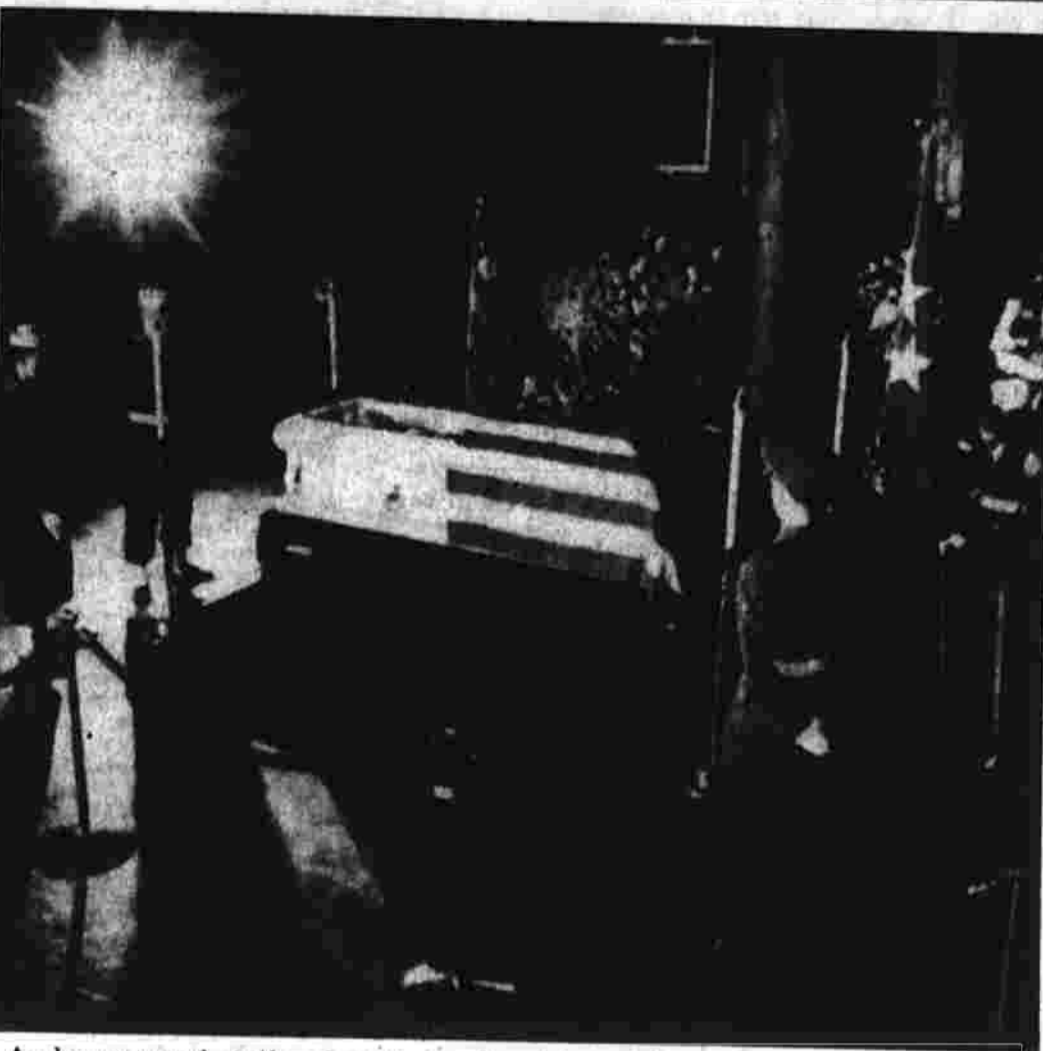

You Should Know...

Joseph A. Cataldi

Joseph A. Cataldi is that rarest of men, a man who is not only a conservationist, but also a politician. He is the chairman of the Conservation Commission (CCC).

In fact, all seven members of the CCC are conservationists, but Cataldi is the only one who is also a politician. He is the only member of the CCC who has served in the state legislature.

