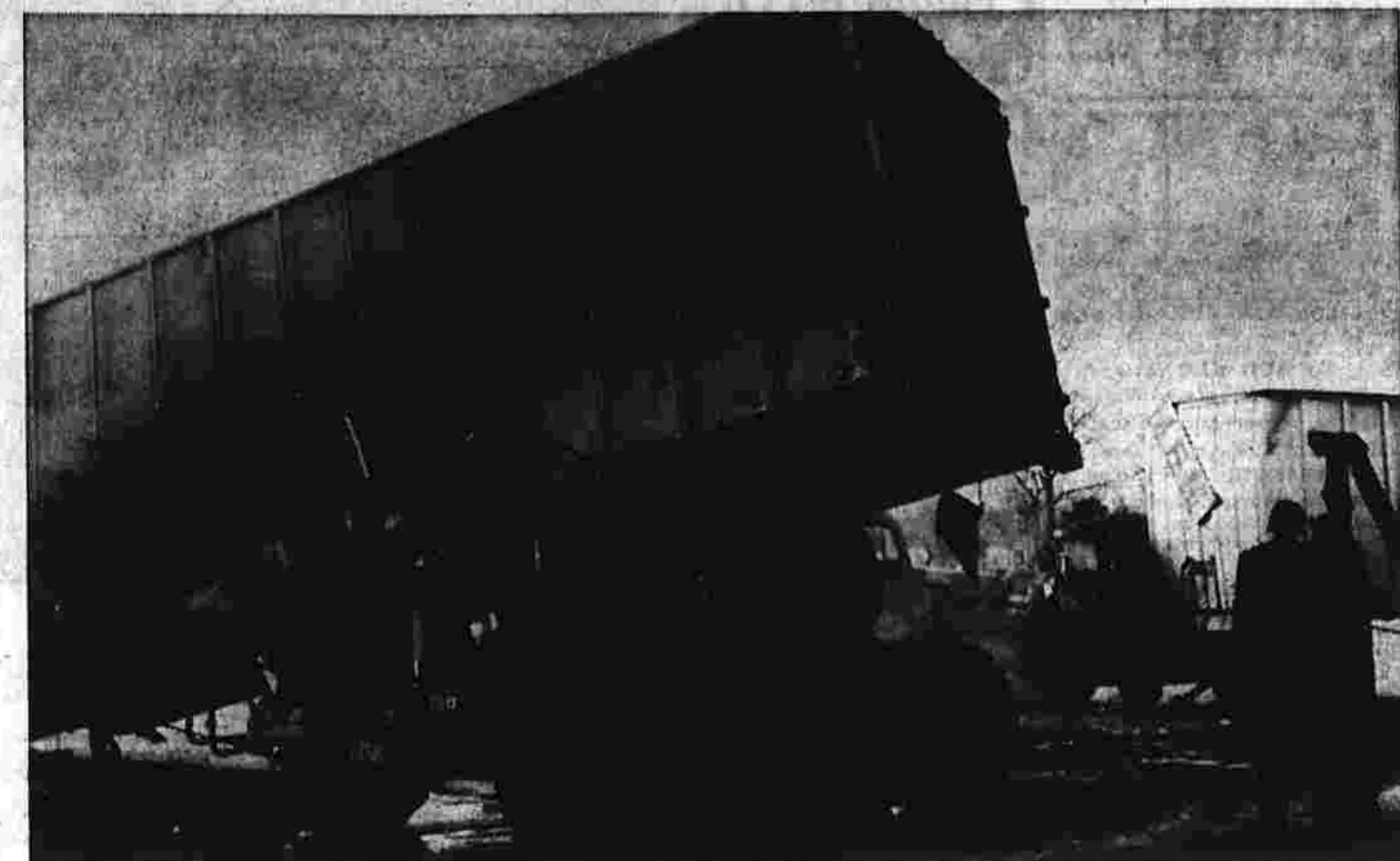

### Stamps In The News

To commemorate the National Nature Conservation Week, the government of Ceylon has announced it will issue a new 5c stamp of unusual design. The stamp is divided in half with the left side showing a portion of the island. The colors are blue and brown, reports the British Crown Agents in Washington.

The same source reports that eight new stamps have been issued by the Commonwealth of New Hebrides and are the first of 24 stamps to make up a new definitive series. Design for the new set was the result of a competition by local artists.

