

## Ailing India Leader Asked To Delegate His Workload

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—Ailing Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri was reported in generally good condition today but more of his official schedule was canceled.

For the first time there was a public suggestion that the 59-year-old prime minister, who reportedly was stricken with a mild heart attack Friday night, should delegate some of his responsibilities.

The Times of India said no prime minister can afford to do without a full-time foreign minister, as Shastri does. The paper called for "a more liberal delegation of responsibility."

Shastri, like his predecessor, the late Prime Minister Nehru, retained the foreign minister's portfolio when he formed his government. He also serves as minister for atomic energy.

A government spokesman issued this statement on Shastri's condition: "The prime minister's temperature is near normal now. He slept well last night. His general condition is good and he is cheerful."

"In a couple of days the

prime minister may be in a position to attend to the business of government," an authoritative source said. Sunday night, Shastri's son, Hari, said his father would need at least a month's rest, and there was speculation some of his aides would take the reins of government temporarily.

The son's statement indicated India was again on the verge of a period of temporary leadership. After the late prime minister Nehru suffered a stroke in January, he turned over many of the burdens of his office to Shastri. Since Shastri lacked Nehru's authority, the government was beset by indecision.

The government slumped into another leadership crisis when Nehru died of a heart attack May 27, but it ended quickly with Shastri's election as prime minister June 1.

Shastri, 59, is officially reported ailing from "overstrain and temperature," but authoritative informants said he suffered a mild heart attack Friday.

The diminutive prime minister almost died of a heart attack in 1949. The government's statement on his present condi-

tion did not allay fears that he was critically ill.

Shastri had been working up to 18 hours a day, attempting to give new impetus to solving the country's monumental problems.

A government official said Shastri awakened in a cheerful mood Sunday. He got out of bed to change clothes, had morning tea with his family and later ate a little rice and butter, informants said.

### Flies Home After Ending Saigon Duty

WASHINGTON (AP)—Henry Cabot Lodge declared today that he considered it a higher duty for him to return home and fight for the Republican presidential nomination for Gov. William W. Scranton than to remain as U.S. ambassador to South Viet Nam.

He told a White House news conference, after receiving a glowing farewell from President Johnson, that he felt the war in South Viet Nam was "on the track" while "I felt the Republican party is not on the track."

Affirming that he did not believe it was too late for Scranton to head off the front-running Sen. Barry Goldwater for his party's presidential nomination, Lodge strongly indicated he would attempt to enlist former President Dwight D. Eisenhower's active support for Scranton.

Lodge helped engineer Eisenhower's nomination in 1952. He said he had been talking to the general since 1941, when they were both on Army maneuvers in Louisiana, and that he was "too old to stop now."

Lodge returned to a theme he expressed on his arrival four hours earlier, at Andrews Air Force Base—the duty of both political parties to nominate men who are prudent and not impulsive.

He said that the president of the United States is the man who makes the decision about the use of the atomic bomb.

"That is something that is very real," he said.

"There is a threshold below which no party should go in nominating a man for the presidency," he emphasized.

"Both parties should nominate for president a man who is not impulsive or imprudent," Lodge said he does not expect to become the campaign manager for Scranton but expects to do a little telephoning.

## LBJ Links Peace, War Preparedness

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Johnson says the United States "must be prepared to seek war" to keep its freedom, yet ready to "seek just compromise" to achieve peace.

This was Johnson's keynote message Sunday as he ended a three-day trip into Michigan and Minnesota. He took up the matter of war and peace in his only non-political speech of the trip, at a Swedish Day festival in Minneapolis.

Facing thousands of cheering Minnesotans who stood under shade trees in Minnehaha Park, Johnson said:

"Today, as always, if a nation is to keep its freedom it must be prepared to risk war. When necessary, we will take that risk. But as long as I am president, I will spare neither my office nor myself in the quest for peace."

In South Viet Nam, Johnson said, "We are engaged in a brutal and bitter struggle for the freedom of a friend" and "we will stand firm to help maintain freedom and give them counsel and advice and help and aid."

"This was a change from his prepared text, which read, "There too, we will use the force necessary to help them maintain their own freedom."

Johnson had this to say about compromising East-West differences in the interest of peace:

"We must remember that differences with others do not always flow from a desire for domination. They can come

from honest clash of beliefs or goals. In such cases our strength does not entitle us to impose our interest. Rather, our desire for peace compels us to seek just compromise."

In discussing "the several paths we take to peace," Johnson made some pointed statements about the civil rights problem at home in talking about "the ability to adjust disputes without the use of force."

Johnson said that in the pursuit of justice, the nation can find guidance "here in our own country's historic pledge to the rule of law."

