(Continued from Page One) The annual improvement pact, currently 2 1/2 per cent of the base wage rate of six cents an hour, whichever is greater, goes to 4 1/2 per cent for seven years, in September of 1968. An additional two cents an hour will be added to the wage rate in the same month.

The UAW said it will receive an increase of about one per cent in take-home pay next month when the company starts paying the full cost of group life and disability insurance. Hereafter, workers have shared the cost.

The bureau of Labor Statistics figures the current average hourly wage in the automotive industry as a whole is \$3.01. Starting next November, Ford will pay the full cost of hospital-medical insurance for retired workers and their eligible dependents as it now is doing for active workers.

The Christmas bonus will come from the supplemental unemployment benefits of the company. Five cents per hour per worker and their dependents will be paid for the remainder of the year.