When General Manager Richard Martin last May appointed Cataldi to this commission, he chose a man who had a proven record in the outdoors and in the legislature.

Cataldi holds the distinction of being the only member in the history of the Manchester Sportsmen's Association and the Manchester Coon and Fox Club to hold simultaneous office in both organizations.

In 1962 and 1963 he served as president of the Sportsmen's Association while holding the post of secretary of the Coon and Fox Club.

Cataldi is proud of the fact that during his administration of the 66-member Sportsmen's Association, the group spent \$100,000 to acquire 24-acre ponds on the club's 140-acre pond.

The pond has been stocked with over 500 Rainbow trout and Brookies, some as long as 21 inches.

Not far distant, on North River Road, is the 110-acre Manchester Coon and Fox Club, where its 100 members enjoy hunting, fishing and good fellowship.

Cataldi's love of fishing and hunting goes back about 30 years, and serves as a great backdrop for his interest in preserving Manchester's nature spots for the younger generation.

Cataldi was born in Hartford on Jan. 3, 1914, the son of Anthony and Dorothy Cataldi.

When he was but an infant, his family moved to East Hartford, where he attended schools.

His parents still live in East Hartford. While in school, he played a wide variety of sports.

In 1937, Cataldi married the former Clementine Kaniell of Lowell, Mass., and the couple settled in Manchester, first on St. Lawrence St., then Ridgebrook St., and in 1952, at their present address, 33 McKinley St.

At the time of his marriage, Cataldi was working for the Gotham Towel Supply Co., but still being a conservationist, he worked for Pratt and Whitney's East Hartford plant in the assembly department, and in 1945 was elevated to his present position of foreman.

His love of sports, carried over from his youth, led him to become a coach for two years, a West Side Red midget basketball team, and to take up bowling.

Sleith Makes Plea For Lower Taxes

"Out of all the towns and cities in the State of Connecticut of 20,000 population or more," William Sleith told town directors at a public hearing on the proposed 1964-65 town budget last night, "Manchester is far and away the most expensive town to live in or to conduct a business in."

"Based on the 1963 mill rate levied on the assessed percentage of taxes on a \$20,000 home... would cost you \$853 in taxes."

"You could support that home in West Hartford for \$488; in New Haven for \$488; and so on across the whole length and breadth of this state."

"Nowhere will it cost you anywhere near \$853 as it does in Manchester to support a \$20,000 home."

"Why (must) Manchester tax its people so severely in order to live in what, I think, most of us believe to be a rich town, an average town?"

"Manchester falls in the lower third of the state's cities in its ratio of Grand List dollars per resident. (This is simply another way of saying town wealth is small in proportion to the number of people.)"

"What I am saying is that Manchester is not a rich town, probably... it can never become a rich town. Yet it doggedly insists on acting like one. The more we return to a spending philosophy where ability to pay is the theme, I am sure nothing ahead for this town but economic, civic and cultural stagnation."

Sleith was among about 100 Manchester taxpayers and educators who, despite a persistent rain, came to listen or speak at the directors at the annual budget hearing at the Wadsworth School auditorium, Broad St.

About 15 spoke, half of them calling with Sleith for abolition of the town's present 42-mill tax rate, the rest asking for support from the present rate for part or all of General Manager Martin's proposed 1964-65 town budget.

Mrs. Eleanor L. Owen, 50 Plymouth Lane, the dissident member of the Citizens Advisory Council on the Community College, asked that the directors retain the \$25,000 budget cut in the community college budget project as being responsible for serious injuries to a Wadsworth School child who fell into an open sewer excavation near the school last year.

"Each year the professional staff of the city prepare public works plans for the city, and present them to your board. Then the great horror of taxes is brought to the fore. There are many needed projects on the shelf because of a lack of money. But the backing should be decreasing, not increasing."

"Do you really know what it costs to run a school?" he asked. "If you want a discount education, then go ahead and hire a discount teacher."