### Poles Asked To Aid Peace By Kennedy

WARSAW, Poland (AP)—Encouraged by wildly cheering Polish crowds, Robert F. Kennedy called on Communist Poland Sunday night to help promote the new thaw in the cold war.

The U.S. attorney general told Foreign Minister Adam Rapacki that Poland has a unique opportunity to supply a bridge of understanding between the United States and the Soviet Union.

U.S. sources said Kennedy told Rapacki that Poland could play a key role in improving relations because of its membership in the Soviet bloc and the strong ties between the Polish and American peoples.

They met for dinner at Jablonna Palace, a former royal hunting lodge 10 miles from Warsaw. They also were believed to have discussed the German territories seized by Poland after World War II. The Western allies have not officially recognized these as permanent Polish territory.

The meeting followed a triumphant tour of Warsaw by the visiting American despite an official news blackout on his arrival.

### Youths Say Rights Case Boosts Zeal

MERIDIAN, Miss. (AP)—"Certainly, I'm afraid, everyone is afraid," said Marilyn Leonard, "but the importance of the job makes them overcome personal fear."

Marilyn, 19, a Negro and a Radcliffe College student from Port Huron, Mich., was one of a fresh contingent of 275 who poured into tense Mississippi over the weekend on the summer project to push Negro voter registration and education projects.

One hundred and seventy-five of the civil rights workers, specially trained at Oxford, Ohio, had arrived previously.

One of these, Andy Goodman of New York, and Michael Schwerner of Brooklyn and James Chaney, a Negro from Meridian—disappeared mysteriously a week ago after driving into Neshoba County to look at a burned-down Negro church.

### Motorists Quizzed In Southern Hunt

PHILADELPHIA, Miss. (AP)—The Mississippi Highway Patrol and FBI agents questioned motorists at a roadblock today whether they knew anything about the three missing civil rights workers.

The latest report from the roadblock on Highway 21 about 21 miles northeast of Philadelphia, said no useful information had been obtained.

The roadblock was set up near where the civil rights workers burned-out station wagon was found last Tuesday. Each driver was asked whether he knew anything about the disappearance, or whether he knew anyone who did.

Officers explained that the state highway is only lightly traveled and that some of the drivers who passed that area today might have passed there last Monday.

Authorities also probed a report that two young white men were seen standing beside a station wagon similar to the one used by the three civil rights workers shortly before they vanished eight days ago.

The widespread search for clues in the baffling disappearance of Michael Schwerner, 24; Andy Goodman, 20, both of New York; and James Chaney, 22, a Meridian Negro, continued in this red clay hill section of east-central Mississippi.

One hundred sailors from the Navy's airfield at Meridian rejoined the highway patrol and FBI to search west of this town of 5,000 as other officers dragged small lakes and streams.

Chief investigator Gwin Cole of the highway patrol said one witness had reported seeing a station wagon near a side road in the Bogue Chitto swamp near the spot where the burned vehicle used by the missing trio was found last Tuesday.

The witness, Cole said, spotted the station wagon and two men, whom he described as "of similar appearance" to Goodman and Schwerner, last Monday before noon.

At least six persons have told authorities they had passed the site around 11 a.m. last Monday and saw nothing.

## Russia Diary Shows Oswald Disillusioned

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—Lee Harvey Oswald, the cold war double turncoat accused of assassinating President John F. Kennedy, grew so bitter about the Soviet Union he once embraced that he called its leaders "sick."

This and other comments on his two and a half years in the Soviet Union were reported during the weekend by the Dallas Morning News in copyright stories based on Oswald's diary and other writings.

He was so disillusioned that when arrested Nov. 2 last year he would only call himself a "Marxist"—in effect retaining Communist theory but rejecting the form practiced in the Soviet Union.

Oswald, 24, was shot to death Nov. 24 by Jack Ruby, Dallas night club operator, as the accused man was being trans-

ferred to the county jail in Dallas. Ruby, now 34, is under a sentence of death assessed him in March for the slaying of Oswald.

Publication of Oswald's writing brought a demand for an investigation by William A. McKenzie, lawyer for the widow, Marina Oswald.

In a formal news statement, the lawyer said Mrs. Oswald feels that the material should not be made public until the Warren Commission, investigating the assassination, issues its report.

McKenzie said he telephoned J. Lee Rankin, chief counsel for the commission, who assured them that the commission did not release the material.

A new effort to establish a biracial committee of two whites and two Negroes to seek peace was reported nearing success.

Community leaders predicted that any group would have a difficult time because the middle ground has all but disappeared in the furious, month-long push for integration by Negroes and the equally determined resistance by whites.

There has been almost no communication between the two races for more than a week, following collapse of the first effort to find a settlement.

