**Dirksen's Choice**

The man everybody has been watching, the frequent chamelon who in the civil rights battle in the Senate cast the role of unexpected hero, has now become the next big phase of his career, a piece of consistency.

The man who was the bitter, loosing and leader of the Republican party's conservative wing in the 1962 Republican National Convention has decided to lead the same wing of the party in the 1964 convention.

This time he should be on the winning side in the convention, that is.

He breathed his last ditch defiance to the party's liberals and moderates in 1962.

Having lost to them then, he was in no mood to go over to them now and create another chance of a convention victory for them in 1964.

This consistent phase in the career of the famous chamelon is not without its compensations to the real fullness and versatility of his character and nature.

As the man who played the Republican party to its last ditch role in the victory of the civil rights bill in the Senate, Dirksen obviously finds it highly entertaining that he should now make the presumably decisive play which gives his party's nomination to the most conspicuous Republican vote against the civil rights bill.

In all this, Senator Dirksen is within his rights as a citizen and a Republican.

He has a right to be the kind of Republican his own conscience suggests.

He has a right to be for Goldwater or President.

He is under no obligation to anybody to do otherwise.

Some residents of this free country have some occasional difficulty in realizing that it is indeed a free country and is supposed to be so.

They have this difficulty especially in the field of public issues or public personalities which seems to them utterly and completely distasteful and shameful.

They have difficulty realizing just how completely free we are supposed to be when they can visualize such a potential nightmare as that of Goldwater and Dirksen running for President and Vice President together.

They think such things are impossible, or ought to be.

But, they're not Goldwater and Dirksen are just as much right to seek advancement for their beliefs, or their lack of beliefs, or for their ambitions, as anybody else.

It is for the ordinary people of this country, if the ordinary members of the Republican party, don't care enough about such things to activate themselves and insist on some control and choice and representation for their own points of view, then the Goldwaters and the Dirksens are not only going to have and get their chance, but they are going to deserve them.

**Runk At The Faucet**

It is getting easier and easier to understand the wonderful world in which we live. This is so because, more and more, responsible public officials are developing the habit and the talent for explaining privately to newspaper and radio and television correspondents what they mean in the public words they say.

Thus, two weeks ago, Secretary of State Runk had himself a private audience with such correspondents, at which time he apparently gave them the confidential information that the United States had decided to enter into a tough military tactic strategy in Southeast Asia.

After this briefing, the Washington correspondents knew what to expect, from Runk's own words of warning to the Communists that they had better quiet down or else. They also knew what sentences to emphasize in speeches the President might be delivering. If the President delivered a speech in which he spoke of both peace and war, the thing to do was play down his thoughts about peace and emphasize his alarm about war.

It was a simple matter, therefore, to expect that Runk would be asked to explain his remarks in detail.

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**Republican With Dogs**

The return of the Henry Cabot Lodge seems to have stepped up the pace of public and political life in this country measurably.

The reigning ambassador has continued his search for a nominee, or perhaps, to be more precise, search for a way away from the nominee it thinks it has.

His return to this country, minus his official partnership in our policy in South Vietnam, has stimulated a more open discussion of the risks and opportunities which confront us.

In these two instances, the return of the Lodge seems to symbolize the possibilities of Republican sanity and decency and moderation. Perhaps we don't have to run an extremist for President. Perhaps we don't have to begin dropping atomic bombs just to hold our own in Southeast Asia.

But for the best demonstration of all of what it can mean to be a humane, moderate, twentieth century Republican we will take the charming spectacle of Mrs. Lodge getting off the plane at Washington carrying the two Lodge puppies, Buster Brown and Hovey Boy, two young Tibetan terriers who were yipping contently as they faced the photographers.

Unlike some dogs we have seen, the two Lodge puppies were yipping out of sheer comfort and joy, each of them being held efficiently and comfortably in the curve of one of Mrs. Lodge's arms.
