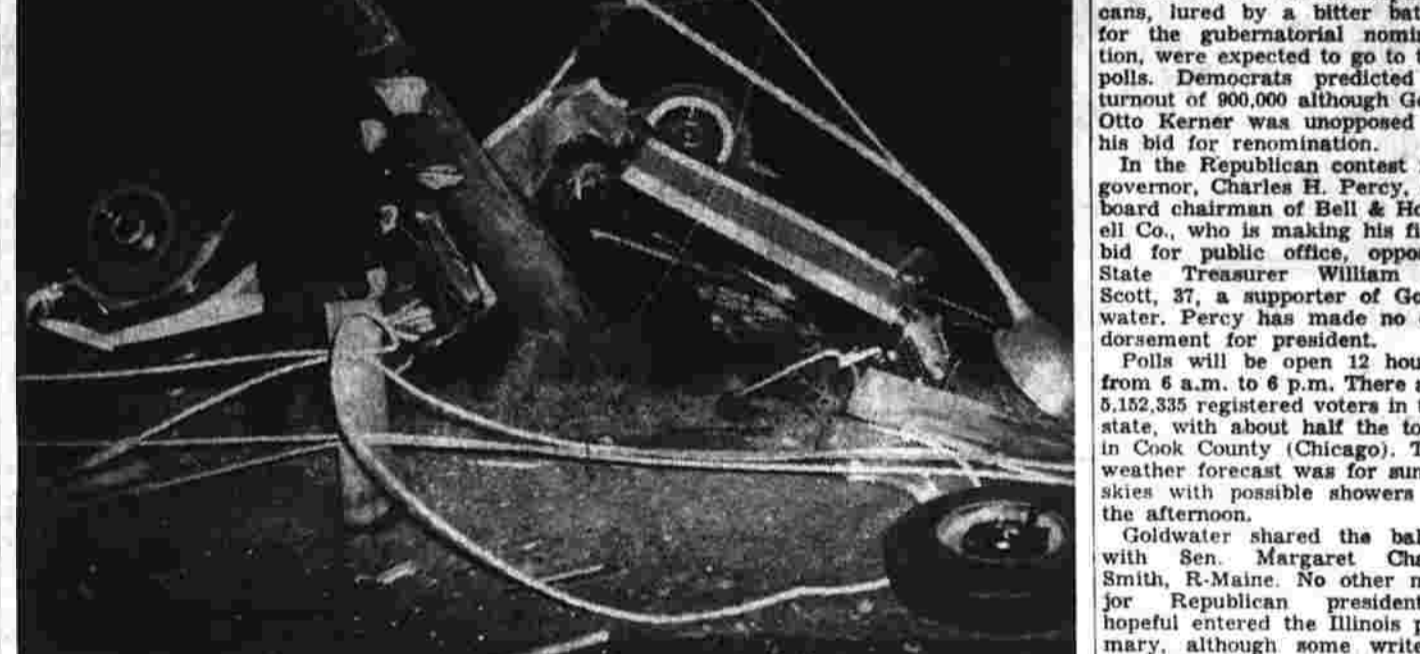

If you follow one simple direction in this test will actually give you a good review of the columns to date. The direction: DO NOT SKIP ANY STATEMENTS in your circling them as true (T) or false (F).

1. When you encounter a section in your pre-reading which is difficult to understand, skip it and save it for your thorough reading.
2. When you meet a new word in your reading, don't risk guessing.
3. He knows the most about biochemistry since he has the most notes on it.
4. Pre-reading is helpful if you've prepared your questions first.
5. Your outline's order should follow the book you liked best.
6. If, besides pulse, it feel other movement in the throat while reading, then I am a word-by-word reader.
7. Skipping and skimming are good only when you need information or opinion.
8. The Reading Laboratory Program devoted its eight steps to save time for students with poor or falling grades.
9. Pre-reading gives you the questions which through reading will answer.
10. The one with the fewest correct answers is doing most justice to memory.

