### Greeks in Cyprus Break Cease-Fire, Shell Castle

went into operation March 27. The Greek army, which was apparently held off by them in the mixed Greek-Turkish villages of the western port of Paphos.

A U.N. spokesman said the Greeks were attacked when they intervened to halt a gun fight between Greek and Turkish Cypriots. He said the Greeks fired 60 rounds before being hit.

Both the U.N. command and the Turkish Cypriots had looked with skepticism on the cease-fire, which was announced after both the U.N. command and Greek Cypriots had been told that the U.N. command was planning to drop the ceasefire.

That and other Cyprus Greek Cypriot president, Archbishop Makarios, and the Turkish Cypriot vice president, Fazıl Küçük, to resume without delay any further bloodshed in the four-month-old general strife. In his "program of reasonable objectives," he urged a general amnesty, disarming of the military, and assurance of movement, establishing a U.N.-Greek-Turkish patrol, resuming public services to the Turkish Cypriots, recalling Turkish civil servants to their jobs with the Greek-dominated government, registration of Greek and Turkish Cypriot numbers of the police force, and return of Turkish Cypriots to their homes in selected areas under U.N. protection.
