State Suffers Two Fatalities In Snowstorm

NEW HAVEN (AP)—Connecticut began digging out today from under the blizzard that almost was.

Some seven to 15 inches of snow were piled behind by the near blizzard that blasted through the state yesterday.

Strong northerly winds are expected to continue piling the snow into drifts today adding difficulty to the job of clearing Connecticut's roads and sidewalks.