Many nations have issued stamps honoring the 10th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights adopted by the United Nations. The latest countries to issue such stamps are the Republic of Congo and the Philippines. Togo and Pakistan. The Chinese stamp commemorates the 20th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China.

The American Topical Association has announced it will publish a new handbook entitled "Medical History in Philately." The author is Dr. Conrad J. Nevelev. The book will contain over 100 pages and show 8,000 stamps. The book represents 25 years of study by Dr. Nevelev on this subject. It will sell for \$5 and can be purchased directly from the American Topical Association, 1200 N. 10th St., Milwaukee, Wis.

Belgium has announced the issuance of two new 1 franc commemorative stamps honoring Jules Verne, founder of the Royal Academy of Language and French Literature, and architect Henry Van de Velde. Both stamps bear portraits of the individuals honored.

Uruguay has issued two regular stamps and two airmails to honor the Uruguayan sailing vessel "Alferes Campos" which made a trip around the world with a crew of three men. The 10 Centavos and 20 C show 3 anchors. The 90 C and 140 C airmails depict a sailing vessel and ocean waves. The ship made the successful trip in two years with a route starting at Montevideo going up the east coast of South America, through the Panama Canal, on through the Pacific to Indonesia and Ceylon, traversing the Red and Mediterranean seas, through Gibraltar and finally back to Montevideo.

### Viet Cong's Annie Oakley Clever Foe

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—The wags here black her long and flowing in the traditional Vietnamese style. She is known to be flamboyant, assertive and cruel.

Her name is Kim Loan. Some say she is 38 and beautiful. Others say she is 28 and ugly.

All agree that Kim Loan is an authentic pistol packin' mama who is rapidly becoming a legend in the countryside south of Saigon.

Kim Loan actually has two pistols strapped to her tiny waist—and both are carried for the Communist Viet Cong cause.

"She is just the sort of symbol you could expect in the Communist to come up with in Viet Nam," an American observer noted. "She is clever, brazen and elusive. Vietnamese peasants talk of her exploits with humor and awe."

Kim Loan's rise to prominence has taken just over one year. Her husband, a Viet Cong district chief, was killed by government forces. A few days later she left her young son behind, a boy and girl, with her husband's relatives in a strategic hamlet south of the Long An Province Capital of Tan An. She headed into the swamps to join the Viet Cong.

She soon emerged as a bold guerrilla in Long An's normally all-male territorial units, winning the right to carry first one pistol and then the other. In recent months she has risen to be the Communist's chief military commander in the Tan An area.

Province authorities are well aware of Kim Loan's operations. They know she travels with a bodyguard of two men armed with submachine guns.

One of her duties is collecting taxes for the Viet Cong. And she can be tough. A village leader province authorities that Kim Loan visited him, demanding tax.

When he pleaded he could not afford to pay, she snatched a 20-man platoon, and she threatened one of her weapons on the table. The man refused to get the money. When he returned, she said, "I was too slow. Speak to this one, too," and slapped the other pistol down.

He quickly brought more money.

She is responsible for all espionage and subversive work against the government in her region. In recent months she has recruited 30 men from her old village to join the Viet Cong. Province authorities are anxious to apprehend her. **Rights Gains Forecast,  
Stress Shifts to Jobs**

**By DON MCKEE**  
ATLANTA, Ga. (AP)—"More in '64," describes the outlook for the civil rights movement which last year picked up great momentum with widespread mass demonstrations.  
This slogan of Edwin C. Berry, executive director of Chicago's Urban League, carries both the hope of civil rights leaders for more changes and the resolve for more demonstrations, unless the changes come.  
Indications of what will happen came from Associated Press interviews of about 50 white and Negro leaders in nearly 20 cities, North and South.  
The outlook for 1964:  
1. A pickup in demonstrations, but they will not likely reach the 1963 proportions.  
2. Civil rights activities will increase in numerous places anytime after the first week of February, said Floyd McFie, NAACP secretary in Tampa. He said: "We feel Negro voter registration will be a telling factor in both the primary and general election."  
3. In Florida, plans are to raise Negro voter registration by about 20,000, Robert Saunders, NAACP secretary in Tampa, said: "We feel Negro voter registration will be a telling factor in both the primary and general election."  
4. Voter registration. With national elections coming up, voting strength will get more attention.

