayor Richard Sheehan of West Hartford, who heads the district's organizational committee, said he would be attending the meeting to discuss the district's organizational committee.

LaBelle Urges Caution CRC Will Persist With Its Changes

The Charter Revision Commission (CRC) adjourned for eight days, after last night's informational public meeting, to allow its subcommittee to change only the semantics of its recommended charter changes, apparently convinced that they are in the best interests of the town.

Despite the concern and criticism expressed by State Atty. John D. LaBelle, who appeared in the capacity of a citizen and taxpayer, the members of the committee will continue to change the words "legislative, executive and administrative," wherever they now appear in the charter, and that they will retain the more than 30 recommendations.

Reader answered that taxes and type of government were not related, but said that he could not object to the change relative to the tenure of the general manager's term. He recommended that a review of the manager's performance be made by the board of directors.

He pointed out that the charter permits continuous review and that the manager can be removed at any time, without waiting five years for a review.

He said that the suggested change "may lead to a witch hunt, and is not within the concept of a good government."

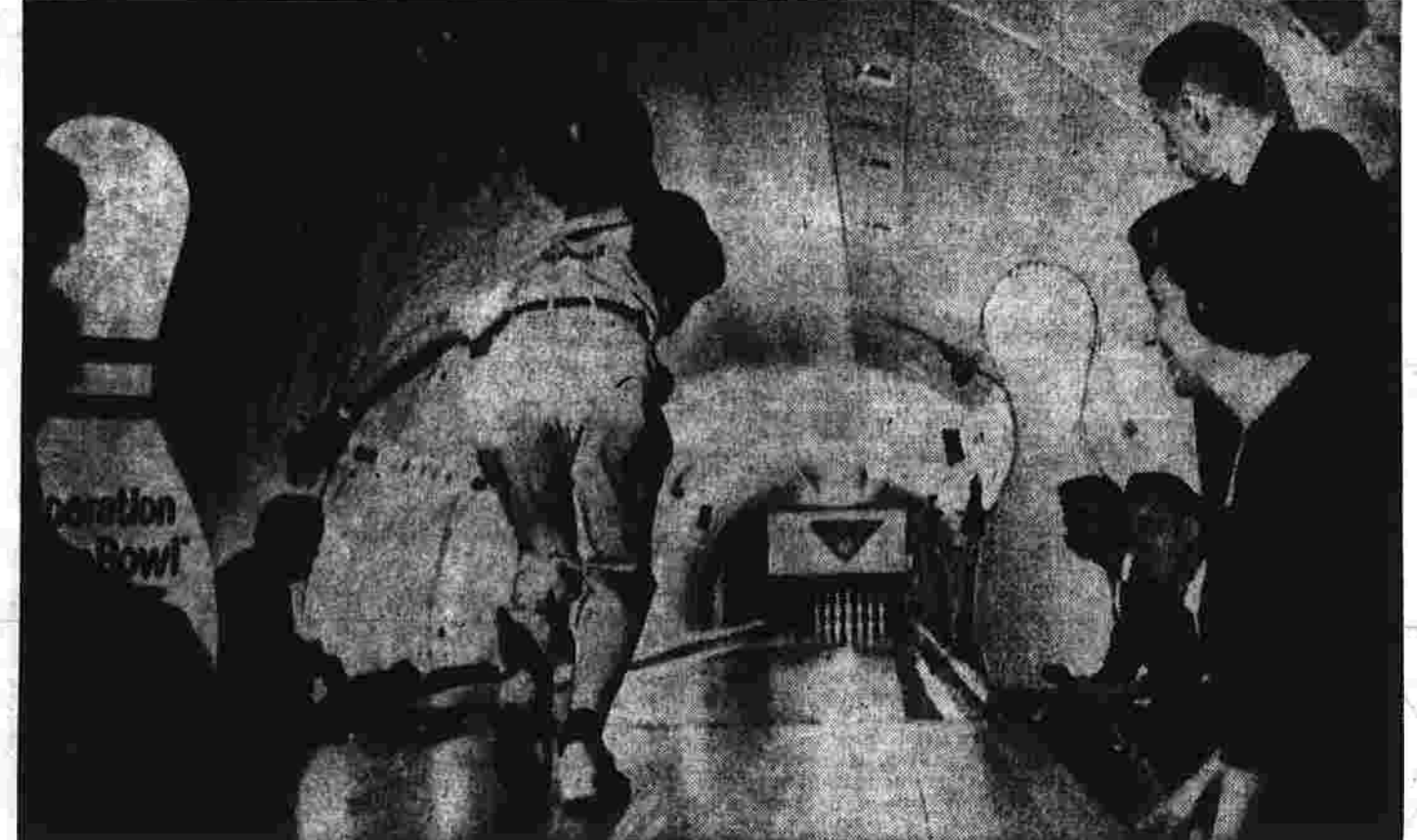
