NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP) — "Some people may be born to be fat," a Virginia physician says.

Experiments with fat rats and jump mice seem to support his theory, Dr. William Fawcett, chairman of internal medicine at the University of Virginia Medical School, said Thursday.

The tests indicate that the rodents grow fat as a result of abnormality in the control center of their brains, Fawcett told physicians attending a postgraduate course at the University of Virginia Medical School.

Fawcett said other rats he has examined have the same abnormality of their brains. "We've always assumed that people who are obese eat too much," he continued, "but our

De Gaulle Defends Aid and N-Force

PARIS (AP) — President Charles de Gaulle defended his program of aid to North Vietnam against critics who think it might aid the enemy.

France is spending approximately 1.8 per cent of its gross national product on foreign aid, the highest percentage in the world and more than double the 72 per cent of the United States.

De Gaulle, 72, made no new policy declaration. His chief purpose appeared to be to reply to mounting criticism in France.

Since he returned to power in 1958, De Gaulle has boosted education spending from 13 to 16 per cent of the national budget and increased highway construction from 7 to 12 per cent.

France's revenues have risen 30 per cent during the five-year period.

"I think it constitutes a very dangerous invasion of our rights as Americans, and as human beings," he said.

This calculation always had to be in some degree of conflict with the actual facts of life, which were that we already had more industrial production capacity than we knew how to use, more production than we knew how to consume. Why should we keep expanding to produce beyond our own needs, just because somebody else, way behind us, was obviously attempting to try to reach, some day, a level of production which might begin to answer his needs?