12. When you encounter difficult sections while pre-reading, convert topic sentences into questions of HOW, WHEN, WHY, etc.
13. In preparing an outline, follow only chronological order.
14. When you read in phrases and with increased eye span, you are concentrating on techniques, not the book's content.
15. Once your notes are placed in order and your outline complete, let the table contents guide your summarizing.

16. He should take notes only of the essentials in his reading, omitting incidentals.
17. He reads slowly, but he gets the most understanding possible.
18. Guess a word's meaning from context, then check the dictionary.
19. It is sufficient practice, speed-reading techniques become an unconscious part of our reading.
20. When reading for relaxation only, ignore the Reading Laboratory program.
21. Establishing the long-range and long-lasting personal benefits is my best help to concentration in today's school assignments.
22. Most students, unless they can see here-and-now personal good in assigned reading, will have difficulty in concentrating.
23. After I have mastered the eight steps, reading for relaxation will be faster than ever before, though slower than reading for opinions.
24. Because faster reading will occupy his mind with more ideas, the really bright student benefits from the Reading Laboratory Program at least as much as the slower student.

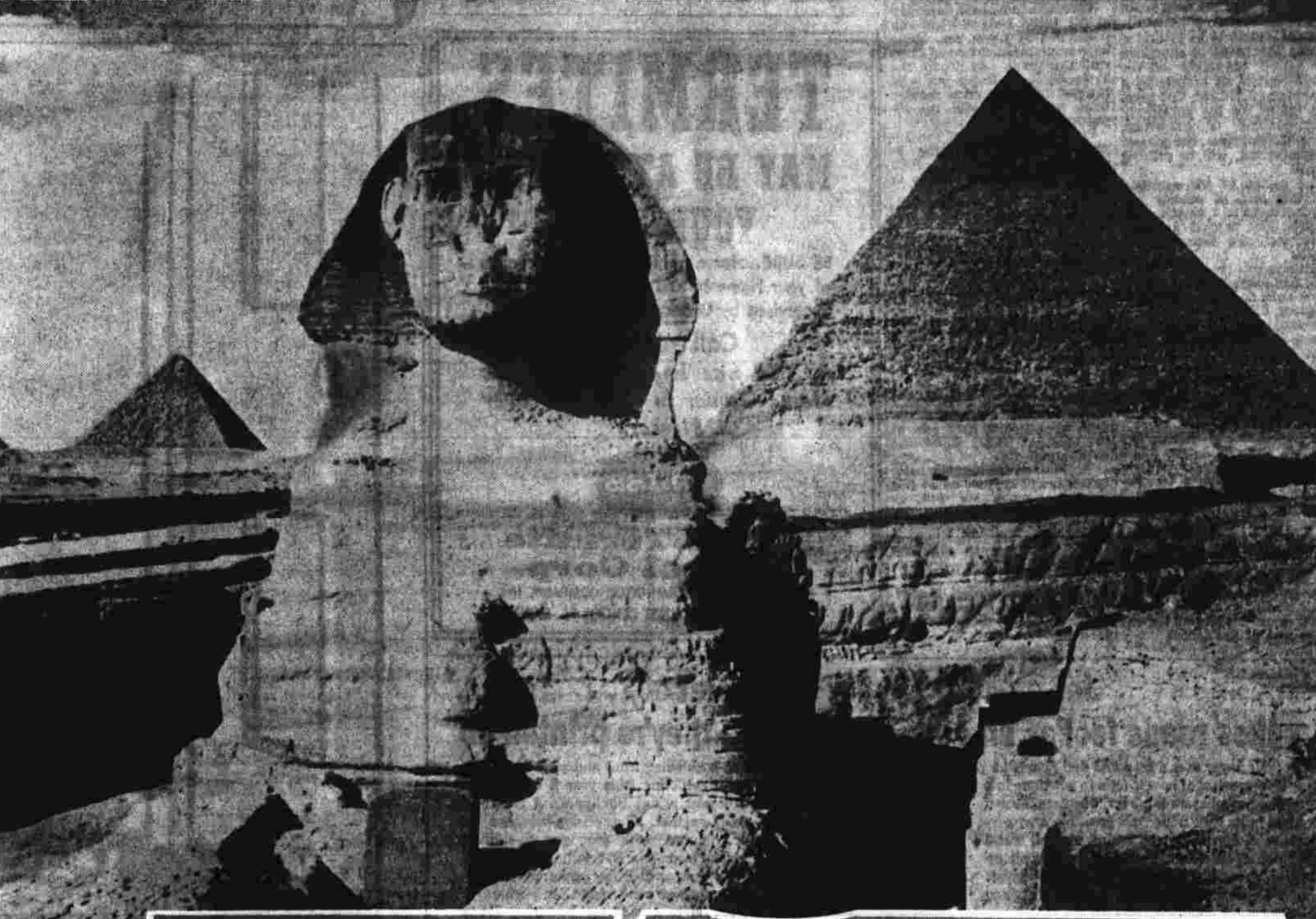

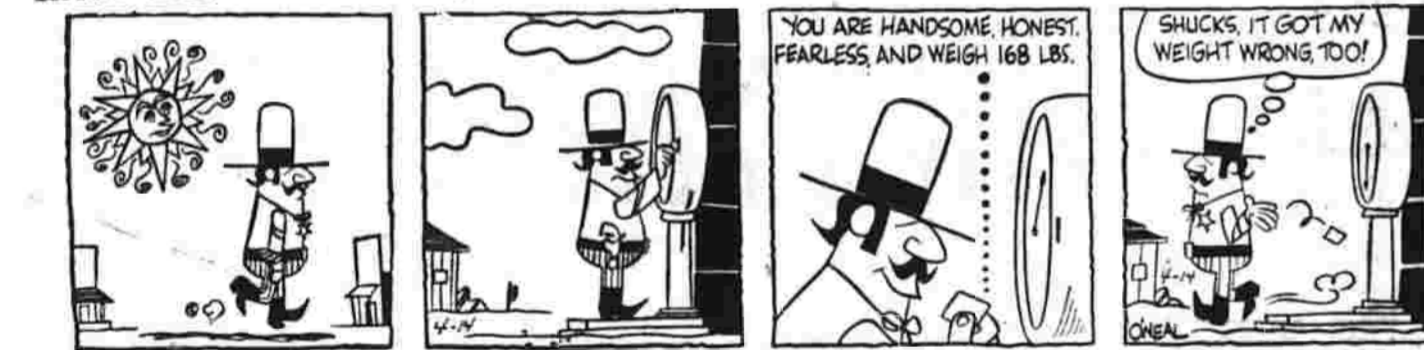

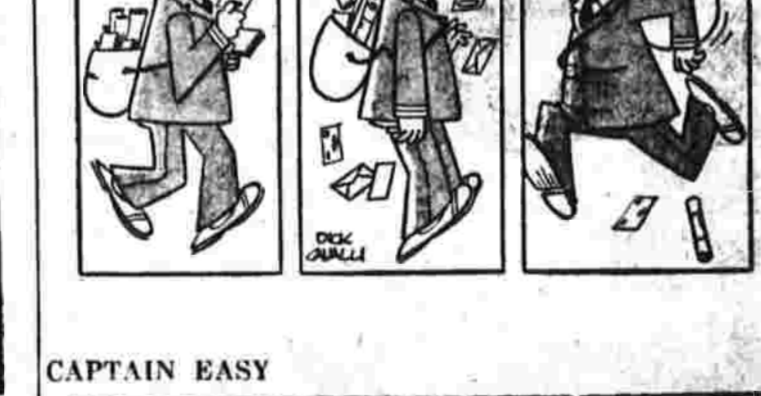

Rachel Carson Dies, Wrote 'Silent Spring'

SILVER SPRING, Md. (AP)—Death by cancer has befallen Rachel Carson whose book "Silent Spring" created international controversy with its charge that man was poisoning the earth and himself with chemicals he had poured into the soil. Carson, 56, a biologist who became a best-selling author in 1961, died Tuesday afternoon at her home. She learned five years ago, apparently while working on "Silent Spring," that she had cancer. Her book helped inspire a White House report last May calling for stronger federal laws on pesticides and their use.