6. A big drive will be made by civil rights groups to get administration measures through Congress.  
7. If there is no civil rights bill approved, then it means a possible upswing, said Andrew Freeman, executive secretary of the Urban League in Philadelphia.  
8. The Rev. Fred L. Shuttlesworth of Birmingham, Ala., who heads the Birmingham Integration movement, said: "We are in a state of hopefully waiting to see what Congress will do."  
9. Mayor Malcolm Maclean of Savannah, Ga., agreed that businessmen and officials generally preferred to head off street marches or other protests by making concessions.  
Reaction to the civil rights movement has brought change in employment practices, said Ed Marwick of Chicago, chairman of the Mayor's Commission on Human Relations.  
During 1963 employment opportunities in white collar, technical, and professional jobs for many closed to non-whites multiplied beyond expectations," Marwick said. "This pace will continue during 1964."  
Concessions have reduced the speed or threat of demonstrations in a number of cities.  
"We've found more willingness by some city officials to at least sit down and talk," said the Rev. Dr. J. Edgar Hoover, NAACP president in Des Moines, W. Va., scene of street marches last summer.  
Mayor Julian R. Stinson of Danville said he believed there would be a slackening of demonstrations in the city, but "the threat of demonstrations remains if they can get outside financial help."  
In Tallahassee, Fla., the Rev. C. K. Steele, an NAACP leader, said: "We have the feeling demonstrations won't be necessary. There are signs of change for the better."  
3. Growing emphasis on better jobs.  
As the obvious racial barriers fall, the civil rights drive shifts its point of attack to economic improvement of the Negro.  
"It's turning to economic matters now," said Dr. John R. Cunningham, chairman of the Human Relations Commission in Charlotte, N.C. "Every area of the public life has been integrated here."  
In St. Louis, employment opportunities were given as the basic reason for quiet smoking. Dr. Curtis Corbin, who is leading for more Negro workers at a bank. He said he expects demonstrations to be stepped up, hitting a peak next summer.

## Gov. Faubus Setting Sights On 6th Term

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — A few years ago the idea of a third-term governor seemed preposterous in Arkansas, which had a 50-year tradition of "two terms and out."

Now Gov. Orval E. Faubus, a mountaineer whose name once was a symbol of resistance to school desegregation, talks like a man who will seek a sixth term. He says he will announce his plans next month.

His decision apparently will hinge on a private poll he uses frequently to sound public opinion.

Setting possible public debate for desegregation, Faubus used National Guard troops to block integration of Central High School in Little Rock in 1957. Arkansas responded by breaking its third-term tradition and gave him 70 per cent of the vote in the 1958 Democratic primary. In Arkansas, the primary usually decides the governor's race.

Now he has held the office nine years and the hard core of his opposition is weary from fruitless battles. Out him in 1960 and 1962. His fans are wondering not so much about whether he will run as where a worthy opponent can be found.

So far only State Rep. Hardy Croxon of Rogers, a proponent of government reform, has demonstrated a desire to oppose Faubus.

But the names of former Gov. Sid McMath and former U.S. Rep. Dale Alford, two of his opponents in 1960, are mentioned often enough to make Faubus take critical stabs at them.

Two years ago Faubus appeared weary. A hard and long fight for a \$60-million state construction bond issue was just behind him. He had feuded for years with the powerful Arkansas Education Association. A losing battle for a school closing constitutional amendment had followed his fourth-term success in 1960.

Faubus, saying he wanted to write, announced in a dramatic television appearance that he was retiring from politics.

A week later reports circulated that he was having second thoughts. A month later he was thought for a fifth term and he polled 51 per cent of the first primary votes to escape a runoff election for the fourth time.

Now Faubus does not talk of retirement. The state government has run smoothly for the last year. He has settled his dispute with the education. An expanding economy is bringing revenue faster than it is being spent.

In this tranquil atmosphere Faubus has talked, for the first time since 1958, of what he will do if he is re-elected. His main platform, he said, will be a rural road construction program.

His last promise was negative—that he would fight school integration. He kept his word, closing Little Rock schools during the 1958-59 term and by proposing the school closing amendment through the legislature.

By 1960 he had all but dropped integration as a campaign topic and he ignored it in 1962. Both years he campaigned mainly on government efficiency and economic advancement of the state.

Most observers believe voters are sufficiently satisfied to elect him again this year—under a rural road banner or no banner at all.

