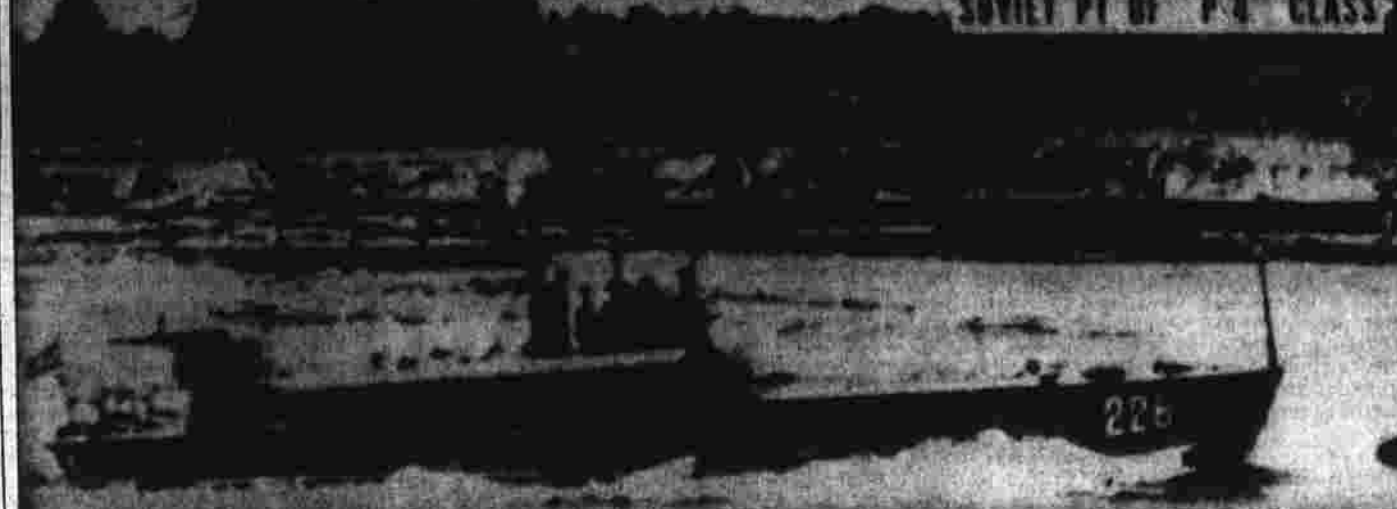

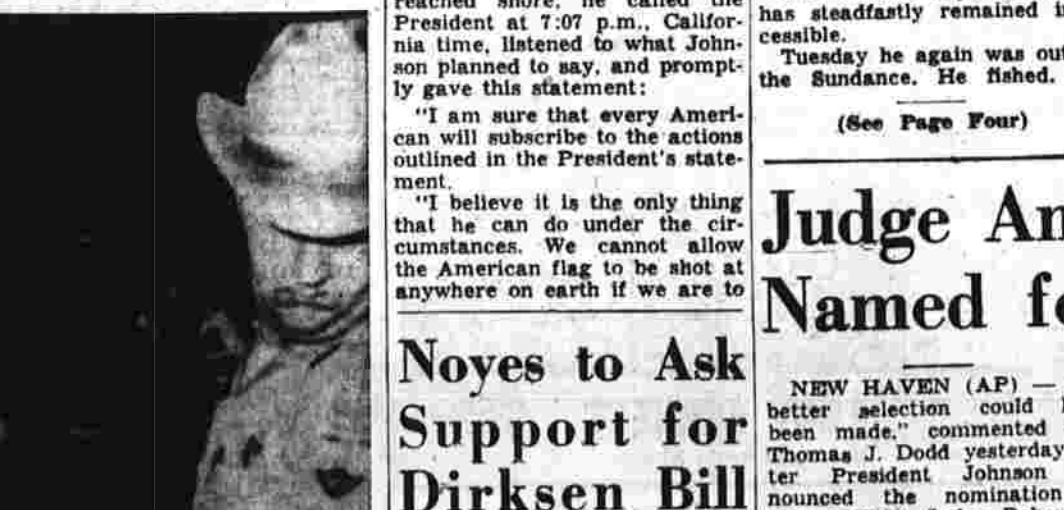

Report Scores Police Activity In Waterbury

WATERBURY (AP)—A report alleging widespread gambling and "highroller" police enforcement will be presented to the city police board at a meeting today.