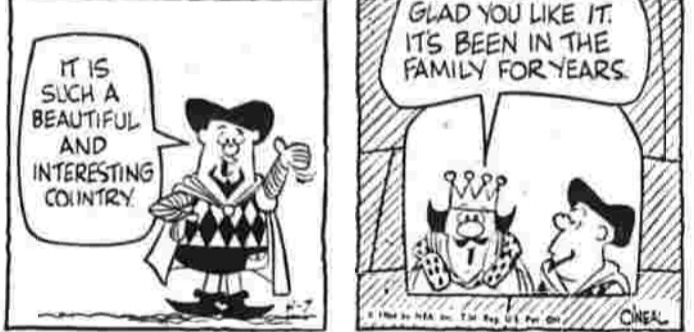

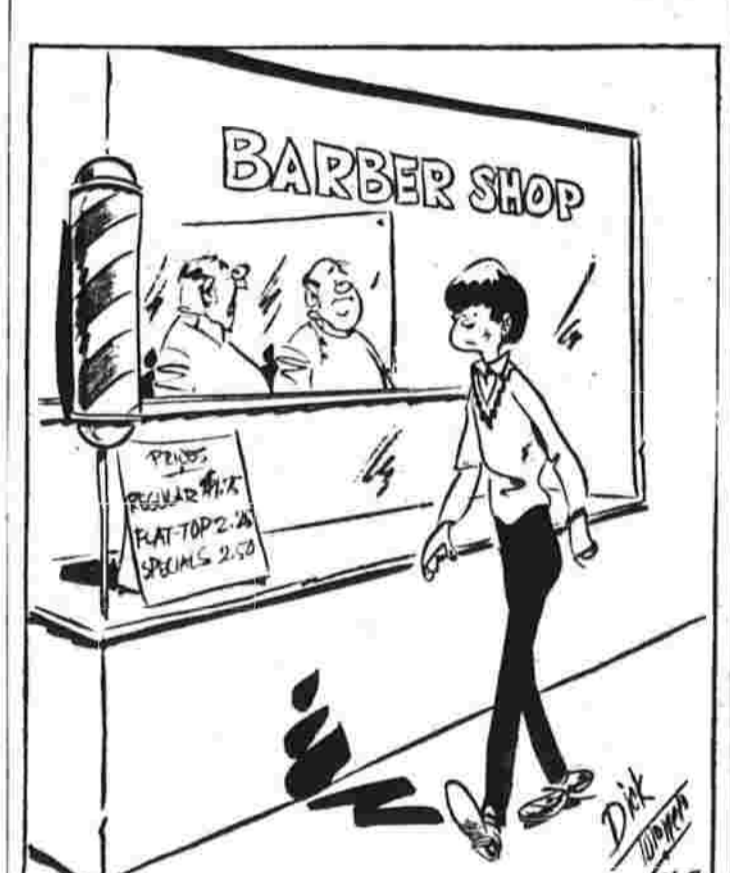

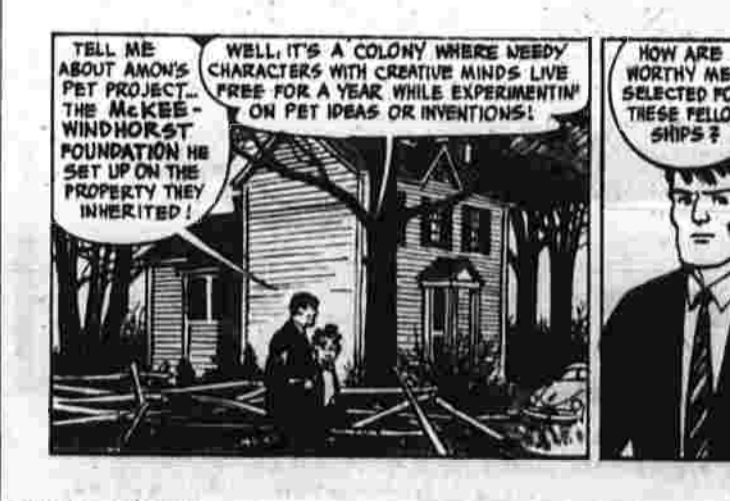