In the first fruitless attempt, a St. Johns County grand jury called for a 30-day truce in public demonstrations after which a biracial committee would have been established. The Ne-

### Last UN Troops Leave Tomorrow Grenades Mar Vote In Troubled Congo

BACKGROUND: In July, 1960 the United Nations rushed the first of more than 20,000 troops to the Congo after an army mutiny brought Belgian troops back to the newly independent African nation.

Tuesday on the fourth anniversary of the Congo's independence, the last U.N. troops leave. Chaos and dissolution still threaten the big nation, but its army for the Congo nearly bankrupted the world organization and it has had enough.

One of its chief achievements was ending the secession of Katanga Province, whose copper and cobalt mines are the Congolese government's chief source of revenue. Last week the leader of Katanga's secession, Moise Tshombe, returned to the Congo and many speculated he soon would head the central government.

### Cigarette Sales Below '63 Figure

WASHINGTON (AP)—Americans cut down on their smoking by about 16 billion cigarettes since a government report linked health hazards to smoking, the Agriculture Department reported today.

The cutback was 6.5 per cent below the first six months of last year.

The department said more cigarettes are now being smoked in the United States than in the period just after the report was released last Jan. 11, but probably not as many as before the report.

# Camp and Bathhouse Dedicated

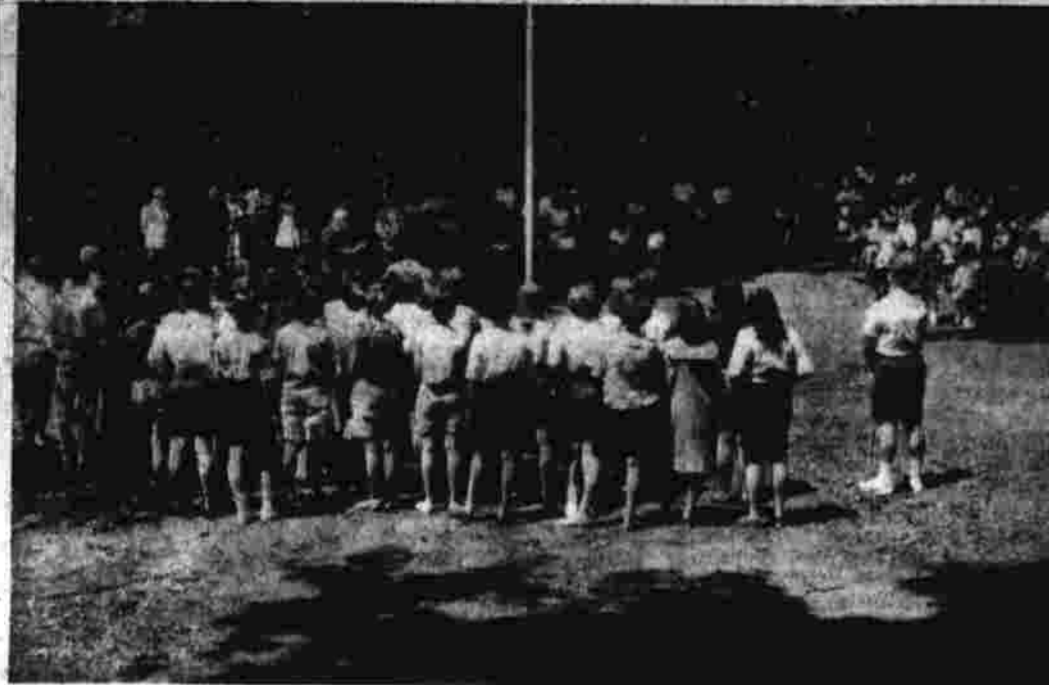

# LBJ Links Peace, War Readiness

Speaking as much about civil rights as the quest for international peace, Johnson said, "As a president of the United States, and as an individual citizen, I stand totally committed to the integrity of justice and the enforcement of the law."

Johnson said the United States is pledged to abide by the law and accept its obligations to submit to courts and be satisfied by court decisions. "I respect, uphold and obey the law of the land,"

Johnson said, "If anyone takes a grievance or dispute into his own hands, I speak specifically of racial unrest, Johnson said, 'the safety and freedom of all is imperiled.'

"Today, the key to peace in our own land is obedience to the great moral command that no man should deny to another the liberties the Constitution creates, as the law defines those liberties."

In much the same fashion, the President said, "We seek a world community in which answers can win acceptance without the use of force."

In this connection, he said, "We place much hope in the United Nations."

Johnson flew to Minneapolis Saturday afternoon from Detroit and that evening addressed a Democratic fund-raising dinner. He took that occasion to point up the racial difficulties that, he said, will not be solved by tinkering with enactment of the new civil rights law.