Indeed, his main opposition may come in the general election—if Republicans can get Winthrop Rockefeller to run.

Rockefeller has been a potential GOP candidate since 1960, but observers believe he will wait to challenge someone less experienced than Faubus.

## Ghana in Trouble On Marxist Road

ACCRA, Ghana (AP) — Along the road to Maridim the country led by Kwame Nkrumah is running into a host of troubles. Repeated attempts to kill the "Redeemer" help build up an atmosphere of crisis. So do the lists of political prisoners. The nation's balance sheet is in the red, too. Thousands of extra police have been on emergency duty in the capital since an assassin tried to kill Nkrumah with a bomb in August 1962. Cars and trucks entering Accra are searched at roadblocks. The government reported another attempt on Nkrumah two weeks ago. The removal of Police Commissioner Erasmus Madjley and eight other senior officers followed. Government-controlled newspapers called for a clamp of police, the civil service and the judiciary.

It has been renamed Kwame Nkrumah Ideological Institute. It apparently is being revamped to train party cadres under one party rule. The economy, sailing smoothly just six months ago, has sprung a leak. Prices rose 20 per cent in 18 months. Wage ceilings have allowed no pay increases for two years. There have been brief shortages in Accra of such commodities as flour and sugar. The \$700-million nestegg Ghana inherited from England on gaining independence in 1947 is down to \$140 million. "About everything that could go wrong has gone wrong," says one businessman in this West African capital. The dynamic son of a village goldsmith wields virtually dictatorial powers over seven million countrymen. The ruling party promotes militant socialism. Much domestic conflict seems to have resulted from opposition to it by intellectuals, businessmen and conservative tribal elements. The Kwame Nkrumah Institute for Economics and Politics

### Democratic Veep Must Have Finely Etched Credentials

 WASHINGTON (AP)—The running mate may be a more delicate task for President Lyndon B. Johnson than it has been in recent decades. He has some odd dilemmas.

Most leading Democratic politicians, including southerners, take it for granted that Johnson, with his Texas base, will pick a liberal—perhaps a Catholic—from a southern state. Such states are expected to be his last battle grounds in 1964.

But many party leaders see the President's needs as much more special than this. Their views, sampled by this reporter in a check of states coast to coast, suggest he may be looking for a remarkable composite of youth and wide experience with a clear line of inheritance from the late John F. Kennedy. It is a rich market.

The question of a candidate's possible identity with what many political figures now are calling the "Kennedy tradition" may prove the toughest of all his running mate.

The key to the puzzle is Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy, a Democrat of national reputation who likely will be on all vice presidential lists for months to come.

The other principal prospect is Senator Hubert Humphrey and Eugene McCarthy of Minnesota. Places Corps Director Sargent Shriver (who is related to the Kennedys by marriage), U.N.

# CRC Voted to Send Proposals to Board

The Charter Revision Commission (CRC) which, on a sweltering night in July, had heatedly rejected a suggestion to scrap Manchester's form of government, last night with the temperature hovering around the zero mark, coolly and unanimously voted to recommend charter changes designed to drastically amend the present manager-council form of government.