There has been no indication of what action, any, the board will take on the 17-page document released Monday by a board committee.

However, both Mayor Joseph McNellis and police superintendent Joseph Gullfiole are expected to comment for the first time since the report's release.

McNellis said yesterday it would be improper for him to say anything until the report had been submitted to the board. Gullfiole declined comment until he had a chance to study the document.

The report alleged that several million dollars are grossed in gambling operations in the city. It called for the abolition of a four-man vice squad and claims the department is handicapped by poor leadership and low morale.

Former Mayor Edward D. Dunham, who appointed Gullfiole to the \$11,180 a year job in 1960, said last night that he believed police was the best of the charges.

"The attacks are more on me than Mr. Gullfiole," the former mayor said, defending Gullfiole's counts as "an active and independent, not a desk aspirin."

Bergin said he doubted that the charges could be substantiated.

"No city or town can claim to be free and clear of gambling," Bergin said, "but Waterbury compares favorably with other large communities."

"It's a pretty clean town," he said.

Bergin lost the Democratic mayoral nomination to McNellis last year in a bitterly contested primary. The two have been at odds politically ever since.

Directors May Scrap Plans To Enclose Bigelow Brook

A plan to enclose Bigelow Brook in a concrete wall to prevent flooding in Lenox St. urged last month by Republican director Francis DeLaPera may be scrapped.

In answer to a question from Engineer Walter Foss told the board of directors last night that the proposed brook all-weather would relocate a flooding problem that occurs after every heavy rain.

At present, the brook is enclosed from East St. to Lenox St., runs above ground from Lenox to Benton St., and is underground from Benton St. to the west side of the high school at Memorial Field.

The town recently installed protective grates at Benton St. and at the west side of the high school field to prevent children from entering the brook.

The grate on the upstream and catches debris after storms, however, and causes flooding in the stream bed. DeLaPera proposed after a recent rainstorm that the brook be enclosed from Lenox to Benton St. to eliminate the flooding hazard.

Last night, this would simply mean the relocation of the brook. Because the town needs to keep the west entrance to the culvert closed to prevent children from entering, it also cover the eastern (Fuss) and to prevent debris from filling the pipe.

Fuss proposed instead, at DeLaPera's suggestion, that the town undertake a thorough clean up of the brook bed, then institute monthly checks in that stream to make sure it does not accumulate.

This would both save the town the estimated \$60,000 cost for the project and would provide just as much protection against stream flooding, he said.

Fuss also said that part of the proposed cleanup has already been done.

General Manager Richard Martin reminded the directors that the cost saving they would effect by not enclosing the brook would be heated by the condensers of the \$10 million plant in . . . insupportable from the economic cost of the . . .

Marshall said that the national Goldwater committee has not yet decided on the form of activity to be taken by citizens in the GOP presidential candidate's behalf.

HARTFORD (AP) Civic and conservation groups in the lower Connecticut Valley have formed an "alliance" Fight Connecticut Yanks Atomic Power Company plans to dump heated water into the Connecticut River at Haddam Neck.

August Plays It Cool... In recent summaries—five out of the last six, we would say—the month of August has made its bow with a first week stretch of abnormally cool temperatures.

There are some other Americans who, if we are to judge by the way they have talked in the past, are delighted that the expansion of the war in Southeast Asia has begun to engulf the possibility that it should still be "limited" in any way, and convinced that only now have they begun to see the light.

Perhaps what Senator Goldwater said in his response to President Johnson's appeal for support provides one of the keys to what divides us.

"We cannot," said Goldwater, "allow the American flag to be shot at again, there on earth if we are to retain our respect and prestige."

It is between these two concepts, each present and fully applicable, that we are trapped in our present position in Southeast Asia.

The question still lingers, whether we and North Vietnam can halt the almost daily escalation of war which has been going on, with lunges of various kind into North Vietnam finally beginning to answer North Vietnamese lunges South, with North Vietnam lunging out on the high seas and with the United States beginning to bludge the North.
