WASHINGTON (AP)—Pronouncing Sen. Barry Goldwater has indicated he plans to campaign against Scranton in Dallas Tuesday—and it is much the same as that he waged against New York Gov. Nelson Rockefeller in their three presidential primary campaigns.

Goldwater answered Scranton's criticism without naming the Pennsylvania governor—and made a call for Republican unity by the terms of his rebuttal.

"Please, don't unite yourselves against anything but the opposition," he urged more than 10,000 Republicans at the Texas GOP convention without naming the Pennsylvania governor—and made a call for Republican unity by the terms of his rebuttal.

Out to counter Scranton's charge that a Goldwater ticket would spell defeat for other GOP candidates in November, the senator said he intends to lead Republicans to victory "from the courthouse to the Congress."

"I don't believe that any one Republican could destroy the Republican party," he said.

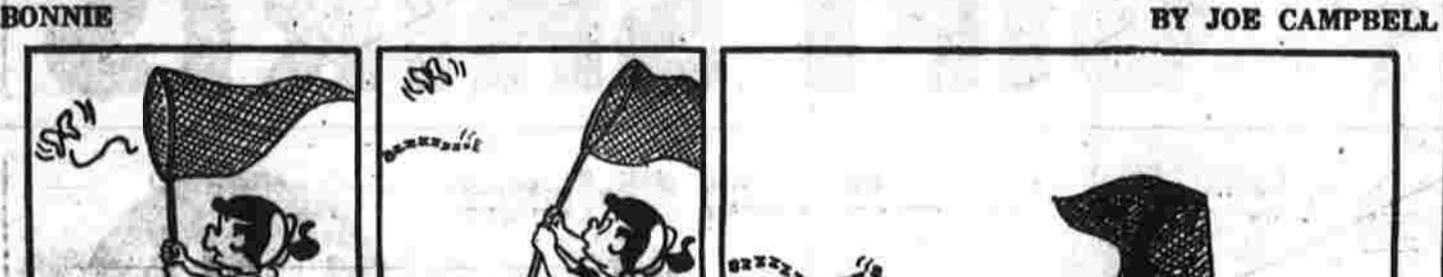

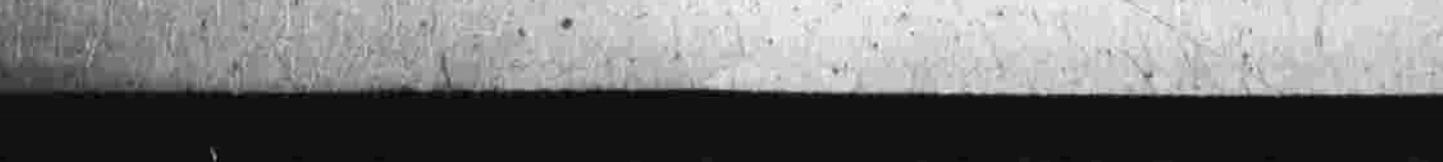

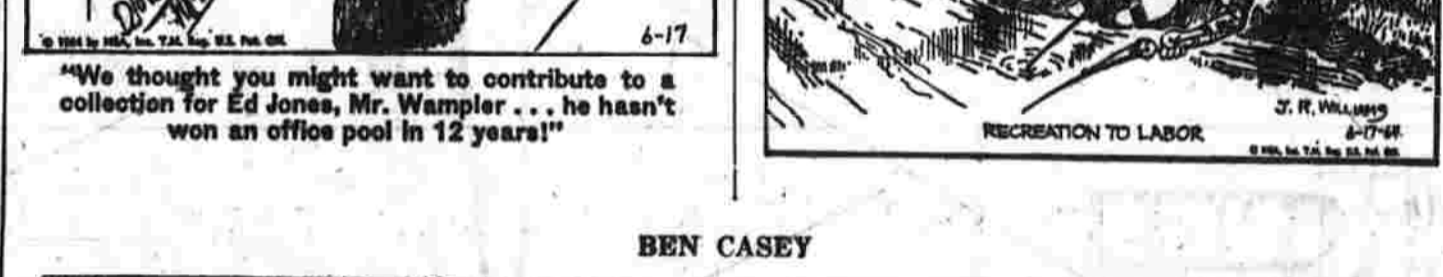