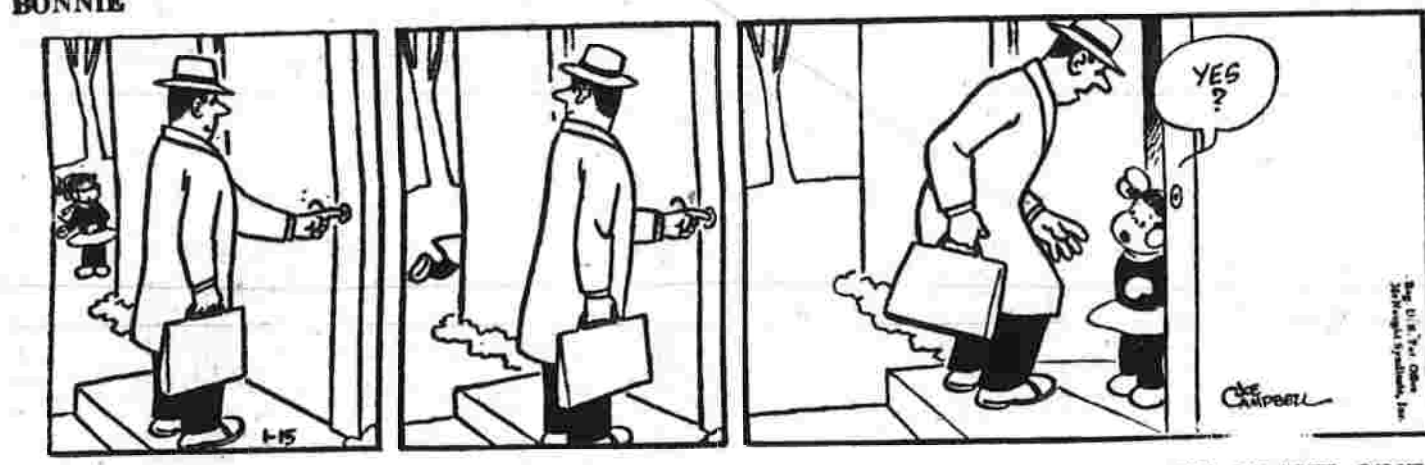

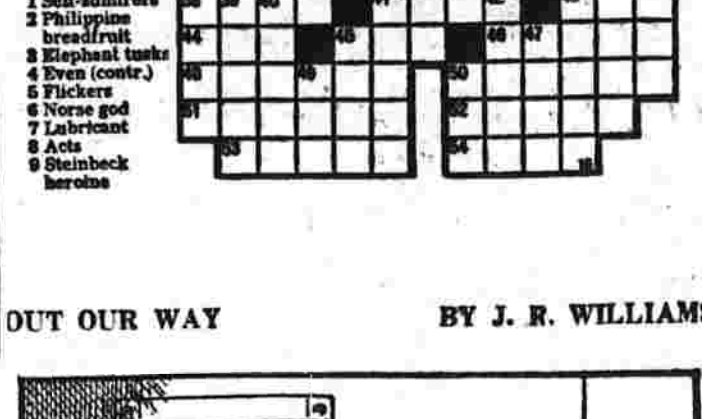

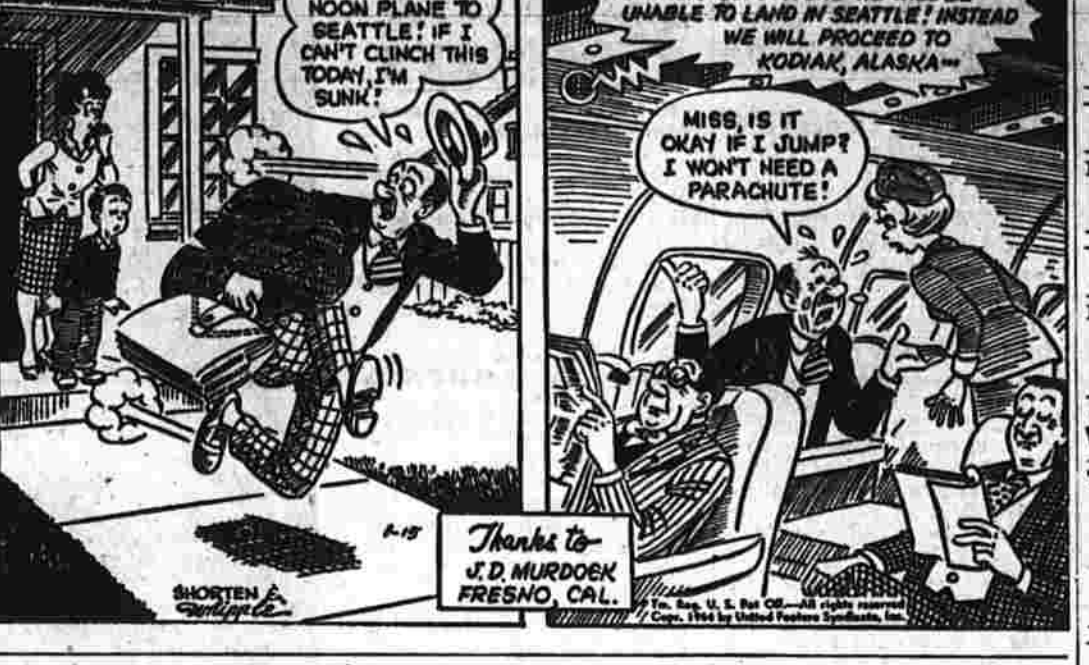
